

and Meenan, who were at a distance from the house, observed Sheedy running without either hat, coat, or shoe, pursued him across the country, and he was captured by Mannion, who acted manfully on this arrest. Sheedy is a smart active fellow, and by scaling the wall made his escape from Charleville bridewell.

Daniel Keane, a corn broker, who resided in a lane off Franci-street, was found drowned in the canal on Sunday morning by two boatmen. It appears that he was seen walking along the banks of the river the evening previous, apparently under the influence of liquor. Dr. Enright, coroner, held an inquest on the body on Tuesday, when a verdict was returned that deceased was drowned by falling into the canal while in a state of intoxication. This unfortunate man walked out on Christmas day with £3 12s. in his pocket, and when taken out of the water there was but 12s. 3d. remaining, for his wife and daughter.

A poor man named Michael Long, who had endured great privations, died suddenly in the garret of a house in Mary-street, on Monday evening. He sat up in bed to partake of a little bread, and while doing so expired. The verdict of the coroner's inquest was that he died from the effects of general debility and exhaustion.

At the County Petty Sessions on Friday, before the Mayor and Henry Watson, informations were ordered against John Kilmartin and Kennedy Hayes, for taking a gun from John Connors, on the public road; against John Boland, for tearing down, same morning, one of the Lord Lieutenant's posted Proclamations relative to the crime and outrage prevention act; against Honora Grady and Catherine Dwyer, for stealing geese; Mary Griffin, workhouse pauper, maliciously injuring wearing apparel of the union, to be imprisoned one month. Seventeen persons summoned for nuisance, by creating dung pits near Newcastle racecourse, were fined 2s. 6d. each or a week's imprisonment.
