Already has the conviction of Frewen, sentenced to transportation for life, for sheltering the murderer Ryan (Puck), at the Special Commission in Limerick, been attended with the most salutary results; and we are happy to state that those results have originated within a few miles of our town. Our readers will recollect an account of the capture of two brothers named Cody, charged with the murder of a man named Madden near Glenbower, and the difficulty with which their capture was effected. Since that a third brother, charged with the same offence, has been "on his keeping," and, of course, must have received shelter from the neighbours. However, when the conviction of Frewen was noised abroad, it caused a general panic amongst the shelterers, and all determined to avoid the risk of a similar sentence. The result has been—that every door has been closed in the face of the third Cody, and on Wednesday, he came into town and surrendered himself!—*Clonmel Constitution.*

POLICE-OFFICE, MONDAY—Patrick Fitzgerald, begging in the street, was discharged on promise of leaving the city; Patrick Hayes was fined 2s. 6d. for drunkenness; Eliza M'Fee, charged with stealing a pair of boots from a Grecian sailor, who did not appear to prosecute was discharged. A number of country vagrants found begging were discharged on a promise of leaving town. Informations were ordered against Arthur Gloster for robbery of £2 from Michael Hastings; William Murphy, for begging, was committed for one month; Judy Prendergast, same offence, 14 days imprisonment; Patrick Kelly, for breaking Mr. Wallace's window, in William-street, and taking four loaves of bread, was remanded; Anne Joynt, stealing books from the Chamber of Commerce, remanded; Anne Dalton, a lady of the pave, was sentenced to be imprisoned 48 hours for drunkenness. Informations were ordered against Johanna Hurley, for stealing a blanket from the fever hospital; Peter Jameison, the mate, and Thomas Sheehy, a seaman, on board the barque, *Ninian*, summoned Mr. David Bannatyne for £11 8s. wages.—The case was postponed.

Michael Tuohy was burnt to death, near Hospital, on Tuesday night, by the ignition of his cabin.
