Five pair of iron gates the property of Reuben Harvey, Esq., were wantonly torn down at Plassy, on Wednesday night, by some wretches who sold a portion of the iron in the Irishtown.

On Tuesday, a man named Francis Harty died of fever, within a mile of Murroe, and before life was extinct his brother went with a party of ruffians to his house, pillaged it of every thing they could lay their hands on, and then drove all his cattle off the land, not leaving his unfortunate widow as much as would bury him. To finish the barbarous act, they visited the dwelling again, on Sunday morning, with a still more formidable force, broke into the house, took the corpse of the dead man from the bed and threw it out on a dunghill, and beat the unfortunate widow and her friends! In order to make sure of the possession, they carried the corpse outside the townland. Constable Kelly, of the Murroe station, and his party, after long and fatiguing searches, succeeded in recovering and restoring the stock to the widow of the deceased, and arrested eight of the ringleaders, who are committed to gaol by Thomas P. Evans, Esq. The widow has been since reinstated in possession of her house.

On Thursday night while Constable Thomas Lalor and party, of Birdhill station, were on patrol in the neighbourhood of Cragg, he observed a house on fire at Cregough. The party proceeded to the scene of conflagration, and with persevering exertions, and at the risk of falling into the burning mass beneath, they ascended the roof and succeeded in extinguishing the flames, and saved several articles from destruction. Much praise is due to Constable Lalor and party on this occasion. It was the second time within the month that Constable Lalor and Sub-Constable Nash signalized themselves at extinguishing fires, the work of incendiaries. Constable Lalor received a severe injury by a large stone falling from the wall of the house on his back.

An atrocious notice was served on a farmer Edward Mullampy, of Knockadiggeen, on Sunday, for having prosecuted to conviction persons at the Special Commission for Tipperary.
