The magistrates assembled at Ballynonty on Friday. Thirteen persons from Killenaule, including the principal shopkeepers, were summoned to give evidence on the part of the Queen in reference to the late disturbances at Killenaule, the erection of barricades, and obstructing her Majesty's troops on their march thro' that town on the 28th July. Informations were sworn against John Preston, Edmond Maher, John Simmons, and Jeremiah Kealy, for appearing in arms at the common of Boulagh, when Smith O'Brien was there.

Saturday night last a barbarous murder was committed on the person of Mr. Leahy, an Irish school instructor, while returning from Enniskean fair, held on that day—he was struck on the head with a large stone, and killed on the spot. Nine persons have been arrested on suspicion.
