

DEATHS.

With deep regret we announce the decease of the Rev. Wm. J. Williamson, A.M. Vicar of Dromcliffe, Ennis, which melancholy event took place on the 25th ult. at his father's residence, near Derry. We feel assured that this regret will be participated in by all who had the privileges of the Rev. gentleman's acquaintance; for it is not too much to say that few men ever possessed more largely than he did those qualities which secure our respect and love. Gifted with great natural powers; of a mind highly cultivated, and stored with varied knowledge, he was yet gentle and unassuming in his deportment. An eloquent preacher—he delivered the truths of the Gospel with such clearness, simplicity, and earnestness, as to arrest the attention, and impress the hearts of all who heard him. As a companion he was at once delightful and instructive, so rich were his conversational powers, so happy his mode of imparting his ideas. Although uncompromising in the maintenance of what he believed to be right, and firm in carrying out his principles, yet such were the liberality of his disposition, and the gentleness of his manners, that he never failed to win the regard even of those the most opposed to him in religion and politics. By the Rev. gentleman's decease the Vicarage of the parish of Dromcliffe is again at the disposal of the Bishop of Killaloe.
