An investigation in Dublin of a private nature has been proceeding for some days in the office of the Board of Public Works, into charges affecting one of the officers, filling one of the most confidential situations under the commissioners. This gentleman was ordinarily appealed to as to the character, ability and diligence of the clerks and others employes, particularly in regard to the recent large reduction in the establishment consequent upon the cessation of the relief works. The charge against this person is that he was in the habit of accepting sums of money from the young men engaged under the board, and his recommendations were measured, not by the fitness of the parties, but by the amount of those gratuities. The discovery of these practices which is always the case where they exist, was owing to the disappointed expectations of one of the parties who, having paid his money, subsequently lost his place.

There were 62 debtors discharged from Ennis gaol under the new act.

At Kilrush Quarter Sessions, Thomas Coghlan, horse stealer, was sentenced to transportation for 10 years; Barthlemew Kennedy, Kilkee, larceny, John Wright, sheep stealing, Bridget Brew, and Ellen M'Tigue, larceny, transportation for 7 years each.

At Ennis Quarter Sessions, Peter Troy, and Francis Carne, for cow stealing, Michael Falvey and Mary Burke, larceny, were sentenced to 7 years transportation.

At Ballinasloe quarter sessions, on Monday, there were 42 civil bills, 18 ejectments, and 60 crown cases.

At Limerick quarter sessions, Sir Capel Molyneux brought 29 ejectment processes, for the recovery of his land from insolvent tenants, and obtained decrees in all. Lord Mornington obtained eight decrees upon ejectment processes.

Mr. Lloyd, Recorder of Derry, is also elected by the Corporation as coroner for the borough. The Corporation are about to appoint a town surveyor.

Anne Molony was tried and acquitted at Ballinasloe sessions for stealing a breastpin and ribbon from Capt. Sullivan, Scots' Greys.
