

## Townland and Parish Boundaries in County Limerick

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The purpose of the following paper is to report a phenomenon noted by this writer when compiling a list of the townlands of County Limerick which can be viewed on the Limerick Museum Historical Resources section of the Limerick City and County Council website ([www.limerick.ie](http://www.limerick.ie)). A total of 120 townland names were noted as straddling parish and/or barony boundaries.

Within County Limerick there are 1,911 entries in the Index of Townlands<sup>1</sup> and it is possible to identify 120 townland names which straddle parish and/or barony boundaries. Some of these townlands carry a single name, while others have qualifiers which are usually paired such as north/south, beg/more, or upper/lower. Table 1 lists the townlands in question not only by parish and barony, but also by three other divisions which have medieval or early modern origins, i.e. rural deanery, diocese and cantred. In the table where a pair of townlands shares a boundary with another pair then the adjoining pair is identified. For completeness the table also shows the Ordnance Survey sheet numbers for the townlands and the earliest dated reference to them.<sup>2</sup>

Of the five boundary types it is the parish boundary which is most significant, as a product of the Anglo-Norman reorganisation of the church in the early 13th century which was mapped by the Ordnance Survey. Although some medieval parishes disappeared and were integrated into others, e.g. Rathnasaer into Nantinan and Clounanna into Croom, they appear to have been incorporated in their entirety rather than being split between parishes. The boundaries are thus quite strong. The other ecclesiastical boundaries, deanery and diocesan, respect those of the parish, i.e. no parish is in two deaneries or two dioceses. Of the two the deanery is probably of an age or slightly younger than the parish, but the diocesan boundaries are significantly older having been laid down at the synod of Rathbrasail in 1111AD which was presided over by Bishop Gille of Limerick. It is presumed here that the boundary of the diocese relates to the boundary of the kingdom of Limerick at the time. Limerick was shired in the 13th century and re-shired at the end of the 16th century and the eastern boundary of the county lays some way east of the Limerick diocesan boundary with Emly/Killaloe, a rough line from the mouth of the Mulcair River to the Cork border south of Ballylanders. The cantred, a unit of sub-infeudation used by the Anglo Normans at the end of the 12th century, probably reflects the earlier *tuath* territorial divisions. The problem with cantreds is defining their exact number and extent, Empey lists fifteen but MacCotter has only twelve. MacCotter's mapping was used to compile the table but given that there is a degree of uncertainty too much significance should not be read into the fact that, at the

micro-level, townlands seem to straddle this type of boundary. It may even be the case that such townlands could be used to tweak the cantred map. Baronies are a product of the later 16th or early 17th century and their boundaries sometimes follow earlier ones but often run across parishes and they completely ignore the diocesan ones. As such they probably reflect the changes in landholding pattern that had occurred in the course of the medieval period. For instance the division of Athneasy parish between Small County and Coshlea probably relates back to the 14th century division of the Gormanston Estate.

Before proceeding further it should be stated that in some cases it is possible to find a more modern explanation for some townlands straddling boundaries. 45, Commons may be the result of mapping, of the Ordnance Survey putting down definite lines where none existed before. 106, Reboge straddles a barony boundary simply as a result of mid-nineteenth-century boundary changes. 108, Rivers lies in three parishes, Killeenagarriff, Kilmurry and Stradbally as well as straddling the Killaloe/Limerick diocesan border. The Kilmurry section is separated from the others by the Mulcair River and it is not possible to show any antiquity to the placename on the Limerick side of the river. It has been suggested elsewhere by this writer that it may reflect the local landowner pointing out his land to OS mappers.<sup>3</sup>

The fact that a townland name is to be found conjoining either side of a boundary suggests that a single unit has been split into two (or more) by the imposition of that boundary and it therefore follows from that that we are getting a glimpse of an earlier disposition of the land. The use of modifiers such as beg/more to distinguish the parts is not however restricted to townlands split by a parish boundary. There are multiple examples of north/south, upper/lower type townlands wholly within a parish, but these do not concern us here. A lot of these are believed by this writer to be of 18th and 19th century origin, created by mapping of estate tenancies. It is only when the division coincides with a parish boundary that we can begin to suggest with some certainty that the division occurred before the mid-thirteenth century.

When the number of occurrences, 120, is doubled for either side of the border, and the modifier names added in to that, there is a total of 277 entries in Table 1. This represents 14.5% of the total of 1,911 townlands in the county. It is therefore not surprising that there are several instances where two such townlands are adjacent to one another, but what is more surprising is that it is possible to identify seven clusters, or rather chains, of adjoining townlands. It is suggested that these chains represent a line of subdivision of larger land units which predate the medieval parish. These are:

- 1) Ballinvira (5) Graigue (73) and Knockdromin (84) lie in the parishes of Cappagh, Croagh and Clonshire. Cartographically the parishes of Cappagh and Clonshire are intertwined and seem to be cut out of the larger Croagh, which lies both to the north and south.
- 2) Sroolane (117), Parkmore (101), Shanagolden (115), Monavaha (93), Clashganniff (39) and Dunmoylan (56). The first four are split between Robertstown and Shanagolden parishes, Clashganniff between Shanagolden and Kilmoylan, and Dunmoylan between Kilmoylan and Dunmoylan parishes. Given the way Robertstown and Shanagolden are intertwined with each other it is probable that they once formed part

of a single unit. With this in mind Ballynacragga (22) near but not adjoining Sroolane can possibly be thrown into this pot.

- 3) Monaster (92), Ballymacscraheen (20), Tullovin (120), and Ballymacrory (18) form a less definite block as it is a barony boundary which divides the first two which are in Monasternenagh parish. The latter pair are in Croom and Anhid parishes. As a unit Anhid is totally within Croom parish and so seems to have been carved out of it.
- 4) Grange (74), Rockstown (110), Friarstown (59) and Ballybricken (8) are divided between Fedamore, Rochestown, Caherelly, Inch St. Lawrence, Monaster and Tullabracky parishes.
- 5) Gardenhill (62), Drominboy (54), Knockbrack (83), Ballynagowan (25), Mountshannon (96), Rivers (108) and Garraunykee are all split between Killeenagarriff and Stradbally parishes. Part of Rivers lies in Kilmurry but this has already been explained above. The relationship between the townlands is complicated by detached portions of turbary.
- 6) Bulgaden (35), Magherareagh (89), Gormanstown (68) and Gibbonstown (64) are in Kilbreedy Major, Uregare and Athneasy parishes. According to the townland index part of Gormanstown lies in Knockainy parish, but this can be discounted because the name seems to be a late application of the name to this area. In the Down Survey this area seems to be the Balligalah held by the Edmund Fox of Bulgaden who also held Gormanstown. Perhaps it is another case, as with Rivers, of a landlord extending the name when the area was mapped by the Ordnance Survey. Kilbreedy Major, Uregare and Athneasy form a comfortable block.
- 7) Mountsion (96), Corelish (46), Deerpark (51), Killeenavera (81), Boherroe (34) and Ballynagally (23). The first four are split between Dromkeen and Grean; the latter two between Aglishcormick and Grean. The boundary in Corelish is a barony boundary and so can possibly be left out. Dromkeen is partially surrounded by Grean and so appears to be cut out of it. Another parish, Ballynaclogh, parish has two outliers totally surrounded by Grean and the major part is embraced on the north, west, south and part of the east so it too looks like it might have been cut out of a larger unit. With the establishment of the parishes, Dromkeen and Aglishcormick fell to Owey deanery while Grean fell to Grean, but all lie within Grene cantred.

There are five instances where a townland is divided between dioceses, 6 Ballinvreena, 59 Friarstown, 68 Gormanstown, 108 Rivers and 110 Rockstown. Of these Gormanstown and Rivers can be dismissed as noted above. Both of these are divided between three parishes and it is the smallest portion that lies over the diocesan border and it can be demonstrated that the application of the townland name to this portion is of relatively recent date. The same may be true of Friarstown, which leaves Ballinvreena and Rockstown, as possible pre-diocesan units.

In conclusion then, the phenomenon of townlands divided by a parish border suggests the townlands were once part of a larger unit. It would be interesting to know if this phenomenon is restricted to County Limerick or occurs in other counties, and, if so, whether there is a difference between counties with early and late parish formation.
