CHEAPER BRITISH TELEPHONES.

The British Postmaster-General will, as from January 1st next, reduce the telephone rental of subscribers connected to the small rural exchanges to that applicable to the large exchanges—£7 per annum for business lines and £5 10s per annum for residential lines within two miles of the exchange.

COTTAGE RENT ARREARS IN CLARE.
