

days with the General Post.

From Waterford, Clonmell, Cashell, &c. arrives on Tuesdays and Fridays about Nine in the Morning, and on Saturdays with the General Post, Goes out on Tuesdays and Fridays at Eight in the Evening, and on Sunday Night with the General Post.

From Cork, Mallow, Charleville, &c. arrives on Mondays and Thursdays about Nine in the Morning,

goes out the same Days at Two o'Clock.

From Tralee, arrives on Monday Afternoon, and on Thursday with the Cork Mail. Goes out on

Monday Night, and on Thursday by Cork.

From Rathkeal, arrives on Monday Afternoon, and on Thursday in the Forenoon. Goes out on Monday Night, and on Thursday soon after it comes in.

To Sixmilebridge and Ennis, goes out on Mon-

days, Thursdays and Saturdays, as soon as the Dublin Post comes in. Arrives on Tuesdays, Fridays and Sundays about Eight at Night.





# HOSPITAL.

Abstracts from the Act of Parliament in favour of County Hospitals or Insurmaries.

"Be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid, that every Donor of any Sum not less than 20 Guineas to any of the said Infirmaries or Hospitals, Shall, from the Time of such Donation, be a member of the Body Corporate for such respective Infirmary or Hospital; and every Person who shall subscribe and pay any Sum not less than 3 Guineas for the Use of any of the Said Infirmaries or Hospitals, Shall be a Member of the Body Corporate for such respective Infirmary or Hospital, for one Year, from the 24th Day of June next following such Subscription and Payment; which Said Several Bodies Politic and Corporate shall have perpetual Succession, and he called the Governors and Governesses of the respective County infirmaries or Hospitals in this Kingdom.—And be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid, that no Patient shall be admitted into any of the said Informaries, but upon written Recommendation from one of the Governors or Governesses of the Said Infirmary or Hospital, certifying that such a Person is a proper Object of the faid Charity, except in Cases of Sudden Accidents, which may require immediate Relief, in subich Cases it shall be discretionary in the Physician or Surgeon of the said Infirmary or Hospital, to receive

bappen that more Patients shall be recommended than any of the said Infirmaries or Hospitals shall be capable of receiving, then the Physician or Surgeon shall admit them according to the Priority of their several Recommendations; and the Certificates shall be carefully preserved by the respective Physicians and Surgeons, as Vouchers that the Patients were admitted in the Manner aforesaid."


