L I M E R I C K.

LIMERICK.

LIMERICK, the third City in Ireland, situated in the heart of the most fertile part of the Kingdom, and on the finest Navigable River in Great Britain.* It contains about 70,000 Inhabitants, and is distant from Dublin, 94, and from Cork $51\frac{1}{2}$ Irish miles. The City is about three miles in circumference, and divided into 21 Parishes or parts of Parishes, and is composed of the English Town, the Irish Town, and New-Town-Pery. The first stands on the northern side of the River, being separated from the two latter by a narrow arm of the Shannon, which embraces the English Town in its entire circumference: and on the North West side of the great branch of the river, in the County of Clare, is the extensive and populous suburb of Thomond Gate.— The English Town has all the antiquated appearance of a close-built fortress of the latter part of the seventeenth century; its venerable Cathedral, narrow streets and lofty houses, are said to give it a considerable resemblance to Rouen, in Normandy; it is governed by a Mayor, Sheriffs, Recorder, Aldermen and Burgesses, a privilege which it appears to have obtained in 1198, being ten years previous to the allowance of that right to the citizens of London. It was surrounded by a wall. The ground on which the New Town is built is rather elevated; the streets are spacious, cut each other at right angles, and are occupied by elegant houses, constructed of brick; a more superb City view can hardly be presented to the eye, than the range of buildings from the New Bridge to the Crescent, a distance little short of an English mile, including Rutland-street, Patrick-street, George-street and the Tontine; and its interest will be greatly heightened, when the line of buildings is continued from the Crescent along the military road, and the square completed on the left; shops, tastefully laid out and richly furnished, line these streets, while others diverge right and left, which are chiefly occu-

pied by the residence of the gentry. The New (Pery) Square has been tastefully planted and laid out in walks; upon a rising ground in the centre, a handsome fluted column, about 60 feet high, surmounted by a colossal statue of the Right Honorable Spring Rice, (now Lord Monteagle) has been erected, and the whole enclosed with an iron railing of 1,400 feet. The houses already built may vie with Mountjoy Square, or Fitzwilliam Square in Dublin, and have an iron balcony in front of each. At the South end of the Square, and at the corner of Barrington-street, a very handsome Church is being built, with a tower and spire, after the manner of St. George's in Dublin, which is also to be the distinctive appellation of this new structure.

The Parish of St. Michael's, which comprises that part of the City called Newtown-Pery, is managed by Commissioners under a special Act of Parliament, passed in the year 1807, of whom the following Gentlemen are

Inhabitants, paying £4, late currency, per annum, have a right to vote in the election of Commissioners: the election is by ballot. There are over 800 houses paying Parish Rates, which fall due in the month of Sept. The Parish contributes £500 a year to the City Goal, House of Industry, and Fever Hospital.

The Annual gross value of the Dwelling Houses, paying Rates, say £30,000; of Stores, &c., £10,000. The former at 2s. 3d., and the latter at 3½d per Pound.

The value of the property is assessed by three of the inhabitants, who are sworn to discharge their duty fairly and impartially.

Their appears to be no doubt but that the Government and Improvements of this Parish have given entire satisfaction to the Inhabitants, and at the lowest possible charge, in every department.

The City has two weekly markets and four yearly fairs; to that held on the 4th of August a peculiar privilege is annexed, that, during 15 days no person could be arrested in the City or Liberties on any process issuing out of the Tholsel Court of Limerick. It has a considerable export trade in agricultural produce; about 80 thousand tons of provisions being shipped from it annually; here is a very large Distillery and several Breweries: there are also, three Lace, and Sewed Muslin Manufacturies, and a Weaving Factory in St. Francis's Abbey, in all of which a great number of the youth, of both sexes, are profitably employed.

The Shipping trade having considerably increased, a Patent Slip has been constructed, where Vessels of from Four to 500 Tons can be repaired; and an extensive Ship Building Establishment adjoining, of which John Norris Russell, Esq., and Sons, are the Principals, has given increased facility to the trade of the port by the construction of new ones.

Over the river there are six Bridges, one of the oldest, "Thomond Bridge," has recently given place to a handsome new one. Wellesley Bridge, erected in the year 1831, consists of five arches, and has a swivel arch at the extremity, near Brunswick-street. Government advanced a Loan of £60,000 towards the erection of this Bridge, to be repaid by tolls collected on the Bridge and from Shipping arriving at the port of Limerick: here are also Barracks for Infantry, Cavalry, and Artillery. The Cathedral, in Mary-street, was founded about the year 1180, by Donald O'Brien, King of Limerick, on the site of his own Palace. From the Communion table to the west door, measures 156 feet, and from the north to the south 114 feet. The Steeple is 120 feet high, and contains eight bells. In the Church are several handsome Monuments, particularly one erected to the memory of the late Lord Bishop, Dr. Jebb, by subscriptions from the Friends of Literature, in England, Ireland and America. It is made of white marble, and represents his Lordship sitting on a chair, enrobed, with a book in his hand; it cost over £1100.

Besides the Cathedral there are four other Churches of the establishment, St. Munchin's, St. John's, St. George's and the Asylum Chapel, in Upper Catharine-street. The Roman Catholics have eight places of worship, viz:—St. John's, St. Michael's, St. Mary's, St. Munchin's, or St. Lilia's, and St. Patrick's; the Augustinian Friary, the Dominican Chapel and the Franciscan Chapel. The Methodists, Independents and Presbyterians, have each their places of worship:—there is also a Friends' Meeting house, in Cecil-street.

The New Savings' Bank, (of which Mr. W. H. Owen is the architect, and Sir Thomas Deane the contractor,) now erecting in Catharine-street, is in the Grecian Doric style of architecture, and when finished, will be highly ornamental to the city. The Munster General Annuity Endowment Society, a Farming Society and Horticultural Society: here is also a County Club-House, in George-street, and three News Rooms;—the Commercial Buildings, the Chamber of Commerce, and the Limerick Institution: the two latter have extensive and valuable Libraries attached to them.

The Public Charities are both numerous and respectably supported, by munificent bequests and voluntary donations. There are three Loan Funds; the Linen Hall Loan, the Pery Loan, and the Jubilee Loan.

Amongst the Charitable Institutions, we have particularly to notice Barrington's Hospital, founded and erected within the last ten years by Sir Joseph Barrington, Bart., and his sons, Mathew, Daniel, Croker, and Samuel Barrington, A.D. 1829, for the relief of the poor of their native City. It was opened for the reception of patients on the 5th of November, 1831, and it is the only general Hospital in this City. It is a fine cut stone building, situated on George-quay, and presenting a very handsome front—at the top of which there is an illuminated Clock, the only one in the south of Ireland. The Barrington family having built the Hospital at an expense exceeding £4000, munificently handed it over, when finished, to their fellow Citizens, for the use of the distressed poor.

Monte de Piete, or Charitable Pawn Office, erected under the immediate auspices of Matthew Barrington, Esq.. and its construction formed on the model of the Monte de Piete of Paris.

Its objects being in common with similar establishments in France, Italy, Germany and Holland, which have existed with undeviating prosperity for several hundred years—are to relieve the temporary wants of the Poor, by advancing money to them upon Pledges at a lower rate of Interest than is charged by Pawnbrokers: thus guarding them from greater exactions, and that the profits after paying the interest of the capital employed and the expenses of the establishment, shall be devoted to the use of the very class of persons from whom these profits are derived.

The Mont de Piete commenced business on the 13th of March, 1837, under the direction of a Committee. The funds are daily increasing, and it is much to be wished that similar establishments, so highly beneficial to the poor, were general throughout the kingdom.

The gratuitous places of Education are both numerous and extensive, affording instruction to many thousand children of both sexes; in addition to those a Protestant Female Orphan House and Day School has recently been erected in Henry-street. It comprises a Female Orphan and two Day Schools, one for Boys and the other for Girls, capable of accommodating from 70 to 80 children. The House will accommodate about 25 Orphans, who will be fed, clothed, and lodged.

Amongst the Public Buildings may be mentioned the Exchange, in Mary-street, originally built in 1673, by Alderman Yorke, at a cost of £400; but having suffered considerable injury during the siege, it was rebuilt in 1702, at the expense of the Corporation, during the Mayoralty of Alderman Davis, and again remodified 1778, during the Mayoralty of Alderman T. Smyth. This last alteration was deemed necessary as it projected into the street, but the Dean and Chapter having bestowed a small part of the church-yard, to remove that inconvenience it underwent the final alteration at a cost of £1500. The Council Chamber is a spacious room, being 40 feet long, 30 feet wide, and 15 feet high.

The City Court-house, erected in the years 1703—4, at a cost of about £700, is situated in Bridge-street. The erection of a new one is now spoken of.

The City Gaol, on Merchant's-quay, was erected on the site of the old Deanery house and garden, and finished

towards the close of the last century; annexed to it was the County Gaol, but since the erection of the new County Gaol, on the Cork road, that portion occupied by the County prisoners was added to the City Gaol. It is now a spacious building.

County Gaol, Cork Road.—This Prison, built upon the Radiating plan, was finished and occupied in 1822. It consists of distinct buildings, connected with a Tower, 80 feet high, by means of metal bridges. The Tower contains the Governor's dwelling, the Chapel and Infirmary.

County Court House, adjacent to the City Gaol, on Merchant's-quay, was finished in 1810, at an expense of about £12,000, levied off the County. It contains a lofty hall, separate Courts for transacting Civil and Criminal business, convenient Jury-rooms, and offices of the Crown and Peace.

The District Lunatic Asylum, for the Counties of Limerick, Clare, Kerry, and City and Liberties of Limerick, was erected on the Cork-road at an expense of £30,000. The centre forms an octagon, from which diverge four wings, containing 128 close cells for patients, and a similar number convalescents. It is constructed of lime-stone, and extends 429 feet in front, and 314 in depth. Extensive Gardens are attached to the Establishment, and the interior arrangements are similar to those of the Richmond Lunatic Asylum, Dublin. It was originally intended to accommodate 150 patients, but being found inadequate to the claims of so large and populous a district, it received an addition capable of containing 148 more. It is under the direction of a Board of Governors, who meet on the first Monday in every month, and oftener if necessary.

The Assizes are held twice in the year. The Quarter Sessions, at which the Recorder presides, is held at the City Court House.—In the *Tholsel Court* actions and attachments are issued against property or person to an unlimited amount.—At the *Petty Sessions*, held every Friday, (in addition to the criminal cases,) money due for wages, to the amount of £6 Irish, may be recovered; and at the *Mayor's Court*, small debts, not exceeding Forty Shillings.—Fairs are held in Limerick on the 4th of July, and the 4th of August, and in Singland on the 21st of April and 11th of December. Market days, Wednesdays' and Saturdays'.

LIMERICK CHAMBER OF COMMERCE,
SITUATED IN GEORGE-STREET.

This Institution was formed in 1808, and Incorporated by Royal Charter in 1815, "for the promotion, regulation, and protection of the Trade of Limerick." It has always exercised considerable influence in Commercial matters, both local and general, and has expended considerable funds in the promotion of objects beneficial to the Trade and Agriculture of the City and District.

The Corporation consists of the President, Vice-President, and Members, (exclusively Merchants.) It is managed by a Committee of Nine Directors, elected annually, and is represented at several Public Boards by the President, who is *ex-officio*—a Bridge Commissioner—a Director of the Limerick Navigation Company—a Governor of the Barrington Hospital and City Infirmary, &c., &c.
