COUNTY OF LIMERICK DIRECTORY.

This county is bounded on the north by the estuary of the Shannon, which separates it from the county of Clare; on the east by Tipperary; on the south by Cork county; and by that of Kerry on the west. Its extent from east to west is about fifty miles, and from north to south about thirty-two; comprising 680,842 acres, including bogs, mountains and waste. Limerick can boast of a large portion of some of the finest land in Ireland. The soil is a rich, mellow, crumbling, sandy loam, and is applicable to every purpose of culture. Pasturage is more attended to than tillage: large numbers of live stock, and great quantities of agricultural produce are exported from this county; the manufactures are coarse woollens, paper, flour and meal. Limerick county is watered by several important streams, the following are the principal—The Maig, or Maigne, which receives a number of rivulets in its course to the Shannon, falls from the Galtic mountains south of Kilfannan, and from the high lands which mark the boundaries of Limerick and Cork, the two branches uniting five miles north-west of Kilmallock, join the Shannon at Carigagunell. The Deel springs from two sources in the same highlands as the preceding rivers, and falls into the Shannon at Askeaton. All the rivers of the interior are branches of the Shannon; besides those already named, there are the Daun, or Morning Star; the Mulcaine; the Fancheon, and the Feale—the last named being a boundary stream for some distance on the south-west border. Lead occurs in the limestone mountains above Deel, near Askeaton, and fine slate near Abbeyfeale, on the borders of the county. This county is in possession of communication by rail between Dublin, Cork, Waterford, Killarney, &c. The Waterford and Limerick line enters the county at Knocklong, and takes the route of Oola, Pallas, Dromkeen, Boher, Killonan, to its terminus at Limerick. The Great Southern and Western line possesses stations at Knocklong and Kilmallock. The climate of Limerick is remarkably good, and the weather less variable than in any other county in Ireland. The entire face of the country, notwithstanding its great natural fertility, presents a denuded appearance, from the paucity of woodlands and hedgerows, those great embellishments of scenery.

RATHKEALE.

A market town and parish, in the barony of Lower Connello, county of Limerick, is 120 miles S.W. from Dublin, 53 N.N.W. from Cork, and 17 S.W. by W. from Limerick; situated between the last named town and Newcastle, on the banks of the river Deel. It was formerly a corporate town, and of more importance than it now is, at least in the annals of turbulence and war, having obstinately and successfully resisted various assaults of the English army during the rebellion, which desolated this island in the reign of Elizabeth. The markets, which are well supplied, are held on Thursday and Saturday. Petty sessions held every second Thursday; Quarter sessions four times a year. Fairs January 6th, February 7th, March 10th, April 4, May 8th, June 1st and 19th, July 17th, August 25th, September 18th, October 15th, November 18th and December 13th. The population in 1861—2,751.

Limerick is an ancient and important city, the see of a bishop, and a considerable commercial port, 120 miles S.W. from Dublin, 84 N.W. from Waterford, and 64 N. from Cork. This city is delightfully situated on the eastern bank of the river Shannon, and is by some writers supposed to have been the *Regia* of Ptolemy, was called *Rosse-de-Nuilleagh* in the Annals of Multifernan; and is believed to have been the place described under the name of *Lumneach*. St. Patrick is supposed to have visited it about the middle of the fifth century; but the first authentic notices of Limerick represent it as a Danish settlement. The English took possession of it in the year 1174; and, as a proof of the early importance of the city, King Richard, in the year 1197, granted a charter to the citizens to elect a Mayor, which honor was not obtained by the Citizens of London for ten years later, nor had Dublin or Cork a Mayor, till the thirteenth century. Limerick may be classed among the best cities of Ireland, and is rapidly improving. Within the last few years, squares and crescents have been largely added to it, and several public buildings have been erected; the public buildings are, for the most part, handsome and commodious, and some elegant as well as ornamental. The city, during late years, has improved, with regard to manufactures. "Limerick Lasses," "Limerick gloves," "Limerick hooks," and "Limerick lace," have obtained world-wide celebrity. The gloves were celebrated for above a century, but a glover of the city, a short time ago, excused his want of punctuality in executing an order, by the simple reply, that he had not received them from Cork, where "Limerick Gloves" are now almost exclusively made. In addition to the extensive manufacture of lace, bacon curing, and brewing, flax scutching and spinning have, of late years, been introduced, and a market for the sale of flax is now held on the

first Wednesday in each month. To give visitors and others an idea of the extensive trade carried on in Limerick, we have only to refer them to our advertising columns where they will see the announcements of many of the first-class houses in the city. The great attraction (but not the only one) of Limerick, is its noble and majestic river, which runs a distance of 200 miles through the country, from its source to its mouth. The chief street is George street, which runs parallel with the river for nearly a mile. Large sums of money have been granted by Parliament for the construction of docks, and for improving the navigation of the Shannon, which improvements are now fast approaching completion. General Quarter Sessions are held here. The City Magistrates sit daily, and Petty Sessions are held every Thursday and Friday in each week. A fair for the sale of cattle, sheep, and pigs, is held on the first Tuesday in each month, and the Great Munster Fairs take place in April, June, and October. Population in 1866, 44,448.

COUNTY TIPPERARY DIRECTORY.

Tipperary is an inland county. Boundaries—north, Galway and King's; east, King's, Queen's, and Kilkenny; south, Waterford; west, Cork, Limerick, Clare, and Galway. Greatest length, north and south, 70 miles; greatest breadth, east and west, 40 miles; comprising an area of 1,659 square miles, or 1,061,731 acres, of which 843,887 are arable, 178,183 uncultivated, 237,779 in plantations, 2,359 in towns, and 13,523 under water. The surface rises into the mountains of Knockmeildown, the Galtees, and Slievenamon in the south, the group of which Keeperhill is the principal in the west, and into the Slievardagh hills, east. The soil of the level country is a rich calcareous loam, of extraordinary fertility, particularly in the tract called the Golden Vein, extending from Limerick to the confines of Kilkenny county, in the centre of which is Tipperary town, and in another similar tract of level ground, in the Ormond baronies. The Suir and Nore rise in the Devil's Bit mountain, near Templemore; the former, for the greater part of its course, running through the county; the Shannon forms its western boundary. The subsoil is clay-slate in the mountain districts, and limestone in the more level tracts, which form part of the great central plain of Ireland, and include some branches of the Bog of Allen. The mineral productions are coal, copper, and lead; zinc in large quantities has lately been discovered at Silvermines; also excellent fire-clay; slates of a good quality are extensively raised near Killaloe; copper at Hollyford, and lead at Shallee are found most abundantly; the lead is rich in silver. The population in 1861 was 249,106. The occupations are almost wholly agricultural. Dairies are numerous, affording an export of large quantities of butter.

The county is divided into two ridings, north and south; the north consists of six baronies, Ormond (Lower and Upper), Owey and Arra, Ikerrin, Eliogarty, and Kilnemanagh (Upper). The South Riding has also six baronies, Slievardagh, Kilnemanagh (Lower), Middlethird, Clanwilliam, and Iffa and Offa East and West, and contains 193 parishes. It is in the district of Cashel, Emly, Killaloe, and Lismore. The principal towns are Clonmel, population in 1861, 11,104; Nenagh, 6,282; Carrick-on-Suir, 4,986; Thurles, 4,788; Tipperary, 5,907; Cashel, 4,317; Roscrea, 3,543; Fethard, 2,301; Caher, 3,068; Templemore, 2,937. The county returns four members to Parliament, two for the county at large, and one for each of the boroughs of Cashel and Clonmel. It is in the Leinster Circuit. The Assizes for the North Riding are held in Nenagh, and for the South, in Clonmel. The county is within the military district of Cork. The net annual value of property in the county under the Tenement Valuation Act is £870,526.

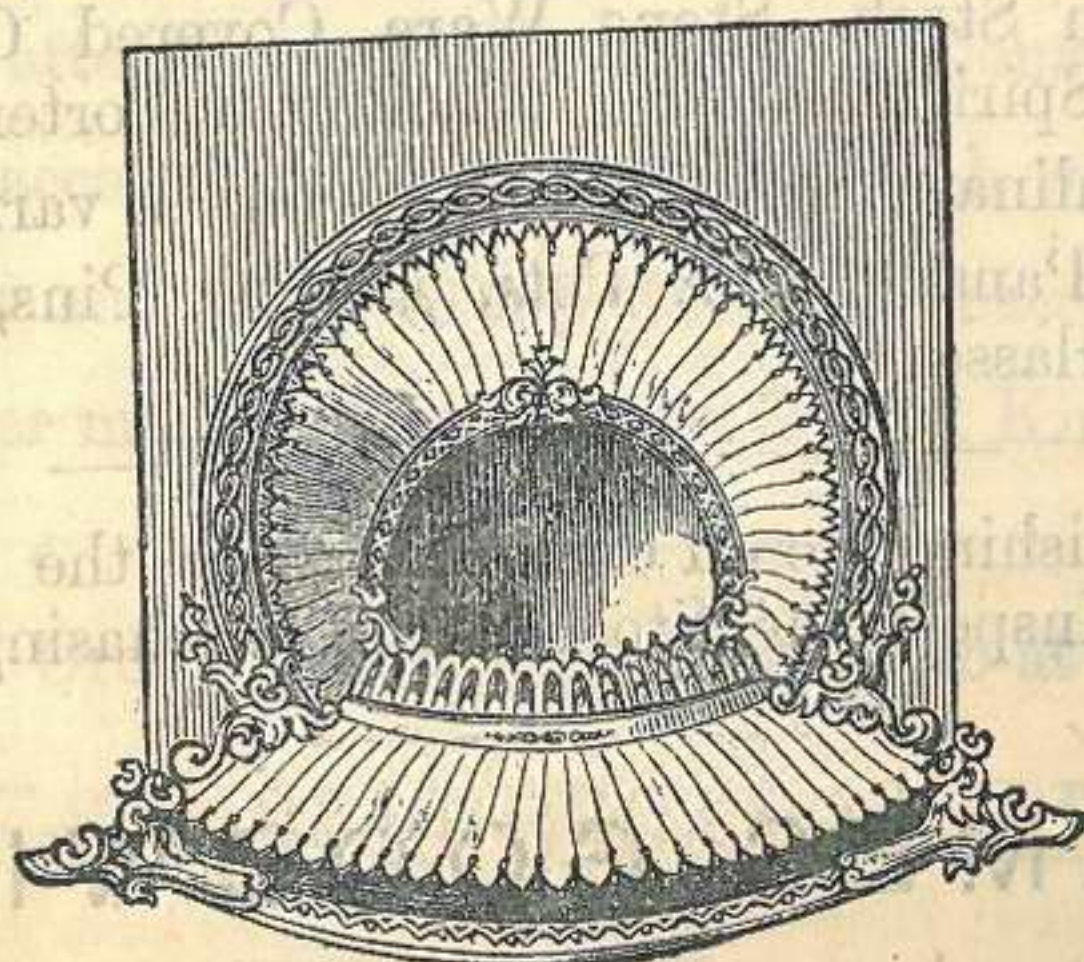
