TOWNS IN THE PROVINCE OF MUNSTER.

ADARE,

OR ADAIR, is a post town and parish, partly in the barony of Kenry, and partly in that of Upper Connello, but chiefly in the barony of Coshma, county of Limerick, 140 miles s.w. from Dublin, and 11 s.w. from Limerick; situated on the western bank of the river Mague, over which is a fine bridge of fourteen arches. This little town is strikingly beautiful, both from its position, embellished by the seat of the Earl of Dunraven, Adair Castle, and the fine ruins by which it is environed. The remains of the Castle of the Desmonds, with its ivy-decked battlements, rise from the margin of the river; while the ruins of a venerable abbey give a solemn interest to the opposite bank. On the south side of the bridge stands all that is left of the White or Augustinian abbey, founded by John, Earl of Kildare, in 1315. The marble cloisters are in good preservation—so is the lofty steeple; and this interesting remnant is beautifully adorned with ivy and the graceful foliage of trees. At the termination of the town is a small fragment of the abbey of the Trinitarians, endowed for the

redemption of Christian slaves. Sir H. Wallop was the recipient, from the hands of Elizabeth, of the lands and possessions of this foundation.

In the vicinity of Adare are the remains also of a Franciscan abbey, founded in 1402, by Thomas, Earl of Kildare, and demolished by the celebrated Earl of Inchiquin, in 1647. The river Mague is navigable for small vessels, and the Limerick and Fownes line of railway has a neat station about a quarter of a mile from the town. The father of the present Earl of Dunraven, the proprietor of the town, fitted up the nave and choir of the Franciscan abbey as the parochial church. There is a Catholic chapel, and one for Wesleyans, and National and Christian Brothers schools; also a dispensary and constabulary station. Fairs are held twice a year, but the principal amount of business is now transacted at Rathkeale. The parish of Adare contained in 1851, 3,671 inhabitants, and the town 967 of that number; whilst in 1861, the population of the parish was 2,944, of which the town numbered 816.

ASKEATON

Is a parish, petty sessions town, and police station, in the barony of Lower Connello, county of Limerick about 65 miles n.w. from Cork, and 16 w.s.w. from Limerick, pleasantly situated near the Shannon, on the influx of the river Deel. It is famous for its castle, built by one of the earls of Desmond, and for its abbey, which is considered one of the most beautiful and perfect in Ireland. The parish church and the Roman Catholic chapel are the places of worship. There are two schools, one under the National system, and a parish school. Messrs. J.N. Russell & Sons have a large flour mill here, and there is a station on the Limerick and Foynes railway. Population of the parish, in 1861, 2,736, and of the town, 1,637.

BRUFF AND NEIGHBOURHOODS,

BRUFF is a pleasant post village, in the parish of its name, barony of Coshma, county of Limerick, situated on the mail road from Cork, 15 miles S. from the former city, and 47 N. from the latter; seated on the banks of the river Dawn, in a delightful and fertile part of the country. Cahir Guillamore, the elegant seat of John Hartigan, Esq., is near the town, and in the neighbourhood are the seats, villas, and mansions of many of the gentry; while the ruins of several castles add to the picturesque character of the scenery. The town, which consists of one long street, with several lanes branching from it, was formerly the property of the Hartstonge family, and now forms part of the Limerick estates. The constabulary force have a barrack here. In a neat court-house general sessions are held in January and June, and petty sessions every alternate Wednesday. The trade of Bruff is mainly of a local and retail character; a corn mill

and a good hotel are, perhaps, the most prominent branches.

The places of worship are the parish church, an ancient structure, and a Roman Catholic chapel, a spacious and rather handsome building. A commodious school, called the "Adelaide School," was erected in 1843, the site of ground having been given by Lord Carberry, who also built the walls and offices, and it was completed by subscriptions raised through the exertions of the Rev. Godfrey Massey, the late vicar. A school, under the National Board, a dispensary, and a convent, are the other principal public institutions. Fairs, May 26th, July 23rd, October 18th, and November 23th. The parish contained in 1851, 2,106 inhabitants, and the village 1,224 of that number; and in 1861, 2,175, of which the village numbered 1,430.

CAHIR

Is a respectable market town and parish, the former in the barony of Iffa and Offa West, county of Tipperary, 110 miles s.w. from Dublin, 52 n. by e. from Cork, 43 w.n.w. of Waterford, 8½ w. of Clonmel, 10 s. of Cashel, and 15 s.e. of Tipperary, seated on the river Suir, over which the Waterford and Limerick Railway Company have erected a very handsome metal bridge, with cut stone abutments and ornaments, which add considerably to the beauty of the place. They have also erected a handsome station at the upper end of Church street. It is a beautifully situated town; the houses are tastefully and substantially built, the streets kept in the neatest order, and none of that squalid misery seen unhappily in some other places, is here to be met with. Cahir House, formerly the seat of the Earl of Glengall, contiguous to the town, is a stately mansion, and the demesne extends for more than two miles on both sides of the river. The park is finely planted and well stocked with deer, and in a secluded part of it is a picturesque retreat of modern erection, called the 'Cottage,' greatly admired for the surpassing beauty of its position. The manufacture of linens, and also of straw plats, which prevailed here to some extent, have declined, and the staple trade is now corn and flour—for the manufacture of the latter there are in the town and immediate neighbourhood some of the largest mills in the country. The government of the town is vested in the local magistrates, who meet in petty sessions every alternate Thursday, and a manorial court, in which debts are recoverable under £10, is held by the seneschal every six weeks.

The church, which was rebuilt in 1817, is a spacious stone structure, in the later English style, with an embattled tower, surmounted by a finely proportioned spire. The interior of the church, which is finished

with any church in the kingdom. The Roman Catholic chapel, rebuilt in 1839, is a large and handsome building, with a beautiful lantern tower, designed by J. B. Cave, Esq., architect of Dublin, and was commenced and finished by the Rev. Michael Tobin. The Society of Friends have a place a worship. The Cahir local relief committee, formed in 1809, established a dispensary, which was found so beneficial, that a fever hospital was afterwards opened under the same auspices. The beautiful seats in the neighbourhood, which here and there open to the view, contribute to diversify the variegated scenery of majestic mountains, whose dusky summits exhibit a striking contrast to the verdant carpet expanding at their base. On an island in the river stands Cahir Castle, erected by O'Connor, king of Thomond, and monarch of Ireland, before the year 1142. This Castle was subdued by George Carey, in the reign of Queen Elizabeth, and afterwards by Cromwell. It is highly gratifying to be enabled to state that this interesting stronghold of former days is kept up in a perfect state of repair and defence. On the ramparts are planted several pieces of cannon, and the interior is amply stored with warlike munition. Cahir confers the inferior titles of viscount and baron on the noble family of Butler, descended from the ancient house of Ormond. It was to this town that the enterprising Mr. Charles Bianconi despatched his first car from Clonmel. The sale of linen and yarn, at the market held on Friday, has entirely ceased; but a vast number of pigs, sheep, &c., are sold. At the fairs considerable business is done—they are held on the 26th of May, 20th July, 18th September, and 7th December. The parish of Cahir contained, in 1851, 7,208 inhabitants, and the town 3,694 of that number; and in 1861, the population of the town was 2,977, and of the parish, 5,830.

CASTLE CONNELL AND O'BRIEN'S BRIDGE,

ANNACOTTY, BARRINGTON'S BRIDGE, KILMURRY, LISNAGRY, NEWCASTLE AND NEIGHBOURHOODS.

CASTLE CONNELL, or STRADBALLY, is a parish and handsome village in the barony of Clanwilliam, county of Limerick, seated on the banks of the Shannon a quarter of a mile to the left of the main road between Limerick and Dublin, at a distance of 7½ miles N.E. from the former city, and 114 s.w. by w. from the latter. The ruins of the ancient castle, one of the strongholds of the O'Briens, give an interest to the place. Mount Shannon is the residence of Lady Elizabeth Fitzgibbon, formerly occupied by the late Earl of Clare, attached to which is a spacious demesne. The hermitage is the seat of Lord Massy, and the "Island" is that of Sir Richard de Burgho, Bart., lord of the soil. The remains of the friary, founded by Renald de Burgh in 1291, for the Franciscans, now form some out-offices to a cottage. Numerous visitors frequent Castle-Con nell in the summer, to enjoy the sport of fishing in the Shannon. The salmon leap and waterfall of Doonas must be visited for their beauties to be appreciated; they adjoin the seat of Lord Massy. Mr. John Madden, the post-master, has well earned his celebrity as a fishing rod and tackle maker. There is a chalybeate spring in the vicinity very salutary in many complaints. In a small court-house petty sessions are held every alternate Thursday. The constabulary force has a barrack in the village. The church was erected in 1809, and greatly enlarged in 1830; it is now a handsome cruciform edifice, with a lofty octagonal spire. The Roman Catholic chapel is a large handsome structure erected in 1866. A dispensary, and some public free schools are the principal charitable institutions. The Shannon Hotel here is the principal resort of those visiting to enjoy the fishing, amongst whom was the late George Peabody,

Esq., the philanthropist, who rented a fishing on the Shannon. Fairs, April 20th, June 1st, July 16th, and October 4th. Population in 1861, 504.

O'BRIEN'S BRIDGE is a village and parish, in the barony of Tulla, county of Clare, about two miles from Castle-Con nell, situated on the Shannon. The bridge striding the river, and from which the place takes its name, had formerly fourteen arches, no two of which were turned alike; but the Shannon commissioners have rebuilt the greater part of it, in consequence of its dilapidated state, and the arches are now reduced to twelve. There is an extensive grain mill here, capable of being worked both by steam and water power, but which at present is not in operation. The parish church, a neat building of stone was erected in 1822. There is a parochial, and two Roman Catholic schools conducted on the national system in the district, also a place of worship for Roman Catholics. Near the village is Montpelier, a strongly-impregnated sulphureous spring, held in estimation for its efficacy in curing cutaneous diseases. Fairs, July 25th, and November 7th. Population in 1861, 370.

ANNACOTTY is a small village about midway between Castle-Con nell and Limerick. Population not specially returned.

KILMURRY is a parish in the barony of Clanwilliam, county of Limerick, about 2½ miles E.S.E. from the latter city. The parish church was built in 1812 by means of a loan of £535 7s. 8½d. from the late Board of First Fruits. There is a parochial school here and one under the National Board. Population of the parish in 1861, 912.

NEWCASTLE is a townland in the parish of KILMURRY. Population in 1861, 154.

CROOM,

A SMALL post town and parish, partly in the baronies of Pubblebrien and Connello Upper, but chiefly in that of Coshma, county of Limerick, is 133 miles S.W. from Dublin, 11 s. by w. from Limerick, between eight and nine N. W. from Bruff, and five s. E. from Adare; situated on the east bank of the River Maigue (which is crossed by a bridge of six arches), and on the new road from Limerick to Charleville. This now inconsiderable place evidently must have figured in early times—Druidical remains are discerned in its vicinity; the residence of a private gentleman has the walls of an ancient castle for its boundaries, and about a mile to the west of the town stands the remnant of a round tower, called the tower of Carrigeen. Agriculture and shopkeeping are now the occupation of the inhabitants. There is a consta-

bulary police station, and petty sessions are held every Monday. The places of worship are the parish church, a small neat structure, in the early English style of architecture, with a square tower, and a Roman Catholic chapel, a spacious, plain, cruciform edifice. A very handsome school was erected in 1854, from a bequest of upwards of £1,600, by the late Rev. Lawrence Hartnett, P.P., and is the only educational establishment, under the national board. There is a dispensary in connection with the Poor-law Union. Fairs, May 3rd, June 22nd, September 1st, and December 8th. The population of the parish, according to the returns made in 1851, was 5,118, inclusive of 1,357 returned for the town, and in 1861, 4,271, of which the town numbered 1,182.

KILMALLOCK,

AN ancient, corporate, post and market town and parish, forming a liberty, in the county of Limerick, is 138 miles s.w. from Dublin, 43 n. from Cork, and 20 s. from Limerick, situated at the junction of the roads leading to Tipperary, Limerick and Charleville, and on the western bank of a small stream called the Lubach; and it is a station on the Great Southern and Western Railway, which passes very near the town. Though now in a ruinous condition, this place prominently figured in the annals of Irish warfare; and the remains of its walls, together with those of many strong castles, ruined monasteries, decayed churches, and spacious private dwellings, still remain to testify its former magnificence. It has been called, in allusion to its present appearance, the 'Irish Balbec.' In 1598 it was invested by the Irish, but the Earl of Ormonde compelled them to relinquish the siege. In the tumultuous times of 1641, the possession of this town was sharply contested by the insurgents. Kilmallock formerly enjoyed distinctive municipal privi-

leges, and with its extensive liberties constituted a separate county. Its consequence and trade are now annihilated. The parish church of Saint Peter and Saint Paul was formerly collegiate, and is an ancient and spacious structure, in variously mixed styles of architecture in a sad and dilapidated state; of the tomb-memorials some are interesting, and, in ~~years~~ past, doubtless, were elegant; one to the family of Coote is still handsome. The Roman Catholic chapel is a good sized building, erected in 1814, and subsequently enlarged. A dispensary, supported by subscription, is the principal charity. In the immediate neighbourhood of Kilmallock is Mount Coote, the delightful residence of John C. Coote, Esq., there are also several other seats in the vicinity. A charter for a market still exists, but is not made available. Fairs, February 21st, March 25th, May 20th, Tuesday in Whitsun week, July 6th, November 8th, and December 4th. The population of Kilmallock town in 1851 was 1,074, and in 1861, 1,393.

LIMERICK,

CLARINA, CORBALLY, KILDIMO, MEELICK, MUNGRET, PARTEEN, AND NEIGHBOURHOODS.

LIMERICK is a city and county of itself, the see of a bishop, and a considerable commercial port, 120 miles s.w. from Dublin, 84 n.w. from Waterford, 64 N. from Cork, the like distance N.E. from Tralee, 53 E. from Kilrush, and 75 E. from Dunmore Head, an extreme apex of Clare county, protruding into the Atlantic Ocean. This ancient city, eligibly and delightfully situated on the eastern bank of the noble Shannon (which is crossed by five bridges), is supposed to have been founded by Yuorus, in the year 155, while, by some writers, it is said to have been the *Regia* of Ptolemy. It was called *Rosse-de-Nailleagh* in the Annals of Multifernan; and is believed to have been the place described under the name of *Lumneach*, as forming the western extremity of the southern half of the island, as divided A.M. 2870 and 3970, which name is supposed to have been modified to its present designation. St. Patrick is said to have visited it about the middle of the fifth century; but the first authentic records of Limerick notice it as a Danish settlement; by that people it was first plundered in 812. The Danes of Limerick did not embrace Christianity until the 11th century, and in the following they elected their first bishop. Before this period, however, it was a place of commerce, and was much frequented by foreign merchants. The English took possession of Limerick in the year 1174; and, as a proof of the early importance of the city, in the year 1197, and in the ninth year of the reign of King Richard, he granted a charter to the citizens to elect a mayor, which honour was not obtained by the citizens of London till ten years after that period; nor had Dublin and Cork a mayor till the 13th century. The city was originally walled and deemed the strongest fortress in this kingdom, having the advantage of not being commanded by adjacent heights, and it has sustained some memorable sieges. In the year 1690 King William brought his forces against it, but withdrew them without accomplishing its reduction; in the following year it was again invested by General Ginckle, who, after an obstinate resistance, compelled the garrison to surrender, on honourable terms of capitulation. During the siege the Irish fought gallantly, and repulsed the English several times, but the garrison was grown weary of the war, and on the 23rd of September, 1691, an amicable intercourse was opened between the two contending parties. In 1703 an act was passed excluding Roman Catholic strangers from residing in the city, and requiring from the permanent inhabitants of that persuasion sureties for their allegiance under pain of expulsion; but in the year 1724 these illiberal and arbitrary restrictions were removed. In 1760, Limerick was declared to be no longer a fortress, and the dismantling of its walls and other defences was then commenced and proceeded with, as the extension of

the various improvements rendered the removal of old buildings necessary. On the breaking out of the American war, the loyalty of this city and district was manifested by the alacrity with which the volunteer corps were embodied under the names of the 'Limerick Union,' the 'Loyal Limerick Volunteers,' and the 'Limerick Volunteers.' After the termination of the contest with America, the improvements in, and extension of the city, were renewed with energy, un retarded by the occasional alarms of insurrection, which distracted some of the neighbouring districts. In 1803 a design was formed, by those engaged in Emmett's conspiracy, to take the city by surprise, and with so much secrecy was the plan conducted, that it was unknown to the military commandant until the evening preceding the day of intended attack, when the proper measures were taken to frustrate the design. The most correct idea of this city, as to its scale when enclosed with walls and fortifications, may be formed by a comparison of its then contracted state with its present extent and population. This city is now composed of three parts, named the Irish Town, English Town (the latter situated on an island formed by the river Shannon), and Newton-Pery, which latter may with propriety be termed the court end, as in this quarter of the town the streets are spacious, uniform and elegant, intersecting each other at right angles, and the houses are finished in the neatest style of modern architecture. This portion of the city was erected by the exertions of the late Lord Pery, whose name it bears, and it is the fashionable as well as favourite residence of the opulent.

The public structures, for the most part, are handsome and commodious, and some elegant and ornamental. The Custom House is a fine building of hewn stone; its front is embellished with fluted pilasters and capitals, and on each side is a piazza. The Court House is also a spacious building, with a portico in front. The Town Hall, situated in Rutland street, is large and elegant. It contains the Council Chamber of the City Corporation, the Mayors and Treasurer's Offices, a commodious public reading room, &c. The Chamber of Commerce in George street, is a handsome edifice, in which are the newsrooms, library, offices, &c., of the body so called, and the board room of the Harbour Commissioners and Market Trustees. This institution comprises in its members the principal merchants of the city; was formed in the year 1808, and incorporated, by royal charter, in 1815, 'for the promotion and protection of the trade of Limerick.' The Limerick Institution, George-st. is a fine structure of the same character as the Chamber of Commerce; it is supported chiefly by professional men, and possesses a reading room and splendid library. The Limerick Athenaeum, Upper Cecil street, was erected chiefly with the intention of developing literature,

science, and art, and besides a reading room, library, and other literary attractions, it has a beautiful lecture hall, capable of accommodating nearly 500 persons. In the institution also, is situated the Government School of Design, in connection with South Kensington. The Protestant Lord Bishop's palace is situated in Henry-street, and that of the Catholic Lord Bishop in Corbally. The Theatre stands in Henry-street, and is the prettiest building of the kind in the provinces. The Freemasons of Limerick and the county have purchased the Philosophical Buildings, and transformed them into a Masonic Hall. The County gaol is generally considered to be one of the most complete prisons in Ireland—it consists of a large centre, containing the governor's apartments, a dispensary, a chapel, a committee-room, and five detached prisons, each communicating with the chapel on the second floor, by ornamental cast-iron bridges; belonging to each compartment of the prison are two fine airy yards, overlooked from the centre building. The City Gaol is situated in Merchant's quay. The County Infirmary, facing the gaol, is a spacious and convenient structure: so is the County Hospital, on the Cork new-road. Barrington's Hospital, at Saint George's quay, is a highly ornamental building, and cost £4,000. It was founded by Sir Joseph Barrington and his sons in 1829, for the relief of the poor of their native city; was opened for patients in 1831, and is the only general hospital in the city. The Wellesley Bridge, called after the late Marquis of Wellesley, Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, was commenced in 1821, and opened to the public by the Marquis of Normanby, in his lord lieutenancy of Ireland in 1835, when his excellency was the first who passed over it on horseback: it consists of five large arches, and of a swivel drawbridge on the south side; it is a very handsome stone structure, and cost about £80,000. Four other bridges also cross the river. There are barracks for cavalry, artillery and infantry, all commodious and in airy situations. The city is the head-quarters of the Limerick military district and of the constabulary force. The Limerick Militia Artillery and County Militia have also separate barracks. A list of the several public buildings and institutions, religious, charitable, &c. of Limerick, with their officials, is appended to the directory of the city.

The TRADE and COMMERCE of Limerick are very extensive. The harbour which stands at the head of the estuary of the Shannon (the noblest river in the kingdom), is greatly benefitted by the magnificent floating dock, constructed at an expense of £50,000. It extends about 1,600 yards in length, and 150 in breadth, with from two to nine feet at low water, and nineteen at spring tides; which latter, enables vessels of 600 tons burthen to moor at the quays. The harbour will be very much served by the splendid graving dock, 200 feet in length, at present being built. The quayage and wharfage (on which are five cranes), cost £18,000 in their erection. The imports are very large and various, consisting principally of timber, coal, grain, salt, sugar, tallow, tobacco, soap, iron, sulphur, pitch, tar, hemp, teas, wines, dye-stuffs, &c. The number and tonnage of vessels engaged in the cross channel and coasting trade, that entered the port in 1868 was 311, tons, 42,141; and outward, 223, and 29,717 tons; and from foreign, 121, 45,040; and outwards, 31, 12,617 tons. About a mile distant from the city, the vessels anchor in the Pool, from which is a most delightful view, very deservedly admired by strangers. On one side is seen the new town, with the Lord Bishop's gardens, &c. close to the river, and on the other side a number of villas belonging to the wealthy citizens, and a full front view of the city, the whole forming an interesting panoramic picture. The mayor is admiral of the port, with jurisdiction from the sea to three miles above the city. The domestic trade of Limerick, carried on by the shopkeepers, is very extensive—the shops are handsome, and their stocks comprise articles of fashion, necessity and luxury. The linen and woollen manufacture, once a staple branch of trade, disappeared some years ago, but was succeeded by the lace manufacture, which became famous throughout the United Kingdom for its beauty and elegance, that

branch of industry too, has almost disappeared, but, happily, has been succeeded by others. The firm of John Norris Russell & Sons, have erected an extensive and handsome flax factory; it is entirely formed of cut-stone, and employs a large number of both sexes, adjoining the factory are the ship-building and engineering works of the same firm, likewise giving employment to many hands. The city, too, has become celebrated through the enterprise of Sir Peter Tait, it being the site of his immense clothing factory, in which as many as 1,200 hands (of both sexes) recently found employment. Limerick has also been famous for its beautiful gloves for nearly a century; and it has established an extensive manufacture in brushes, which are sent in large quantities to the English market. The Bank of Ireland, the Provincial Bank of Ireland, the National Bank, and the Munster Bank have each a branch here, and there are numerous assurance agencies. The hotels, of which there are many, are of the first grade. Four newspapers are published—the 'Limerick Chronicle,' on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday: the 'Limerick Reporter,' on Tuesday and Friday: the 'Munster News,' and the 'Southern Chronicle,' on Wednesday and Saturday: they are talented journals, and, as such, are well supported by their respective subscribers.

The early municipal consequence of Limerick has already been noticed—its corporation existed both by prescription and charter. The city received privileges, franchises, and charters, from the early date of 1199, when John, Earl of Morton, Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, granted it various rights and 'free customs' down to the reign of James II. The provisions in the charter conferred by that monarch remained in force until the act of the 4th of George IV., called the 'Limerick Regulation Act.' partially remodelled the powers of the corporation. The corporate body—styled the 'mayor, sheriffs, and citizens of Limerick,' consists of ten aldermen and thirty councillors, elected from out of the five wards into which the city is divided, under the provisions of the late act. The mayor holds a court of conscience for adjudicating claims under 40s. The assizes for the county, and county of the city, are held twice a year by the judges for the Munster circuit and the mayor; the court of quarter sessions is held before the mayor, and other justices, petty sessions twice a week, before the mayor and some of the civic magistrates, and a police court daily. The assistant barrister for the county sits four times a year for the trial of civil bill cases. The city returned two members to the Irish Parliament, and so it continues to be represented in the Imperial Parliament—the gentleman at present sitting are Major George Gavin and F. W. Russell, Esq. The 'Limerick Harbour Commissioners' have the control and regulation of the harbour, and have much improved the port. The commissioners are entitled by their act of incorporation to levy tolls on all shipping frequenting the port, likewise on all imports and exports, and from these and other sources they realize a handsome yearly revenue.

The See of Limerick was united to that of Ardfert and Aghadoe, or rather, the latter was added to the former in the year 1660. The churches in Limerick are not remarkable for external beauty. St. Mary's, or the Cathedral, is entirely of the ancient Gothic, and may be admired for its noble simplicity; it is distinguished by a tower, 120 feet high. There are seventeen arches in the aisles and choir, besides the great eastern window, under which the high altar was placed before the Reformation. The bishop's throne, and the stalls of the dignitaries, exhibit some curious carved work, and at the communion table is a handsome Gothic screen. The names of the various ecclesiastical, religious, charitable, and other institutions, will be found appended to the directory of Limerick. One of these, however, called the Dominican Convent and Chapel, is deserving of notice. It is a very handsome building, in the Gothic style, and was erected by the exertions of the Rev. Joseph Harrigan, then prior, in the year 1815. The Augustinian chapel, George street, once a theatre, is very elegantly embellished, and a fine scriptural painting adorns the altar; it is also furnished with a good organ. The charitable institutions in Limerick are numerous and ex-

tremely well conducted, particularly in the medical and surgical departments. The Infirmary, Fever and Lock Hospitals, the Magdalene and Lunatic Asylums, the House of Industry, and Foundling Hospital, are prominent features of benevolence.

The market places are very extensive and are situated in different parts of the city—the principal being the ‘New Markets,’ near Garryowen, which are not now surpassed for extent, general adaptability and style of construction, in Ireland. The markets are held on Wednesday and Saturday, and are abundantly supplied with all the necessities of life, at remarkably reasonable prices.

Fairs, Tuesday in Easter week, July 4th, August 4th, and December 12th. The great Munster fairs are held the last Thursday and Friday in April, and on the last Thursday and Friday in October, on Thursday, horses and pigs, and on Friday, cattle and sheep. There is a privilege annexed to the August fair—namely, that no person can be arrested within the precincts of the liberties, on any process issuing out of the tholsel court of Limerick, for the space of fifteen days.

The population of the several parishes, collectively within and without the precincts of the city, by the parliamentary returns for 1851, was 69,871, of which

number 53,448 were inhabitants within the limits of the city. In 1861 the population of the several parishes amounted to 52,410, of which number the city contained 44,448.

KILDIMO is a parish containing a village of the same name, in the barony of Kenry, county of Limerick. The village is situated about five miles s. w. from the latter city. The places of worship are the parish church and a Roman Catholic chapel. There is also a national school. Population of the parish in 1861, 1,844, and of the village, 151.

MEELICK is a hamlet in the parish of KILLEELY, barony of Lower Bunratty, county of Clare. It is situated about 3½ miles N.W. from Limerick. Population in 1861, 120.

MUNGRET is a parish in the barony of Pubblebrien, three miles s.w. from Limerick. It contains the parish church; a national school, and the Limerick Model Agricultural School. Population, in 1861, 1,881.

PARTEEN is a village in the parish of ST. PATRICK'S, barony of Lower Bunratty, county of Clare, about 2½ miles n. by e. from Limerick. There is a Roman Catholic chapel here, and a school upon the national plan. Population in 1861, 65.

NEWCASTLE—WEST

IS a market town, in the parishes of NEWCASTLE and MONAGH, barony of Glenglin, county of Limerick, 145 miles s.w. from Dublin, 51 n.w. from Cork, 39 n.e. from Tralee, 25 s.w. from Limerick, 19 n.w. by w. from Charleville, and 7½ s.w. from Rathkeale; pleasantly seated close to the river Darragh, on the road from the Kerry coast to Limerick. It was anciently called Castleroe, and owed both its origin and its name to the Knights Templars, who erected a castle here in 1184, around which, in process of time, a town was formed and fortified, the inhabitants of which ultimately obtained a charter of incorporation. The town comprises four principal streets and a square; in the latter are the church, a branch of the Provincial Bank of Ireland, and one of the National Bank, also an infantry barrack. At one time a considerable business was done here in leather, and tanning was carried on extensively; but this has fallen away, and no particular branch of manufacture distinguishes the place as one of commerce. Its chief trade is now confined to the shops, which are supported by the reciprocal demands of the inhabitants and the custom of an opulent gentry in the neighbourhood. Court leet and baron are held by the seneschal of the manor, and petty and quarter sessions for the district by the magistrates—the former weekly.

The church, situated in the square as before stated, is a handsome structure in the early English style,

with a square embattled tower, surmounted by pinnacles. It was erected in 1777, at the sole expense of William, second Viscount Courtenay. In the burial-ground, which is at a short distance from the town, are the ruins of the old church. The Roman Catholic chapel is a good edifice of stone, erected in 1833, upon land given by the Earl of Devon, who likewise contributed £400 towards the expense of the building. The Courtenay school, contiguous to the town, is of ancient foundation, but the premises were rebuilt in 1835, and now affords accommodation to more than 500 children of the town and neighbourhood, who are educated gratuitously, and the institution is maintained at the expense of the nobleman above-mentioned. A charter exists for holding markets on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, but none is observed except on the last-named day. The Waterford and Limerick (Rathkeale and Newcastle section), Railway Company have a commodious station close to the town.

Fairs, April 1st, May 3rd, July 12th, August 20th, October 1st, and December 16th. The united parishes of Newcastle and Monagh contained, in 1851, 9,800 inhabitants, and the town of Newcastle, 2,719 of that number. In 1861, the population of the united parishes was 8,228, of which number Newcastle contained 2,452.

NEWMARKET,

A MARKET town, in the parish of CLOXPERT, barony of Duhallow, county of Cork, is 155 miles s.w. from Dublin, 38 n.w. from Cork, and about five n.w. from Kanturk; situated near the north-western boundary of the county, on a small stream which falls into the river Dallua, a little below the town, and which propels the corn mill of Ebenezer Donaldson, M.D. The ancient name of this place was *Ahahasne*, or 'the place of the ford,' from its situation near a ford, now superseded by a neat bridge, at the entrance of the town. Its present name is derived from the establishment of its market, granted to the Aldworth family by James I. It consists principally of two streets intersecting each other, and contiguous to the town is its principal ornament, Newmarket House, the elegant mansion of Richard Oliver Aldworth, Esq., the lord of the manor. The trade of the place is almost limited to shopkeeping. Petty sessions are held every third Wednesday, in the court-house, a stone building, beneath which the market is held.

The parish church, a neat structure, possesses little to attract notice, and its lofty tower and spire alone render it conspicuous. The Roman Catholic chapel is of considerable dimensions: the site of it was a gift of the late Richard Aldworth, Esq., who also contributed towards the expense of its erection. The altar, which is much admired, is a copy from that of the ancient abbey of Quin. A free school, patronised by the Aldworth family, and one for boys under the National Board of Education, are the gratuitous educational establishments. Newmarket was the birthplace of the celebrated John Philpot Curran. Fairs, Jan. 14th, Feb. 9th, March 6th and 31st, April 21st, May 11th and 24th, June 8th and 28th, July 16th and 31st, August 15th, September 8th and 22nd, October 10th, November 1st and 21st, and December 18th. The population of the parish of Clonfert, in 1851, was 15,605, in 1861 only 11,056; and the town of Newmarket contained 779 of the latter number.

RATHKEALE.

A MARKET town and parish, in the barony of Lower Corcomroe, county of Limerick, is 180 miles s.w. from Dublin, 32 n.n.w. from Cork, and 17 s.w. by w. from Limerick; situated between the last-named town and Newcastle, on the banks of the river Deel. It was formerly a corporate town, and of more importance than it now is, at least in the annals of turbulence and war, having obstinately and successfully resisted various assaults of the English army during the rebellion, which desolated this island in the reign of Elizabeth. At a very early age a priory for Augustinian canons, under the invocation of the Virgin Mary, was founded here by a person of the name of Harvey. The town consists principally of one long and wide street, extending from east to west, with some respectable houses and many good shops. The court-house, in the Square, is a neat stone building, and the bridewell, a substantial one, beneath it. Petty sessions are held every alternate Thursday, and quarter sessions in January, April, July and October. Agriculture is the prevailing occupation of the inhabitants; the trade of the town is entirely of a character connected therewith, corn being the principal, but even that comparatively trifling. There are several flour mills, one of which is on a large scale.

The places of worship are the parish church, dedicated to the Holy Trinity, standing upon an acclivity at the west end of the town, and a Roman Catholic chapel in Thomas street, both handsome structures—the former has a lofty embattled tower with crocketed pinnacles. The surrounding country is highly interesting, presenting a number of rich and varied prospects, embellished with flourishing plantations and many seats of the gentry. A prominent object in the landscape is Mistras or Matrix Castle, which stands about a mile from the town, in a fine situation, on the banks of the Deel, commanding extensive views of the country, including the Shannon river, and the Clare and Tipperary mountains. It was besieged by Cromwell, but received little injury at his hands, and is now in a state of complete repair. The markets, which are well supplied, are held on Thursday and Saturday.

Fairs, January 7th, February 7th, March 10th, April 4th and 24th, May 8th, June 1st and 19th, July 17, August 6th and 25th, September 18th, October 15th, November 4th and 18th, and December 13th. The population of the parish, in 1851, was 7,723, including 2,988 inhabitants of the town, and in 1861, 5,152, of which the town numbered 2,751.

ROSCREA,

WITH BOURNEY (MUNSTER), AND AGHANCON, BORRIS-IN-OSSORY, DUNKERRIN ETTAGH, MONEYGALL, AND SHINRONE (LEINSTER).

ROSCREA or Roscrea (meaning *Crosswood*), is an ancient and considerable market town and parish, partly in the baronies of Clonlisk and Ballybritt, King's county, and province of Leinster, but chiefly in the barony of Ikeris, county of Tipperary, 75 miles s.w. from Dublin, 51 n. from Clonmel, and 44 n.e. from Limerick; situated at the northern apex of the county of Tipperary, that runs up between and divides King's and Queen's counties. This place was erected into a bishopric in the year 620, by St. Cronan, but in the twelfth century was united to Killaloe. Some remains of the cathedral may be seen in the west front of the old church, executed in the beautiful style of the ninth century. Near it is a large stone cross, called the Shrine of St. Cronan, as well as one of the largest round towers in the kingdom, built of square stones, and in excellent preservation. Near this town the Danes met their first signal defeat; they had marched from Limerick and Connaught to surprise the inhabitants, then assembled at the great annual fair of Roscrea, which continued fourteen days; but the people had notice of their approach, marched out, overthrew them, and left 4,000 Danes dead on the field, amongst whom was Gilfin, their chief. The military barrack is within the walls of the ancient castle, built in 1218 by King John, and it is an important station, as the intersection of several great roads occur at this point. The town, which is seated on a

stream tributary to the river Brosna, consists of several streets irregularly laid out, and many of the houses are but indifferently built. From the remains of its castles, ecclesiastical edifices, and round tower, the town presents an interesting object as seen from the hills in the surrounding neighbourhood. There are two small tanneries in the town, also a flax scutching mill, about a mile distant; the retail trade is conducted upon an extensive scale, and several flour mills contribute to the prosperity of the town. A Savings' Bank is in operation here, and a loan fund was founded in 1835 by the London Charitable Association, and is still in a flourishing state. There are two excellent banks in Castle street—branches respectively of the Bank of Ireland and National Bank—the former erected in 1858, and the latter in 1864. Petty sessions are held every Monday in the court-house.

The parish church is a large commodious edifice, in the Gothic style, with a lofty tower at the west-end, erected in 1812. The Roman Catholic chapel, situated near the ruins of a Franciscan friary, founded by Mulroony-na-Fesonge, is an elegant structure adjoining the nunnery of Mount St. Joseph; it was completed in 1870. It is in the Gothic style of architecture, with two handsome spires at the west-end gable. The interior is very imposing, there being five handsome stained glass windows adorning the chancel, together with a very costly and magnificent altar.
