

Bussett's Directorus - History of Limericks

Population 44,448,

Is a populous city of considerable extent, situated on the River Shannon, distant from Dublin 94 miles south-west, from Cork 50 miles, from Waterford 66, and from Tralee 50. Is a seaport town of much importance. Limerick is traditionally supposed to have been built by Yuorus, in the year 155, and was anciently much frequented by foreign merchants. After the arrival of the Danes in 855, those enterprising people effected a very great improvement in its commerce. The English took possession of it in the year 1174; and so important was it at that period, that King Richard in 1197, being the ninth year of his reign, granted a charter to the citizens to elect a mayor, an honour which was not obtained by the citizens of London for ten years subsequent to that date; nor had Dublin or Cork a mayor until the 13th century. Being originally walled, and situated far apart from commanding heights, it was looked upon as the strongest fortress in Ireland, and thereby enabled the inhabitants in those days to successfully withstand several memorable sieges. In the year 1690, King William brought his forces against it, but was ultimately compelled to withdraw them, without accomplishing its reduction. On the 23rd of September, 1691, after the garrison had grown tired of the war, and given up all hopes of the arrival of the French fleet, General Ginkle, then commanding the English forces, was solicited for a cessation of hostilities, whereupon a treaty was entered into, the terms of which were, that the Irish Roman Catholics should enjoy the exercise of their religion, in as full a manner as in the reign of Charles II., and that their Majesties would endeavour to procure for them the security of Parliament in this particular. All included in the capitulation were promised the enjoyment of their estates, and the peaceable pursuit of their professions and callings. The gentry were to be allowed the use of arms and no oath required of them except the oath of allegiance. The treaty alluded to is said to have been signed on a large piece of the purest limestone, not far from Thomond Bridge, where it was afterwards removed, and remained for many years close to the door of a spirit tavern. In this position it was often subject to the hammer of the antiquary: a small portion of it, set in a ring, is reported to have realized the large sum of £1,000, at a bazaar in America. Observing it gradually decrease in size, a few patriotic gentlemen, amongst whom Mr. Michael Mulcahy was foremost, set a subscription list on foot, which resulted in a handseme cut stone pedestal being erected, close to Thomond Bridge,

and on it now rests this historic relic. To perpetuate the memory of the surrender of Limerick, two medals were struck, by order of King William, who then became Master of the Kingdom. The first of these exhibited the bust of William, crowned with laurel; on the reverse, Hercules holding a club over Ireland prostrate; while France, having the fleur-de-lis on her target, flies out of the field. The second medal was more appropriate than the other. It presented the busts of King William and Queen Mary, crowned with laurel, and surrounded by their titles. On the obverse was the latin inscription, Non hee sine numine Divum (these things are due to propitious heaven); and on the reverse, Limerica capta, Hibernia subacta, Octobris, 1691, (Limerick taken and Ireland subdued October, 1591.) Among the most prominent of manufacturing establishments is that of Sir Peter Tait, D.L., situate at Boherbuoy, The borough of Limerick returns two members of Parliament; it is at present represented by Richard O'Shaughnessy, Esq. and Isaac Butt, Esq., Q.C. Education has made rapid strides for some years past, particularly among the poorer classes of citizens. many of whom have been thereby enabled to compete for positions of trust in this and other countries. The lines of railway have gradually increased, until the city has been brought into daily communication with the principal cities, towns, and villages throughout the kingdom. The Lunatic Asylum is a handsomely situated building, on the Cork road. On the 13th of May, 1873 and during the mayoralty of Mr. J. J. Cleary, the new Graving Dock was opened by his Excellency, The Lord Lieutenant of Ireland. Last year the first sod of the People's Park, Perry Square, was raised by Mr. Cleary, in the presence of the members of the corporation and a large number of citizens. Baker Place has been much improved by the magnificent Clock Tower which stands in the centre, and which was erected some time since, by the citizens, to Sir Peter Tait, D.L. in recognition of his many services rendered to Limerick. Assizes are held here twice a year, and the present chairman of the county, T.A. Purcell, Esq., Q.C., sits four times a year, on which occasions cases of a most important character are adjudicated upon, leaving but a small amount of business for the assizes. The city magistrates hold a court every day, and petty sessions are held in the county and city courts, on Thursday and Friday in each week. The ordinary markets take place daily. A fair for the sale of cattle and sheep is held on the first Thursday in every month, and the montly market for pigs on the first Tuesday of every month, Our Great Munster Fairs come off in April, June, and October, and are generally largely attended by horse buyers, particularly from England, France, Prussia, Austria, &c. The Harbour Commissioners meet once a fortnight, on Mondays. The Governors of the District Lunatic Asylum, once a month, on Mondays; and the Guardians of the Poor, on Wednesdays, weekly.

INLAND BOOK POST.

Inland Book Packets limited to the same dimensions as Inland Letters, and to a maximum weight of 5lbs. The postage is One Halfpenny for every two ounces or fraction of two ounces. Every Book Packet must be sent either without a cover or in a cover open at the ends; and may not contain anything sealed or closed against inspection, nor any communication of the nature of a letter, unless the whole of such be printed.

The Postage of a Newspaper is a Halfpenny, which must be prepaid either by a Postage Stamp or a Stamped Wrapper. A Newspaper must have no Cover, or a Cover open at both ends.

NEWCASTLE

POPULATION 2,449.

Is a flourishing business town, situate on a branch of the Limerick and Foynes Railway, which terminates at the town, it is distant from Limerick 20 mi es west, a considerable stream called the Arra, runs through the town and empties itself into the Deel, so famous of late years for its salmon fishing. In the centre of the town is a beautiful square, in which stands the National and Provincial Banks, the Police Barrack, and other important public buildings. Quarter Sessions of the peace are held four times a year and Petty Sessions weekly (on Fridays). There is an extensive butter market held here once a week, at which there are seldom less than 1,600 firkins offered for sale, and in some instances there has been over 2,000 firkins in market, all of which is generally bought up quickly, as buyers attend from the principal towns in Munster. There are also 13 horse and cattle fairs held annually, the pig market being held on the day previous in each case. The guardians of the poor meet once a week. Well kept roads and footways together with several handsome villas, render the approaches to the town in every direction most agreeable. The Castle at present occupied by Charles Curling, Esq, agent to the popular lord of the soil, Rt. Hon the Earl of Devon has attached to it an extensive and beautifully ornamented demesne which has been most liberally thrown open to the public for recreative purposes. There is an ancient building here called "The Desmond Hall," it is yet in a perfect state and used as a Masonic Hall. It is supposed to have been one of the residences of the Geraldines, so famed in Irish history. It was proposed lately to have Town Commissioners elected for Newcastle, but the inhabitants objected to it thinking that the taxation might become too high.

COUNTY OF CLARE

-

ENNIS

(POPULATION, 6,394)

Is the Assizes Town of the County of Clare, within twenty miles northwest of Limerick. It is situated on the River Fergus, which is spanned by six bridges, and only navigable to the village of Clare Castle, two miles distant from the town, where there is a fine quay. There are extensive flour mills and a large inland trade, but no manufactures of any importance are carried on. The name of the principal street has been changed by the inhabitants to that of O'Connell-square, in consequence of the erection in it of the splendid column and colossal statue (by Hogan) to the memory of the great O'Connell. The public buildings of note are, the Catholic Church, which has a splendid Gothic tower and spire 170 feet high; the new Protestant Church, a handsome Gothic edifice: the Franciscan Church, Presbyterian Church, Convent of Mercy, Christian Brothers' Monastery, the Court House, built at a cost of £12,000, Gaol; Militia Barracks, Infirmary, and Union Workhouse. The new Luantic Asylum, a magnificent building, which cost £51,000, was erected in 1868, at Doolick, within a quarter of a mile of the town. The Provincial and National Banks are very handsome buildings, and the Bank of Ireland, who have at present temporary effices, are about to build a new bank in O'Connell-square, at a cost of £6,000. The local government of the town is vested in eighteen Commissioners, under the Towns' Improvement Act. A Petty Sessions' Court is held every Friday; and Saturday is the market day each week. The Guardians of the Poor meet on Wednesdays, the Governors of the Lunatic Asylum the second Saturday in each month, and the Gaol Poard of Superintendance the first Sturday in ach month. The borough returns one member to Parliament, and it is at present represented by William Stackpool, M.P., Ballyala. The number of electors in 1874 was 287. Rev Malert Mingers of Con.






