Limerick, Cork, Killarney, and the Blackwater.

The tourist, entering Ireland by Dublin, proceeds from the railway station at King's-bridge, by the Great Southern and Western Railway, southwards, traversing the great plain of the Curragh of Kildare, on the left side of which is the Military Camp, of which a glimpse may be caught from the train after passing the town of Newbridge. The towns along this route present no remarkable features; and the scenery for the larger portion of the journey to the Limerick Junction is not very attractive. On passing this station the very fine range of the Galtees Mountains presents itself; this the railway skirts, and proceeds to Mallow, the junction for Killarney, and in an opposite direction for Fermoy and Lismore.

Mallow is a pretty town situate in a fine vale, environed by rich pasture lands and wooded scenery. It has long enjoyed a celebrity for its Spas, and its invigorating and healthy surroundings. From thence we pass by Blarney with its groves and castles, and its well-known Turkish Baths established by the late Dr. Barter, now called St. Anne's Hill.

Cork is situate in a deep vale, having the river Lee running through it. It has a few public buildings; but its great charm is the scenery of its beautiful river. The tourist should take the steamer from Patrick's Bridge to Queenstown, and round the Cove to Aghada and Crosshaven, returning to Queenstown, and then ascending the heights over the town to obtain a land view of the Bay and of Hawlbowlane, Spike Island, and Rocky Island; the former being a depot for ordnance stores, Spike Island being the great convict prison establishment, and Rocky Island having powder magazines and a small barrack.

Cork to Glengariff and Killarney.—The general tourist, after spending a day or two in Cork, should go on to Killarney by the railway to Macroom, and thence by car to Glengariff, Kenmare, and over a long mountain range, so as to descend upon it from above the upper lake. The journey from Cork to Killarney, which occupies two days, is a severe strain upon some travellers, but will amply repay the toil. After leaving Macroom the car passes by the Lakes of Inchegeelah, stopping to visit Gougane Barra, a beautiful tarn in a secluded spot, surrounded by mountains; thence through the rocky pass of Keimaneigh, with cascades breaking down the hill sides in all directions; the traveller at last sees opening before him the historic Bantry Bay, and reaches Glengariff about six o'clock in the evening. Here comfortable accommodation may be obtained, and travellers should if possible remain a day, partly to rest, but chiefly to explore the romantic scenery around. Starting from Glengariff at 9.30 in the morning, the car winds up the mountain, which presents most varied and beautiful groupings of scenery; the road finally traverses the ridge, through a tunnel in the rock, and you descend upon the pretty village of Kenmare. After dinner or lunch here, you ascend the mountain range dividing Kenmare from Killarney, and after three or four hours more riding you enter the latter town, passing to one or other of its celebrated hotels.

Before reaching Killarney, the tourist obtains from above the Police Barrack a good general view of the whole range of lakes and mountains, which will help to a better knowledge afterwards. The Upper Lake, Middle Lake, and Lower Lake are all in sight; and

the stretch of water known as the Long Range, and the Eagles' Nest Mountain, with Dinas Island and the Plantations, may also be seen. This view should be asked for from the driver of the car, with explanations.

The first general trip which we should recommend is—to pass through the Gap of Dunloe, take boat at Lord Brandon's Cottage, pausing to catch the Echoes in the Long Range, but especially at the Eagles' Nest; come on to the Dinas Island to lunch, and visit either O'Sullivan's Cascade or the Island of Innisfallen on the way home. On landing at Innisfallen, good walkers should follow the path round the island, in order to enjoy the scenery from its various points of view.

Another trip should be a drive through the Kenmare Demesne, round Ross Island, Muckross Abbey, and through Muckross Demesne to Dinas Island; then drive to Torc Cascade, and be sure climb to the view point above the Fall, to admire the splendid prospect of the Middle and Lower Lakes. This is, perhaps, the finest view of the general scenery of the Lakes, and will well close the day's excursion.

Pedestrians should ascend Mangerton, and in the afternoon if practicable, as some of the best views are to be had after the heat of the day is over.

After a tiring day, it will be a grateful change to spend the following day in boating. Follow the southern margin of the Lower Lake, past Lake View; cross over the Toomies shore, and ascend the lake along the shore, taking O'Sullivan's Cascade on the way; Glena Bay, through Brickeen Bridge, to the Middle Lake, which skirt along the shore; again pass through the Bridge into the Lower Lake into Castlelough Bay; and along the eastern shore to Ross Island. This trip will give excellent views of the mountain and wooded scenery; better, perhaps, than any set excursion.

On the scenery of these romantic lakes we have no room to dwell in further detail; special guides to the district will best describe the localities to be visited; and lovers of the beautiful in nature may find occupation for all their senses in this rich centre of mountain, lake, and woodland scenery.

The island of Valencia, the Atlantic Telegraph station, lies west from Killarney about forty miles. It is reached by mail car, and is noted for its magnificent cliff scenery and the enormous volume of its waves. Bray Head rises to the height of nearly 800 feet, and commands some of the finest views of rocky promontories and noble bays to be seen in Ireland. The drive from Cahirciveen by Waterville and Derrynane along the Kenmare River to the town

of Kenmare is replete with varied beauty that can hardly be exceeded. A little beyond Caherdaniel the road passes within two miles of Staigue Fort, one of the oldest and most extraordinary antiquarian remains in the whole island. We can warmly recommend this excursion to pedestrians.

The tourist from Cork should also proceed by rail to Youghal, a town of great antiquity, at the mouth of the Blackwater river. Here the potato is said to have been first planted, having been brought to Ireland by Sir Walter Raleigh. From Youghal there is a steamer which plies upon the Blackwater to Cappoquin. The scenery of this river is very beautiful, and the seats of the gentry are charmingly placed. The river is tidal almost up to Cappoquin, and from this cause its beauty depends in part upon the state of the tide, which when low exposes banks of mud that impair the landscape. From Cappoquin a short drive brings you to Lismore, a clean, well-built town, belonging to the Duke of Devonshire; and on the riverside stands Lismore Castle, a noble pile of buildings, now the Irish seat of the Duke. From Lismore to Cappoquin an interesting excursion may be made to the Trappist Monastery of Mount Mellary. There is a large quantity of land reclaimed by the monks, and an excellent School of Agriculture. Strangers are always made welcome.

From Lismore to Fermoy and Mallow is a short ride by railway; or the tourist may turn aside to visit Mitchelstown, with its Castle, the seat of the late Earls of Kingston. About eight miles from this are the Mitchelstown Caves—Stalactite and Spar—never fully explored, and requiring an old suit of clothes to be worn, with candles, &c.; only suited for male inspection. Six miles further he will reach Cahir, and may proceed by car to the ancient City of Cashel, and explore the old Cathedral and ecclesiastical ruins—the Rock of Cashel. This striking object rises from the centre of a fertile plain, and is crowned by the ruins of a Castle, Cathedral, Chapel, Monastery, Round Tower, &c. It is a place well worthy of a visit. The seaboard cities of Waterford and Limerick lie eastward and westward from Cahir station. Several places in Limerick and the Shannon districts are attractive to tourists. Kilkee, in the County Clare, is a favourite watering-place. Railways have caused great changes in these districts; the City of Limerick has declined in population from 53,448 in 1851 to 39,828 in 1871. The carrying trade of produce now tends from west to east, the outlets being Dublin, Cork, and Waterford to Great Britain, and imports flows in the reverse direction.

Every boat, decked or open, trading in or upon the river Shannon, and discharging or loading at or in the dock, or at the quays, or into or from any vessel lying there, a sum not exceeding 1s. Every STEAMBOAT trading in or upon the river Shannon, for every voyage, on her arrival at the port of Limerick, a sum not exceeding 6s. Every STEAMBOAT towing vessels in or upon the river Shannon, for every vessel towed to or from or within the port of Limerick, a sum not exceeding 3s.

GRAVING DOCK RATES.

The rates for the Graving Dock are regulated upon a uniform principle. For vessels under 50 tons for two tides, the tide in and next tide out, £2 5s.; three tides, £2 12s. 6d.; five, £3 7s. 6d.; eight, £4 10s. Above eight and not exceeding twenty-four tides, £7 10s.; two neaps, £15; five, £37 10s.; eight, £60. Vessels exceeding 250 tons and not exceeding 300 tons, for two tides, £4 2s. 6d.; five, £6 3s. 9d.; two neaps, £30; five, £75. Vessels exceeding 450 and not exceeding 500 tons, two tides, £5 12s. 6d.; five, £8 8s. 9d.; two neaps, £40; five, £100. Exceeding 700 and not exceeding 750 tons, two tides, £7 10s.; eight, £15; two neaps, £52 10s.; five, £131 5s. Exceeding 850 and not exceeding 900 tons, two tides, £8 12s. 6d.; eight, £17 5s.; two neaps, £60. Exceeding 900 and not exceeding 950 tons, two tides, £9; eight, £18; two neaps, £62 10s. Exceeding 950 and not exceeding 1,000 tons, two tides, £9 7s. 6d.; eight, £18 15s.; two neaps, £65. Exceeding 1,350 and not exceeding 1,400 tons, two tides, £12 7s. 6d.; eight, £24 15s.; two neaps, £85. Exceeding 1,400 and not exceeding 1,450 tons, two tides, £12 15s.; eight, £25 10s.; two neaps, £87 10s. Exceeding 1,450 and not exceeding 1,500 tons, two tides, £13 2s. 6d.; eight, £26 5s.; two neaps, £90.

GRAVING DOCK REGULATIONS.

Masters, agents, or persons in charge of vessels requiring use of the Graving Dock must make application to the Secretary of the Harbour Commissioners for a docking order, giving particulars of the draft of water, length of keel, &c., and stating the time required

for repairs, and shall prepay a deposit of £5, which deposit shall be allowed in settlement of the dock rates, provided there shall be no claim thereon for damage to the dock or any of its appliances by neglect on the part of any person acting for the vessel; but such deposit shall be forfeited if the vessel is not ready to enter dock at the time stated in the application, unless prevented by unavoidable circumstances; and every vessel so entered shall be subject to and chargeable with dock rates for the time so stated, even if that time be not required. In case the dock rates chargeable per schedule on any vessel leaving the dock shall not amount to the deposit of £5, she shall pay, on account of the expense of pumping the dock, such sum as in addition to the rates so chargeable shall amount to the sum of £5.

PATENT SLIP.

The Masters of vessels requiring use of the Patent Slip shall deposit £5 with the Secretary of the Harbour Commissioners, the same to be allowed in settlement of the dues and charges, provided there shall be no claim for damage to the slip. The deposit will be forfeited if the vessel is not ready for hauling up within fourteen days from the day it is made. The slippage dues are on the registered tonnage. On the registered tonnage of every vessel using the slip, 1½d. per ton per day, and on gross tonnage of steamers, including use of blocks and shores.

EXPLOSIVES.

Every vessel entering the harbour of Limerick with explosive substances (gunpowder included) on board, from the approach to Scatterry Island, and for the whole way up the river from that point, shall display a red flag by day and a red light by night at the foremast. Vessels thus laden shall be required to anchor in the river to the westward of Barrington's-quay, and there only; and notice of the arrival shall be promptly served at the Harbour Master's Office. Explosives must be landed in lighters, each to display a red flag while engaged in the work, and keep clear of other vessels. No explosives shall be loaded, unloaded, or conveyed except between sunrise and sunset. Explosives shall only be exported from the port of Limerick from Barrington's-quay, at such times as the Harbour Master may direct. The maximum penalty for the infringement of the bye-laws is £20, and £10 for each day during which the offence continues.

PETROLEUM.

Every vessel carrying petroleum shall, on approaching Scatterry Island in the Shannon, and so long as she has any petroleum on board, exhibit and keep hoisted a red flag at the masthead by day and a red light by night. The petroleum shall be discharged at the "Pool," and landed only at the North Strand-quay. The bye-laws on this subject refer only to the description of petroleum to which the Petroleum Act, 1871, refers.

PILOTS AND PILOTAGE.

Pilots taking charge of vessels in distress shall not be required to accept payments according to the regular rates. Pilots passing vessels having signals for pilots flying, for the purpose of taking charge of other vessels, shall forfeit their licences. Pilots not permitted to resort to courts of law for the recovery of fees unless vessels are suddenly leaving port. All disagreements in regard to such matters to be submitted for consideration and settlement by the Harbour Commissioners. Pilots in boarding vessels must submit to the Masters their licences and copies of the regulations governing their body. The pilotage rates between Scatterry and Limerick are, for vessels of 100 tons, inward, £1 10s.; outward, with cargo or ballast, £1 10s. Vessels not exceeding 150 tons, inward, £1 13s.; outward, with cargo or ballast, £1 13s.; not exceeding 200 tons, inward, £1 16s.; outward, with cargo or ballast, £1 16s.; not exceeding 250 tons, inward, £2 11s.; outward, with cargo or ballast, £2 11s.; not exceeding 500 tons, inward, £4 13s.; outward, with cargo, £4 13s., ballast, £3 2s.; not exceeding 750 tons, inward, £5 17s.; outward, with cargo, £5 17s., with ballast, £3 18s.; not exceeding 1,000 tons, inward, £6 6s.; outward, with cargo, £6 6s., ballast, £4 4s.; not exceeding 1,400 tons, inward, £7 7s.; outward, with cargo, £6 6s., with ballast, £4 4s.

BYE-LAWS, HARBOUR AND QUAYS.

A clear space of six feet from the face of the quay-wall toward the roadway shall be left free of encumbrance, on pain of a fine of ten shillings. Timber in the process of hoisting shall be allowed a clear space of thirty feet from the butt of the crane, toward the roadway. In piling, no more than six tiers in height shall be allowed; any deviation from this rule will subject the owner or

agent to a fine of twenty shillings for every twenty-four hours during the continuance of the violation. Timber, deals, and staves must be removed from the floating dock, quays, and wharfs within fourteen days from the discharge of the vessel in which they have been imported, on pain of forty shillings for each succeeding twenty-four hours. Tiles, bricks, and slates, imported, on pain of a fine of ten shillings per day, to be cleared off the quays within seven days after final discharge of vessel.

INLAND BOOK POST.

Inland book packets limited to the same dimensions as inland letters, and to a maximum weight of 5 lb. The postage is one halfpenny for every two ounces or fraction of two ounces. Every book packet must be sent either without a cover or in a cover open at the ends; and may not contain anything sealed or closed against inspection, nor any communication of the nature of a letter, unless the whole of such be printed.

The postage of a newspaper is a halfpenny, which must be prepaid either by a postage stamp or a stamped wrapper. A newspaper must have no cover, or a cover open at both ends.

The halfpenny post-cards will be available for places in the United Kingdom only. The front or stamped side is intended for the address; there must be no other writing or printing on it.

No card other than one of those issued by the Government will pass under a halfpenny stamp, if it bear a written communication of the nature of a letter.

CITY OF LIMERICK.

Stands.—Francis-street, Bedford-row, Shannon-street, Lower Cecil-street, Lower Glentworth-street, Roche's-street, Thomas-st., Railway Terminus, and Steamboat-quays.

The registered number of each car must be painted in the centre of the back panel in figures of at least three inches in length. The name of owner to be painted distinctly on right shaft, and to be annually registered with the High Constable of the Borough.

Each driver to be provided with a badge containing the number of his car, to remain with his car while on the stand, to be proper in his conduct, and civil and respectful in his language, not to loiter upon or obstruct the streets unnecessarily; not to refuse a call while on stand; to produce rules if called on by person engaging car, or by an authorized officer. Cars to be maintained in good order. Each driver to be provided with a card containing list of fares.

For a drive from any place within the Borough, to any other place within the Borough, without stopping, for not more than two persons nor more than 42 lb. of luggage, 6d. For more than two and not exceeding four persons, with 84 lb. luggage, 1s. Between the hours of twelve o'clock at night and nine o'clock in the morning, double fare. For an hour by day 1s., and for every half-hour afterwards, 6d. All covered cars and carriages to be provided with check strings attached to drivers. All property (parcels, &c.) found in hackney vehicles to be taken immediately to the office of the High Constable, Town Hall, where all disputes arising out of alleged overcharges will be heard and disposed of, according to the Rules and Bye-laws approved by Lord Lieutenant, 1854.

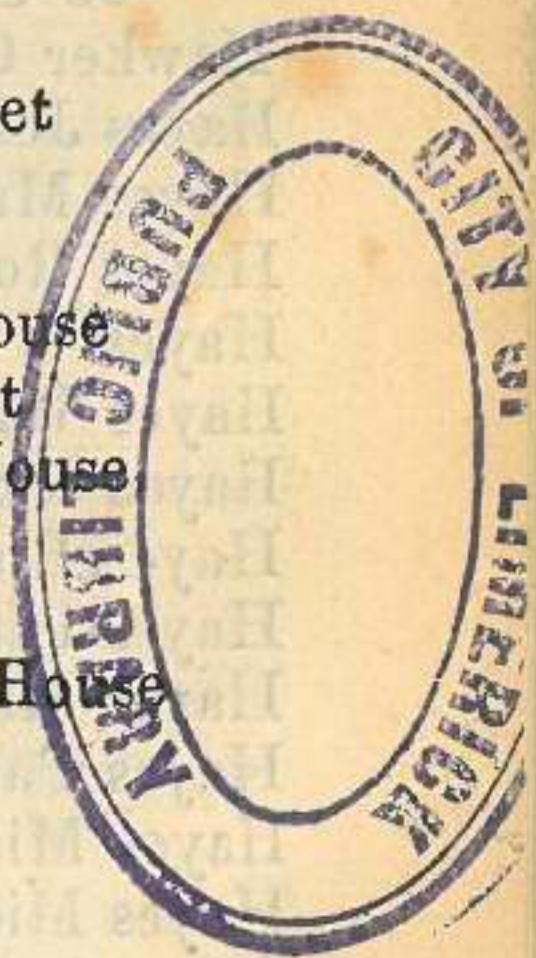

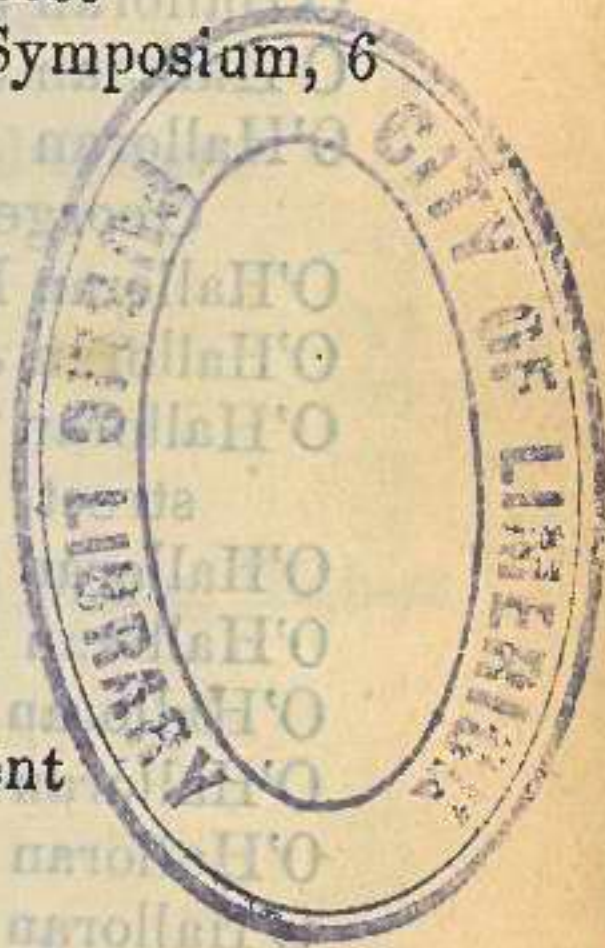
