PREFACE.

THE Publishers, in issuing the NINTH Edition of the DIRECTORY OF IRELAND, think it may be necessary to give some reason for the delay in its publication.

Some idea of the amount of labour involved may be indicated by the fact that the whole book has been re-arranged, and that the 2,428 parishes, some hundreds of which have not appeared in any other Directory, besides numerous towns and villages, have been arranged in their proper alphabetical position throughout the respective Provinces.

To the General Introduction to Ireland, tables have been added, showing Population, Distribution of Land, Crops, Live Stock, &c.

Each Province is dealt with separately, prefixed by some statistics, and the Magistrates, Members of Parliament and Officials; then follow the Parishes and Towns in alphabetical order, each of which has its nearest railway station given, with distances from adjacent places and some local particulars of interest; Belfast and Dublin having sections devoted to themselves.

A General Directory of Private Residents and also a Classification of Trades are added, and a copious Index of all places in the book, giving easy reference, is prefixed, together with a list of the Seats of the Nobility and principal Gentry, which it is hoped will be found useful.

Lastly, a Large Map, corrected to date, is appended.

The Proprietors have to thank those Gentlemen who have given them the benefit of their local knowledge.

LIMERICK.

This ancient city, eligibly and delightfully situated on the eastern bank of the noble Shannon, is supposed to have been founded by Yuorus, in the year 155, while, by some writers, it is said to have been the Regia of Ptolemy. It was called Rosse-de-Nailleagh in the Annals of Multifernan, and is believed to have been the place described under the name of Lumneach, as forming the western extremity of the southern half of the island, as divided A.M. 2870 and 3970, which name is supposed to have been modified to its present designation. St. Patrick is said to have visited it about the middle of the 5th century; but the first authentic records of Limerick notice it as a Danish settlement; by that people it was first plundered in 812. The Danes of Limerick did not embrace Christianity until the 11th century, and in the following they elected their first bishop. Before this period, however, it was a place of commerce, and was much frequented by foreign merchants. The English took possession of Limerick in the year 1174; and as a proof of the early importance of the city, in the year 1197, and in the 9th year of the reign of King Richard, he granted a charter to the citizens to elect a mayor, which honour was not obtained by the citizens of London till 10 years after that period; nor had Dublin and Cork a mayor till the 13th century. The city was originally walled, and deemed the strongest fortress in this kingdom, having the advantage of not being commanded by adjacent heights, and it has sustained some memorable sieges. In the year 1690 King William brought his forces against it, but withdrew them without accomplishing its reduction; in the following year it was again invested by General Ginckle, who, after an obstinate resistance, compelled the garrison to surrender, on honourable terms of capitulation. During the siege the Irish fought gallantly, and repulsed the English several times, but on 23rd Sept. 1691, an amicable intercourse was opened between the two contending parties. The treaty was signed (Oct. 3rd, 1691) on the stone which is now erected on a pedestal at the western end of Thomond bridge. William III, broke faith after ratifying the agreement, totally disregarding it, hence Limerick has been called the "City of the Violated Treaty." In 1703 an Act was passed excluding Roman Catholic strangers from residing in the city, and requiring from the permanent inhabitants of that persuasion sureties for their allegiance under pain of expulsion; but in the year 1724 these illiberal and arbitrary restrictions were removed. In 1760 Limerick was declared to be no longer a fortress, and the dismantling of its walls and other defences was then commenced and proceeded with, as the extension of the various improvements rendered the removal of old buildings necessary. On the breaking out of the American war (1812), the loyalty of this city and district was manifested by the alacrity with which the volunteer corps were embodied under the names of the "Limerick Union," the "Loyal Limerick Volunteers," and the "Limerick Volunteers." After the termination of the contest with America, the improvements in and extension of the city were renewed with energy, unretarded by the occasional alarms of insurrection, which distracted some of the neighbouring districts. In 1803 a design was formed by those engaged in Emmett's conspiracy to take the city by surprise, and with so much secrecy was the plan conducted that it was unknown to the military commandant until the evening preceding the day of intended attack, when measures were taken to frustrate the design. The most correct idea of this city, as to its scale when inclosed with walls and fortifications, may be formed by a comparison of its then contracted state with its present extent and population. Portions of the old wall are still in existence, the most interesting remains lying between Lock quay and St. John's Hospital. The ground near the latter building formed the Black Battery, between which and St. John's gate, the breach was effected by the Williamite army. The wall here is 36 feet thick. Limerick is the centre of the Waterford and Limerick Railway system, the main line from Waterford entering the city from the south-east and continuing to the northwards, the Newcastle, Kerry, Foynes, Tralee and Fenit branch runs in a south-westerly direction, and to the north-east is a branch to Killaloe. By a junction on the main line at Ennis communication is made with the West Clare railway. The Great Southern and Western Railway have a branch giving access to their system at Charleville, which establishes direct

The river Shannon flows from Lough Derg, and after forming the cataract of Doonas passes through the city of Limerick to the estuary, which is nearly 50 miles in length, and receives the Fergus about 12 miles below the city. The river is crossed by five bridges; the Wellesley Bridge, called after the 1st and only Marquess of Wellesley (created 1799), Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, was commenced in 1821, and opened to the public in 1835; it consists of five large arches, and of a swivel drawbridge on the south side; it is a fine stone structure, and cost about £80,000. It is ornamented by a statue to Viscount FitzGibbon (8th Hussars), only son of 3rd and last Earl of Clare, killed at Balaclava,

in the Crimean war, Oct. 25th, 1854.

The port and harbour of Limerick are at the head of the estuary of the Shannon, and is greatly benefited by the floating dock, constructed at an expense of £50,000. The improvements of the harbour include a graving dock, 438 feet in length, constructed at a cost of nearly £21,000. The quay walls afford extensive facilities for the leading and discharging of vessels of light tonnage. The Limerick Harbour Commissioners have the control and regulation of the harbour, and have much improved the port. 'The Commissioners are entitled by their Act to levy tolls on all shipping frequenting the port, likewise on all imports and exports, and from these and other sources they realise a bandsome yearly revenue. The imports are very large and various, consisting principally of timber, coal, grain, salt, tobacco &c. The shipping that entered and cleared in the port of Limerick in 1892 was as follows: -Entered, British, 45 sailing and steam vessels; tonnage 47,933; cleared, 9 vessels; tonnage, 4,835. Foreign, 17 vessels, 12,759 tons, and cleared, 15 vessels, with 9,203 tons. The United States sent the largest number, 26 ships having entered from that country. In the coasting trade 237 sailing vessels with cargoes entered, of 31,143 tons, of which 234 traded with Great Britain; while 148 ships cleared, with 17,109 tons, 126 being for British ports. Steam vessels numbered 179, with tonnage of 61,726, of which 166 came from Great Britain; 120 cleared, with 49,490 tons, of which 89 were for ports in Great Britain. The number of ships registered at this port under the "Merchant Shipping Act" was 22, with a tonnage of 1,145. The number of boats engaged in fisheries, and registered under the "Sea Fisheries Act, 1868," belonging to Limerick, were in 1892, 202, employing 615 men and boys. Fishing boats and their implements are distinguished by the letter L. A large salmon and eel weir at Corbally, about a mile from Limerick, with a several fishery extending for six miles westward, is owned by the Shannon Fishing Company Limited. The charter for this fishery dates from the reign of King John. Sir Richard Martin bart. is chairman. About a mile distant from the city the vessels anchor in the Pool, from which is a most delightful view. On one side is the new town, with the gardens of the Bishop's palace close to the river, and on the other side a number of villas belonging to the wealthy

citizens, and a full front view of the city, the whole forming | an interesting panoramic picture. The domestic trade of Limerick is very extensive; the shops are handsome and their stocks comprise articles of fashion, necessity and luxury. The linen and woollen manufacture, once a staple branch of trade, disappeared some years ago, and the manufacture of lace and gloves, for which Limerick was at one time famous, has been succeeded by other industries. Chief amongst these is bacon curing, which is very extensive and involves the employment of capital to the extent of nearly f, 1,000,000 sterling. In the factories erected for the purpose are to be found the most improved appliances. In addition to bacon a considerable export trade is carried on in butter and eggs, also butterine (a product recently introduced as a substitute for butter), the latter being manufactured here. There is an immense clothing factory, erected by Sir Peter Tait, and capable of giving employment to 3,000 or more operatives; at present it is used for the manufacture of army clothing, and employs upwards of 1,000 hands. Other industries of Limerick comprise the manufacture of flour, tobacco &c.; there are also extensive tan yards and a distillery. The Bank of Ireland, the Provincial Bank of Ireland, the National Bank and the Munster and Leinster Bank have each a branch here. The hotels, of which there are many, are of the first grade. Four newspapers are published—the "Limerick Chronicle," on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday; the "Limerick Reporter," on Tuesday and Friday; the "Munster News," on Wednesday and Saturday, and the "Limerick Leader," Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

The corporation of Limerick existed both by prescription and charter. The city received privileges, franchises and charters from the early date of 1199, when John, Earl of Morton, Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, granted it various rights and "free customs" down to the reign of James II. The provisions in the charter conferred by that monarch remained in force until the Act of the 4th of George IV., called the "Limerick Regulation Act," partially remodelled the powers of the corporation. The corporate body, styled the "Mayor, Sheriffs and Citizens of Limerick," consists of ten aldermen and thirty councillors, elected from out of the eight wards into which the city is divided. The mayor holds a court of conscience for adjudicating claims under 40s. The assizes for the county and county of the city are held twice a year by the judges for the Munster circuit; the court of quarter sessions is held before the mayor and other justices; petty sessions twice a week, before the mayor and some of the civic magistrates, and a police court daily. The assistant barrister for the county sits four times a year for the trial of civil bill cases. The city returned two members to the Irish Parliament up to the Union and subsequently to the Imperial Parliament, until by the "Redistribution of Seats Act, 1885," the number was reduced to one. The parliamentary borough is more extensive than the municipal. There are two members for the county, one for the Eastern division and one for the Western division.

The Limerick Gas Company's property was purchased by the Corporation in 1879, and the Gas Committee of the Borough now consists of five members. Two are elected by the consumers, two by the Corporation, and the Mayor.

The public structures, for the most part, are commodious, and some elegant and ornamental. The Custom House is a fine building of hewn stone, its front embellished with fluted pilasters and capitals, and on each side is a piazza. The Court House is also a spacious building, with a portico in front. The Town Hall, in Rutland street, contains the council chamber of the City Corporation, the Mayor's and Treasurer's offices. The Chamber of Commerce, in George street, formed in the year 1808, and incorporated by royal charter in 1815, " for the promotion and protection of the trade of Limerick," contains the newsrooms and library, and the board room of the Harbour Commissioners and Market Trustees; this institution comprises among its members the principal merchants of the city. The Limerick Institution, George street, is supported chiefly by professional men, and possesses a reading room and splendid library. The Limerick Athenæum, Upper Cecil street, was erected chiefly with the intention of developing literature, science and art, and besides it has a lecture hall capable of accommodating nearly 500 persons; within the institution also is the Government School of Design in connection with South Kensington. The Free Library Act was adopted in 1891, and a large private house in Lower Glentworth street, opened in 1893, has been fitted up for the purpose of a free public library and reading room, at a cost of £600, all the books being removed from the Athenæum. The Protestant Lord Bishop's palace is situated in Henry street, and that of the Catholic Lord Bishop in Corbally. There is a Theatre in Henry street. The Gaol, in Mulgrave street, and appropriated for males only, consists of a large centre, containing the governor's apartments, a dispensary, a chapel, and five detached prisons, each communicating with the chapel on the second floor by ornamental cast-iron by Mrs. Villiers, of Limerick.

bridges; belonging to each compartment of the prison are two fine airy yards, overlooked from the centre building. The gaol for females is in Merchants' quay. The County Infirmary, in Mulgrave street, is a spacious structure. Barrington's Hospital, at Saint George's quay, a highly ornamental building, and cost £10,000, was founded by Sir Joseph Barrington and his sons in 1829, was opened for patients in 1831, and is the only general hospital in the city. There are barracks for cavalry, artillery and infantry, all commodious and in airy situations. The city is the head quarters of the Limerick military district and of the constabulary force. The Limerick Militia Artillery and

County Militia have also separate barracks. The Protestant see of Limerick in the province of Dublin is stated to have been founded in the 7th century by St. Munchin, but the bishops can be definitely traced from 1140; in 1667 the united diocese of Ardfert and Aghadoe was annexed to it. The cathedral church of St. Mary, originally built between 1142 and 1180, and added to in the 13th century, was considerably altered in the 14th and 15th centuries, but still retains its cruciform plan, and consists of choir, transepts, nave of three bays with wide aisles, south porch and a lofty embattled western tower with tall square pinnacles at the angles, finished with stepped battlements, the total height being 120 feet. The building was repaired in 1759, at a cost of £1,327, when the choir was enlarged and its arches glazed and fittings of classic character introduced. In 1860 the cathedral was restored, the choir new-roofed, a new east window inserted and the floors re-laid, under the direction of Mr. Slater, architect, of London, and in 1860 further repairs and alterations were effected; the total length of the fabric is about 170, and the width through the transepts 90 feet. The choi. contains twenty stalls on each side, several of which, with their misereres, date from the 15th century; canopies were added to the stalls at the restoration of 1860; the bishop's throne, erected in 1831, from designs by Mr. James Paine, stands at the east end of the range of stalls on the south side, and beyond it is a canopied seat occupied officially by the Earl of Limerick K.P. as Prior of St. Mary's; the north transept serves as an organ chamber, the south transept has five graduated lancet lights within a stepped gable, the aisles are embattled, and the south aisle projects beyond the transept and has some Perpendicular windows. St. Munchin's church was rebuilt in 1827 at a cost of £1,460; it is a handsome structure with lofty towers, embattled and pinnacled. Trinity church, Catherine street, was opened in 1834.

The Catholic diocese of Limerick includes Limerick and a small portion of Clare. St. John's, the Catholic cathedral, is a large building, erected in 1856 in the style of the architecture of the 13th century, and consists of chancel, nave, north and south aisles and transepts. St. Mary's Catholic church, Athlunkard street, was erected in 1749. St. Michael's Catholic church, originally standing in Mardyke. was destroyed in the siege of 1691, rebuilt in Denmark street, and entirely rebuilt on this site and remodelled in 1882. The Dominican convent and chapel is a handsome building in the Gothic style, and was erected by the exertions of the Rev. Joseph Harrigan, then prior, in the year The Augustinian chapel, George street, once a theatre, is elegantly embellished and a fine scriptural painting adorns the altar; it is also furnished with a good organ.

The Wesleyan chapel, George street, was erected in 1812, and that in Bedford row, built 1821. A new chapel for the Baptists has been built on the Military road.

There are now four schools in Limerick in connection with the Christian Brothers, a new one having recently been added, where the orphan boys are taught different trades. Limerick District Model school, Military road, was built in 1853 and is under the management of the Conservators of National Education. Learny's Free schools, Hartstonge street, founded by William Learny esq. in 1814, who left £13,300 for the education of the children of the poor in Ireland, especially those in the neighbourhood of Limerick city. A sum of £3,940 was expended on the schools and site.

The charitable institutions in Limerick are numerous, particularly in the medical and surgical departments. The Infirmary, Fever Hospital, the Magdalen and Lunatic Asylums, and the Home of Industry for Boys, conducted by the Christian Brothers and supported chiefly by voluntary contributions, are prominent features of benevolence. The Barrington Hospital was founded in 1829 by Sir Joseph Barrington bart. whose family expended £10,000 on it. The Nash Home, Richmond terrace, was founded in 1890 for the purpose of finding a home for ladies in reduced circumstances, by a legacy from Mrs. Nash, of Limerick. The Villiers Almshouses, The Island, were founded and endowed by Mrs. Villiers of Limerick.

There is a privilege annexed to the August fair-namely, that no person can be arrested within the precincts of the liberties, on any process issuing out of the tholsel court of Limerick, for the space of fifteen days.
