

LIMERICK.

LIMERICK is a city, municipal and parliamentary borough, the seat of an episcopal see, and a considerable commercial port and railway centre, 120 miles south-west from Dublin, 77 north-west from Waterford, 61 north from Cork, 51 north-east from Tralee, 53 east from Kilrush and 75 east from Dunmore Head, an extreme apex of Clare county, protruding into the Atlantic Ocean. This ancient city, delightfully situated on the eastern bank of the Shannon, is supposed to have been founded by Yuorus, in the year 155, while, by some writers, it is said to have been the "Regia" of Ptolemy. It was called "Rosse-de-Nailleagh" in the Annals of Multifernan, and is believed to have been the place described under the name of "Luimneach," which name is supposed to have been modified to its present designation. St. Patrick is said to have visited it about the middle of the 5th century; but the first authentic records of Limerick notice it as a Danish settlement; by that people it was first plundered in 812. The Danes of Limerick did not embrace Christianity until the 11th century, and in the following they elected their first bishop. Before this period, however, it was a place of commerce, and was much frequented by foreign merchants. The English took possession of Limerick in the year 1174; and as a proof of the early importance of the city, in the 9th year of the reign of King Richard I. (1197), he granted a charter to the citizens to elect a mayor, which honour was not obtained by the citizens of London till 10 years after that period; nor had Dublin and Cork a mayor till the 13th century. The city was originally walled, and deemed the strongest fortress in this kingdom, having the advantage of not being commanded by adjacent heights, and it has sustained some memorable sieges. In the year 1690 King William III. brought his forces against it, but withdrew them without accomplishing its reduction; in the following year it was again invested by General Ginckel, who, after an obstinate resistance, compelled the garrison to surrender on honourable terms of capitulation. During the siege the Irish fought gallantly, and repulsed the English several times, but on 23rd Sept. 1691, an amicable intercourse was opened between the two contending parties. The treaty was signed (Oct. 3rd, 1691) on the stone which is now erected on a pedestal at the western end of Thomond bridge. William III. broke faith after ratifying the agreement, totally disregarding it, hence Limerick has been called the "City of the Violated Treaty." In 1703 an Act was passed excluding Roman Catholic strangers from residing in the city, and requiring from the permanent inhabitants of that persuasion sureties for their allegiance under pain of expulsion; but in the year 1724 these illiberal and arbitrary restrictions were removed. In 1760 Limerick was declared to be no longer a fortress, and the dismantling of its walls and other defences was then commenced and proceeded with, as the extension of the various improvements rendered the removal of old buildings necessary. On the breaking out of the American war in 1812, the loyalty of this city and district was manifested by the alacrity with which the volunteer corps were embodied under the names of the "Limerick Union," the "Loyal Limerick Volunteers," and the "Limerick Volunteers." After the termination of the contest with America, the improvements in and extension of the city were renewed with energy, unretarded by the occasional alarms of insurrection, which distracted some of the neighbouring districts. In 1803 a design was formed by those engaged in Emmett's conspiracy to take the city by surprise, and with so much secrecy was the plan conducted that it was unknown to the military commandant until the evening preceding the day of intended attack, when measures were taken to frustrate the design. Portions of the old wall are still in existence, the most interesting remains lying between Lock quay and St. John's Hospital. The ground near the latter building formed the Black Battery, between which and St. John's gate, a breach was

effected by the army of William III. The wall here is 36 feet thick. This city is now composed of three parts, named the Irish Town, English Town (the latter on an island formed by the river Shannon), and Newtown-Pery, which latter may with propriety be termed the court end, as in this quarter of the town the streets are spacious, uniform and elegant, intersecting each other at right angles, and the houses of modern architecture. This portion of the city takes its name from, and was erected by the exertions of the Right Hon. Edmund Sexton Pery, Speaker of the Irish House of Commons, created in 1785 Viscount Pery of Newtown-Pery, and who died in 1806, when the title expired. It is the fashionable as well as favourite residence of the opulent.

Lord Emly of Tervoe, Limerick, is lord of the manor. Limerick is an important junction on the Great Southern and Western railway, the main line from Waterford entering the city from the south-east and continuing to the northwards, the Foynes and Tralee branch running in a south-westerly direction, while to the north-east is a branch to Killaloe. By a junction on the main line at Ennis communication is made with the West Clare railway. The city has also, via Charleville junction, direct communication with the city of Cork.

The river Shannon flows from Lough Derg, and after forming the cataract of Doonas passes through the city of Limerick to the estuary, which is nearly 50 miles in length, and receives the Fergus about 12 miles below the city. The river is crossed by two principal and several minor bridges; the Wellesley or Sarsfield bridge, called after Richard, 1st and only Marquess of Wellesley K.G., K.P. and sometime Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, was commenced in 1821, and opened to the public in 1835, at a cost of about £80,000; it consists of five large elliptical arches, and of a swivel drawbridge on the south side; at the eastern end is a statue of Viscount FitzGibbon (8th Hussars), only son of 3rd and last Earl of Clare, killed at Balaclava, during the Crimean war, Oct. 25th, 1854. Thomond bridge, which connects King's Island or English Town with the suburb lying in co. Clare, was rebuilt in 1839, and is 500 feet in length; at its western end, on a moulded pedestal raised on four steps, is the famous Treaty Stone, on which, on 3 Oct. 1691, a treaty was signed, by which the freedom of the Catholic religion was secured and various forms of relief granted, but the treaty was annulled by the Irish Parliament in 1695. On the Abbey river, an arm of the Shannon surrounding King's Island, is Mathew bridge (named after the celebrated apostle of temperance, Father Mathew). Balls bridge and Park bridge.

The port and harbour of Limerick are at the head of the estuary of the Shannon, and have a floating dock, constructed at an expense of £50,000, and a graving dock, 438 feet in length, constructed at a cost of nearly £21,000. The quay walls afford extensive facilities for the loading and discharging of vessels of light tonnage. The Limerick Harbour Commissioners have the control and regulation of the harbour, and are entitled by their Act to levy tolls on all shipping frequenting the port, as well as on all imports and exports, and from these and other sources they realise a handsome yearly revenue. The imports consist principally of timber, coal, grain, salt, sugar &c. The value of the principal articles imported in 1904 was: wheat, £485,034; maize, £249,252; sugar, £132,783; total value of all imports, £935,974. The shipping that entered and cleared in the port of Limerick in 1904 was as follows:—Entered with cargoes and in ballast, British Possessions, 15 sailing and steam vessels; tonnage, 4,537; cleared, 8 vessels; tonnage, 7,378. Foreign, 51 vessels, 53,471 tons and cleared 11 vessels, with 8,318 tons. In the general coasting trade 96 sailing and steam vessels entered with cargoes and in ballast of 11,503 tons, and 133 cleared of 23,089 tonnage. In the intercourse between Great Britain and Ireland, 438 vessels entered of

100,003 tons, and 440 cleared of 145,331 tonnage. The number of ships registered as belonging to this port on December 31, 1904, under the "Merchant Shipping Act," was 23, with a tonnage of 1,741. The number of boats engaged in fisheries, and registered under part IV. of the "Merchant Shipping Act," was at the same date 160, requiring 437 men and boys to work them. Fishing boats and their implements are distinguished by the letter "L."

About a mile distant from the city and below Sarsfield bridge is the Pool, where vessels anchor, and from which a most delightful view is afforded. On one side is the New Town, with its quays and the Bishop's palace, with its gardens close to the river, and on the other side a number of villas belonging to the wealthy citizens; from this point a full view of the city is obtained, the whole forming an interesting panoramic picture. The domestic trade of Limerick is very extensive. The linen and woollen manufacture, once a staple branch of trade, disappeared some years ago, and the manufacture of lace and gloves, for which Limerick was at one time famous, has been succeeded by other industries, but lace making is still pursued at the Convent, in Clare street. Chief amongst these is bacon curing, which is largely carried on, and the factories erected for the purpose are extensive and well equipped. A considerable export trade is also carried on in butter and eggs, and butterine is manufactured here. The army clothing factory, erected by Sir Peter Tait, who died in 1890, furnishes employment to upwards of 1,000 hands. Other industries of Limerick comprise the manufacture of condensed milk, flour, tobacco &c.; there are also extensive tan yards and a distillery.

The city is lighted with gas from works purchased by the Corporation in 1879, from the local gas company, and the supply is now controlled by a mixed representative committee of five members. The water works are also the property of the Corporation.

The Corporation of Limerick existed both by prescription and charter. The city received privileges, franchises and charters from the early date of 1195, when John Stafford was made its first provost; the first mayor being Adam Servant, in 1198. The provisions in the charter conferred by James II. remained in force until the Act of the 4th of George IV. (1823-4), called the "Limerick Regulation Act," partially remodelled the powers of the Corporation. The "Municipal Reform Act" became law in Limerick 9 Nov. 1841. The present corporate body, styled the "Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of Limerick," consists of eight aldermen and 32 councillors, elected from out of the eight wards into which the city is divided. The mayor holds a court of conscience weekly, for adjudicating claims of 36s. 10d. or under. The assizes for the county and county of the city are held twice a year by the judges of the High Court of Justice in Ireland; the court of quarter sessions is held before the county court judge and chairman of quarter sessions, the mayor and other justices; petty sessions once a week, before the mayor and some of the civic magistrates, and a police court daily. The county court judge for the county sits four times a year for the trial of civil bill cases. The city returned two members to the Irish Parliament up to the date of the Union in 1800, and subsequently the same number to the Imperial Parliament, until by the "Redistribution of Seats Act, 1885," the number was reduced to one. The parliamentary borough is, however, more extensive than the municipal.

The Town Hall, in Rutland street, contains the council chamber of the City Corporation and the Mayor's, Town Clerk's and Treasurer's offices.

The Court House, near Merchants' quay, was erected in 1810.

The municipal insignia include four maces, a state sword, and a mayoral chain of very remarkable character. The maces are similar in size, design and workmanship: they are all 34 inches long, and their shafts are chased with spiral foliage; each has two knobs and a graceful base knob, on which are the names of the mayor and sheriffs for 1739; at the top of each shaft, instead of the usual scrolled brackets, there are four rampant lions, facing outwards, each resting one leg on the upper knob, and their heads touching the heads of the maces; these are of the usual ball cup shape, and are encircled with a garland of foliage and flowers, partly disposed in four pendants forming arches, under which appear the city arms—a double-towered gateway—a rose and thistle on one stem, a harp and a fleur-de-lis; above the foliage is a narrow beaded circlet, and on the flat top are the royal arms of George II. The sword, given by Queen Elizabeth in 1575, is 44 inches long; the guard of iron-gilt is 15½ inches across, and the ends curve up towards the

blade; the grip is eight inches long and is covered with green velvet, secured with gilt wire; the pommel is a round flat disc, attached by the edge. The mayor's chain consists of 50 gold roundels or flat rings, varying in size; from 1822 up to 1841 these were linked into each other, but after that date they were joined together in pairs by double links; on each ring or roundel is engraved the name of a mayor and his year of office.

The see of Limerick in the province of Dublin is stated to have been founded in the 6th century by St. Munchin, but the bishops can only be definitely traced from 1140, when Gillebert was appointed; in 1667 the united diocese of Ardferd and Aghadoe was annexed to it. The cathedral church of St. Mary, originally built between 1142 and 1180, and added to in the 13th century, was considerably altered in the 14th and 15th centuries, but still retains its cruciform plan, and consists of choir, transepts, clerestoried nave of three bays with wide aisles, south porch and a lofty embattled western tower with tall square pinnacles at the angles, finished with stepped battlements, the total height being 120 feet: the tower contains a peal of 6 bells, originally cast in 1673, but some were recast in 1829 and 1859. The building was repaired in 1759, at a cost of £1,327, when the choir was enlarged and its arches glazed and fittings of classic character introduced. In 1860 the cathedral was restored, the choir new-roofed, a new east window inserted and the floors re-laid, under the direction of Mr. Slater, architect, of London, and in 1869 further repairs and alterations were effected: the total length of the fabric is about 170, and the width through the transepts 90 feet. The choir, continued beyond the transepts, contains 20 stalls on each side, several of which, with their misereres, date from the 15th century: canopies were added to the stalls at the restoration of 1860: the bishop's throne, erected in 1831, from designs by Mr. James Paine, stands at the east end of the range of stalls on the south side, and beyond it is a canopied seat occupied officially by the Earl of Limerick as Prior of St. Mary's: the north transept serves as an organ chamber, the south transept has five graduated lancet lights within a stepped gable, the aisles are embattled and sub-divided, so as to form chapels, one of which, on the south side, has some good stained glass, and contains the tombs of the Earls of Limerick: the south aisle projects beyond the transept and has some Perpendicular windows: in the south transept is a fine monument to the Gallwey family, dated 1416, and on the north side of the sacarium is a large altar tomb, with columns supporting a canopy, and recumbent effigies, disposed in two tiers, to Donogh O'Brien, 4th Earl of Thomond, d. 5 Sept. 1624, and Elizabeth (Fitzgerald), his wife, dau. of Gerald, Earl of Kildare, d. 12 Jan. 1617: among the numerous other memorials are those of Donat O'Brien, bishop 1207-17, and Cornelius O'Dea, bishop 1400-26. The registers, numbering nine volumes, date from 1726, and are kept here under a retention order.

Opposite the cathedral is the statue of the celebrated General Patrick Sarsfield, Earl of Lucan, who compelled William III. to sign the treaty of Limerick; the figure, which stands on a high pedestal, represents him sword in hand, leading on his troops.

The Bishop's Palace is in Henry street, and the grounds stretch down to O'Neill's quay, on the east bank of the river.

St. Munchin's church, King's Island, founded in the 7th century, and rebuilt in 1827 at a cost of £1,460, is a plain structure, and has an embattled tower with pinnacles; this church was the burial place of many ancient Limerick families, and will seat 300 persons. Trinity church, Catherine street, was opened in 1834, and will seat 800. St. John the Baptist's, in St. John's square, affords 400 sittings, and St. Michael's, in Pery square, 750.

The Catholic diocese of Limerick includes Limerick and a small portion of Clare. St. John's, the Catholic cathedral, erected in 1856-60, at a cost of about £20,000, is an edifice in the Gothic style of the 13th century, and consists of chancel, nave, aisles and transepts, and a tower with spire 300 feet in height. The bishop resides at Corbally. St. Mary's Catholic church, Athlunkard street, was erected in 1749. St. Michael's Catholic church, originally standing in Mardyke, was destroyed in the siege of 1691, but rebuilt in Denmark street, and entirely rebuilt on this site and remodelled in 1882. St. Joseph's church, in Quinlan street, which is attached to St. Michael's, was completed in 1904. The church of the Dominican convent, erected in 1815, and re-decorated in 1905, is a building in the Gothic style. The Redemptorist monastery (Mount St. Alphonsus), was founded in 1853, and the present building erected 1856-58; the church, built in 1858-62, from designs by

Mr. Philip C. Hardwick, is an edifice in the First-Pointed style of the 12th or 13th century, and consists of apsidal chancel, double transepts with side chapels, nave with aisles and a tower with spire, added during 1876-78, and containing a peal of bells; the total cost of monastery and church, including the site, was upwards of £23,000. The Augustinian church, in George street, once a theatre, was consecrated in 1823, and is elegantly embellished and a fine scriptural painting adorns the altar.

The Franciscan church, in Henry street, is a fine building, with massive columns at the main entrance.

The Wesleyan chapel, George street, was erected in 1810. There is a Baptist chapel on the Military road; a Presbyterian church, in Lower Mallow street, built in 1902; a Gospel Hall, in Upper Mallow street, and a meeting house, in Upper Cecil street, for the Society of Friends.

The Limerick Athenæum, Upper Cecil street, was erected chiefly with the intention of developing literature, science and art, and has a lecture hall capable of accommodating nearly 620 persons; the classes of the Municipal School of Science and Art are held in this building. The "Free Library Act" was adopted in 1891, and a large private house in Lower Glentworth street was fitted up for the purpose of a free public library and reading room, at a cost of £600, and opened in 1893; a new building, the gift of Andrew Carnegie esq. LL.D. of Skibo Castle, N.B. is now (1905) in course of erection in Pery street.

The Limerick Institution, George street, is supported chiefly by professional men and merchants, and possesses a reading room and a splendid library.

The Chamber of Commerce, in George street, formed in the year 1808, and incorporated by royal charter in 1815, "for the promotion and protection of the trade of Limerick," contains news rooms and a library, a board room for the use of the Harbour Commissioners and Market Trustees, and an office for the secretary and collector of the harbour; this institution comprises among its members the principal merchants of the city.

The Custom House is a fine building of hewn stone, embellished in front with fluted pilasters and capitals, and on each side is a piazza. The amount of customs revenue collected in 1904 was £143,210.

There is a theatre in Henry street.

The County Infirmary, in Mulgrave street, was opened in 1811, at a cost of £7,000.

Barrington's Hospital, at George's quay, was founded by Sir Joseph Barrington bart. of Limerick, and his sons in 1829; it cost £10,000, and was opened for patients in 1831.

The City Dispensary is in Lower Gerald Griffin street, and serves four districts.

The District Lunatic Asylum, in Mulgrave street, was erected in 1826 at a cost of £30,000.

St. John's Fever and General Hospital is in St. John's gate; the Lying-in Hospital in Bedford row, and the Asylum for Blind Females in Catherine street, and there are several orphanages and a reformatory, conducted by the Catholic sisterhoods.

The Nash Home, Richmond terrace, was founded in 1890, by a bequest of Mr. John Nash, of Limerick, for ladies in reduced circumstances, who must be natives of co. Limerick. The Villiers Almshouses, The Island, were founded and endowed by Mrs. Villiers, of Limerick, for widows. The Corporation Almshouses, in Nicholas street, and Dr. Hall's Almshouses, in the same, are both for widows.

The Bank of Ireland Limited, the Provincial Bank of Ireland, the National Bank Limited, the Munster and Leinster Bank Limited, and the Ulster Bank Limited have each a branch here.

There are two good hotels, and some smaller ones.

Four newspapers are published—the "Limerick Chronicle," on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday; the "Munster News," on Monday, Wednesday and Saturday; the "Limerick Leader," Monday, Wednesday and Friday, and the "Limerick Echo," Tuesday and Friday.

There are now four schools in Limerick in connection with the Christian Brothers, where orphan boys are taught different trades. Limerick District Model school, Military road, was built in 1853, and is under the management of the Commissioners of National Education. Leamy's Free schools, Hartstonge street, were founded in 1814, at a cost, including site, of £3,940, from a bequest by William Leamy esq. who left £13,300 for the education of the children of the poor in Ireland, especially those in the neighbourhood of Limerick city; the schools will hold 600 children; average attendance, 400.

H.M. Prison, in Mulgrave street, for males only, consists of a large central block, containing the governor's apartments, a dispensary and a chapel; there are four blocks of buildings assigned to prisoners, and the airing yard is overlooked from the centre building. H.M. Prison for females is in Merchants' quay.

There are barracks for cavalry, artillery and infantry, all commodious and in airy situations. The city forms part of the Cork District of the Irish Military Command. The Limerick City Royal Garrison Artillery (Militia) and the 5th Battalion Royal Munster Fusiliers (Militia) have also separate barracks. The South of Ireland Imperial Yeomanry have also head quarters in the city.

Limerick is the head quarters of the county constabulary.

The market places are very extensive and are situated in different parts of the city, the principal being the New Market, near Garryowen, which are not now surpassed for extent, general adaptability and style of construction in Ireland. The markets are held on Wednesday and Saturday, and are abundantly supplied with all the necessities of life at remarkably reasonable prices. Fairs:—Tuesday in Easter week, July 4th, August 4th and December 12th. The great Munster fairs are held the last Thursday and Friday in January, April, July and October, on Thursday, horses and pigs, and on Friday cattle and sheep, and at the monthly fairs, pigs first Tuesday, cattle first Thursday. There is a privilege annexed to the August fair—namely, that no person can be arrested within the precincts of the liberties, on any process issuing out of the tholsel court of Limerick, for the space of 15 days.

The district around Limerick is agricultural. The land is flat and very fertile, but there is an abundance of beautiful scenery in the vicinity of the Clare and Killaloe hills, which are not far distant. The soil is limestone and sandy. A large salmon and eel weir at Corbally, about a mile from Limerick, with a several fishery extending for 6 miles westward, is owned by the Shannon Fishing Company Limited.

People's Park.—The late Earl of Limerick K.P. presented to the Corporation, in 1875, land of about 10 acres for a park, in memory of the late Richard Russell esq. of Limerick; it has been laid out, and contains a monument erected to the Right Hon. Thomas Spring Rice, 1st Lord Monteagle.

New Park.—A portion of the grounds adjoining the Custom House has been granted by the Board of Works to the Corporation, at a nominal rent, to be used as a park or recreation ground for the citizens.

The Green Park Racecourse, of 143 acres, has been purchased by the Limerick Racecourse Co. Limited. It is situated about a mile south-west of the city, and has two spacious stands erected, capable of accommodating 3,600 people. There is a directorate of management of 16 members; J. O'G. Delmege esq. J.P., D.L. chairman.

The area of the city and municipal borough is 2,108 acres; the population in 1901 was 38,151, divided as follows:—

In 1760 Limerick was declared to be no longer a fortress, and the dismantling of its walls and other defences was then commenced and proceeded with, as the extension of the various improvements rendered the removal of old buildings necessary. On the breaking out of the American war in 1812, the loyalty of this city and district was manifested by the alacrity with which the volunteer corps were embodied under the names of the "Limerick Union," the "Loyal Limerick Volunteers," and the "Limerick Volunteers." After the termination of the contest with America, the improvements in and extension of the city were renewed with energy, unretarded by the occasional alarms of insurrection, which distracted some of the neighbouring districts. In 1803 a design was formed by those engaged in Emmett's conspiracy to take the city by surprise, and with so much secrecy was the plan conducted that it was unknown to the military commandant until the evening preceding the day of intended attack, when measures were taken to frustrate the design. Portions of the old wall are still in existence, the most interesting remains lying between Lock quay and St. John's Hospital. The ground near the latter building formed the Black Battery, between which and St. John's gate, a breach was

effected by the army of William III. The wall here is 36 feet thick. This city is now composed of three parts, named the Irish Town, English Town (the latter on an island formed by the river Shannon), and Newtown-Pery, which latter may with propriety be termed the court end, as in this quarter of the town the streets are spacious, uniform and elegant, intersecting each other at right angles, and the houses of modern architecture. This portion of the city takes its name from, and was erected by the exertions of the Right Hon. Edmund Sexton Pery, Speaker of the Irish House of Commons, created in 1785 Viscount Pery of Newtown-Pery, and who died in 1806, when the title expired. It is the fashionable as well as favourite residence of the opulent.

Lord Emly of Tervoe, Limerick, is lord of the manor. Limerick is an important junction on the Great Southern and Western railway, the main line from Waterford entering the city from the south-east and continuing to the northwards, the Foynes and Tralee branch running in a south-westerly direction, while to the north-east is a branch to Killaloe. By a junction on the main line at Ennis communication is made with the West Clare railway. The city has also, via Charleville junction, direct communication with the city of Cork.

The river Shannon flows from Lough Derg, and after forming the cataract of Doonas passes through the city of Limerick to the estuary, which is nearly 50 miles in length, and receives the Fergus about 12 miles below the city. The river is crossed by two principal and several minor bridges; the Wellesley or Sarsfield bridge, called after Richard, 1st and only Marquess of Wellesley K.G., K.P. and sometime Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, was commenced in 1821, and opened to the public in 1835, at a cost of about £80,000; it consists of five large elliptical arches, and of a swivel drawbridge on the south side; at the eastern end is a statue of Viscount FitzGibbon (8th Hussars), only son of 3rd and last Earl of Clare, killed at Balaklava, during the Crimean war, Oct. 25th, 1854. Thomond bridge, which connects King's Island or English Town with the suburb lying in co. Clare, was rebuilt in 1839, and is 500 feet in length; at its western end, on a moulded pedestal raised on four steps, is the famous Treaty Stone, on which, on 3 Oct. 1691, a treaty was signed, by which the freedom of the Catholic religion was secured and various forms of relief granted, but the treaty was annulled by the Irish Parliament in 1695. On the Abbey river, an arm of the Shannon surrounding King's Island, is Mathew bridge (named after the celebrated apostle of temperance, Father Mathew), Balls bridge and Park bridge.

The port and harbour of Limerick are at the head of the estuary of the Shannon, and have a floating dock, constructed at an expense of £50,000, and a graving dock, 438 feet in length, constructed at a cost of nearly £21,000. The quay walls afford extensive facilities for the loading and discharging of vessels of light tonnage. The Limerick Harbour Commissioners have the control and regulation of the harbour, and are entitled by their Act to levy tolls on all shipping frequenting the port, as well as on all imports and exports, and from these and other sources they realise a handsome yearly revenue. The imports consist principally of timber, coal, grain, salt, sugar &c. The value of the principal articles imported in 1904 was: wheat, £485,034; maize, £249,252; sugar, £132,783; total value of all imports, £935,974. The shipping that entered and cleared in the port of Limerick in 1904 was as follows:—Entered with cargoes and in ballast, British Possessions, 15 sailing and steam vessels; tonnage, 4,537; cleared, 8 vessels; tonnage, 7,378. Foreign, 51 vessels, 53,471 tons and cleared 11 vessels, with 8,318 tons. In the general coasting trade 96 sailing and steam vessels entered with cargoes and in ballast of 11,503 tons, and 133 cleared of 23,089 tonnage. In the intercourse between Great Britain and Ireland, 438 vessels entered of

100,003 tons, and 440 cleared of 145,331 tonnage. The number of ships registered as belonging to this port on December 31, 1904, under the "Merchant Shipping Act," was 23, with a tonnage of 1,741. The number of boats engaged in fisheries, and registered under part IV. of the "Merchant Shipping Act," was at the same date 160, requiring 437 men and boys to work them. Fishing boats and their implements are distinguished by the letter "L."

About a mile distant from the city and below Sarsfield bridge is the Pool, where vessels anchor, and from which a most delightful view is afforded. On one side is the New Town, with its quays and the Bishop's palace, with its gardens close to the river, and on the other side a number of villas belonging to the wealthy citizens; from this point a full view of the city is obtained, the whole forming an interesting panoramic picture. The domestic trade of Limerick is very extensive. The linen and woollen manufacture, once a staple branch of trade, disappeared some years ago, and the manufacture of lace and gloves, for which Limerick was at one time famous, has been succeeded by other industries, but lace making is still pursued at the Convent, in Clare street. Chief amongst these is bacon curing, which is largely carried on, and the factories erected for the purpose are extensive and well equipped. A considerable export trade is also carried on in butter and eggs, and butterine is manufactured here. The army clothing factory, erected by Sir Peter Tait, who died in 1890, furnishes employment to upwards of 1,000 hands. Other industries of Limerick comprise the manufacture of condensed milk, flour, tobacco &c.; there are also extensive tan yards and a distillery.

The city is lighted with gas from works purchased by the Corporation in 1879, from the local gas company, and the supply is now controlled by a mixed representative committee of five members. The water works are also the property of the Corporation.

The Corporation of Limerick existed both by prescription and charter. The city received privileges, franchises and charters from the early date of 1195, when John Stafford was made its first provost; the first mayor being Adam Servant, in 1198. The provisions in the charter conferred by James II. remained in force until the Act of the 4th of George IV. (1823-4), called the "Limerick Regulation Act," partially remodelled the powers of the Corporation. The "Municipal Reform Act" became law in Limerick 9 Nov. 1841. The present corporate body, styled the "Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of Limerick," consists of eight aldermen and 32 councillors, elected from out of the eight wards into which the city is divided. The mayor holds a court of conscience weekly, for adjudicating claims of 36s. 10d. or under. The assizes for the county and county of the city are held twice a year by the judges of the High Court of Justice in Ireland; the court of quarter sessions is held before the county court judge and chairman of quarter sessions, the mayor and other justices; petty sessions once a week, before the mayor and some of the civic magistrates, and a police court daily. The county court judge for the county sits four times a year for the trial of civil bill cases. The city returned two members to the Irish Parliament up to the date of the Union in 1800, and subsequently the same number to the Imperial Parliament, until by the "Redistribution of Seats Act, 1885," the number was reduced to one. The parliamentary borough is, however, more extensive than the municipal.

The Town Hall, in Rutland street, contains the council chamber of the City Corporation and the Mayor's, Town Clerk's and Treasurer's offices.

The Court House, near Merchants' quay, was erected in 1810.

The municipal insignia include four maces, a state sword, and a mayoral chain of very remarkable character. The maces are similar in size, design and workmanship: they are all 34 inches long, and their shafts are chased with spiral foliage; each has two knops and a graceful base knop, on which are the names of the mayor and sheriffs for 1739; at the top of each shaft, instead of the usual scrolled brackets, there are four rampant lions, facing outwards, each resting one leg on the upper knop, and their heads touching the heads of the maces; these are of the usual ball cup shape, and are encircled with a garland of foliage and flowers, partly disposed in four pendants forming arches, under which appear the city arms—a double-towered gateway—a rose and thistle on one stem, a harp and a fleur-de-lis; above the foliage is a narrow beaded circlet, and on the flat top are the royal arms of George II. The sword, given by Queen Elizabeth in 1575, is 44 inches long; the guard of iron-gilt is 15½ inches across, and the ends curve up towards the

blade; the grip is eight inches long and is covered with green velvet, secured with gilt wire; the pommel is a round flat disc, attached by the edge. The mayor's chain consists of 50 gold roundels or flat rings, varying in size; from 1822 up to 1841 these were linked into each other, but after that date they were joined together in pairs by double links; on each ring or roundel is engraved the name of a mayor and his year of office.

The see of Limerick in the province of Dublin is stated to have been founded in the 6th century by St. Munchin, but the bishops can only be definitely traced from 1140, when Gillebert was appointed; in 1657 the united diocese of Ardferd and Aghadoc was annexed to it. The cathedral church of St. Mary, originally built between 1142 and 1180, and added to in the 13th century, was considerably altered in the 14th and 15th centuries, but still retains its cruciform plan, and consists of choir, transepts, clerestoried nave of three bays with wide aisles, south porch and a lofty embattled western tower with tall square pinnacles at the angles, finished with stepped battlements, the total height being 120 feet: the tower contains a peal of 6 bells, originally cast in 1673, but some were recast in 1829 and 1859. The building was repaired in 1759, at a cost of £1,327, when the choir was enlarged and its arches glazed and fittings of classic character introduced. In 1860 the cathedral was restored, the choir new-roofed, a new east window inserted and the floors re-laid, under the direction of Mr. Slater, architect, of London, and in 1869 further repairs and alterations were effected: the total length of the fabric is about 170, and the width through the transepts 90 feet. The choir, continued beyond the transepts, contains 20 stalls on each side, several of which, with their misereres, date from the 15th century: canopies were added to the stalls at the restoration of 1860: the bishop's throne, erected in 1831, from designs by Mr. James Paine, stands at the east end of the range of stalls on the south side, and beyond it is a canopied seat occupied officially by the Earl of Limerick as Prior of St. Mary's: the north transept serves as an organ chamber, the south transept has five graduated lancet lights within a stepped gable, the aisles are embattled and sub-divided, so as to form chapels, one of which, on the south side, has some good stained glass, and contains the tombs of the Earls of Limerick: the south aisle projects beyond the transept and has some Perpendicular windows: in the south transept is a fine monument to the Gallwey family, dated 1416, and on the north side of the sacarium is a large altar tomb, with columns supporting a canopy, and recumbent effigies, disposed in two tiers, to Donogh O'Brien, 4th Earl of Thomond, d. 5 Sept. 1624, and Elizabeth (Fitzgerald), his wife, dau. of Gerald, Earl of Kildare, d. 12 Jan. 1617: among the numerous other memorials are those of Donat O'Brien, bishop 1207-17, and Cornelius O'Dea, bishop 1400-26. The registers, numbering nine volumes, date from 1726, and are kept here under a retention order.

Opposite the cathedral is the statue of the celebrated General Patrick Sarsfield, Earl of Lucan, who compelled William III. to sign the treaty of Limerick; the figure, which stands on a high pedestal, represents him sword in hand, leading on his troops.

The Bishop's Palace is in Henry street, and the grounds stretch down to O'Neill's quay, on the east bank of the river.

St. Munchin's church, King's Island, founded in the 7th century, and rebuilt in 1827 at a cost of £1,460, is a plain structure, and has an embattled tower with pinnacles; this church was the burial place of many ancient Limerick families, and will seat 300 persons. Trinity church, Catherine street, was opened in 1834 and will seat 800. St. John the Baptist's, in St. John's square, affords 400 sittings, and St. Michael's, in Pery square, 750.

The Catholic diocese of Limerick includes Limerick and a small portion of Clare. St. John's, the Catholic cathedral, erected in 1856-60, at a cost of about £20,000, is an edifice in the Gothic style of the 13th century, and consists of chancel, nave, aisles and transepts, and a tower with spire 300 feet in height. The bishop resides at Corbally. St. Mary's Catholic church, Athlunkard street, was erected in 1749. St. Michael's Catholic church, originally standing in Mardyke, was destroyed in the siege of 1691, but rebuilt in Denmark street, and entirely rebuilt on this site and remodelled in 1882. St. Joseph's church, in Quinlan street, which is attached to St. Michael's, was completed in 1904. The church of the Dominican convent, erected in 1815, and redecorated in 1905, is a building in the Gothic style. The Redemptorist monastery (Mount St. Alphonsus), was founded in 1853, and the present building erected 1856-58; the church, built in 1858-62, from designs by

Mr. Philip C. Hardwick, is an edifice in the First-Pointed style of the 12th or 13th century, and consists of apsidal chancel, double transepts with side chapels, nave with aisles and a tower with spire, added during 1876-78, and containing a peal of bells; the total cost of monastery and church, including the site, was upwards of £23,000. The Augustinian church, in George street, once a theatre, was consecrated in 1823, and is elegantly embellished and a fine scriptural painting adorns the altar.

The Franciscan church, in Henry street, is a fine building, with massive columns at the main entrance.

The Wesleyan chapel, George street, was erected in 1810. There is a Baptist chapel on the Military road; a Presbyterian church, in Lower Mallow street, built in 1902; a Gospel Hall, in Upper Mallow street, and a meeting house, in Upper Cecil street, for the Society of Friends.

The Limerick Athenæum, Upper Cecil street, was erected chiefly with the intention of developing literature, science and art, and has a lecture hall capable of accommodating nearly 620 persons; the classes of the Municipal School of Science and Art are held in this building. The "Free Library Act" was adopted in 1891, and a large private house in Lower Glentworth street was fitted up for the purpose of a free public library and reading room, at a cost of £600, and opened in 1893; a new building, the gift of Andrew Carnegie esq. LL.D. of Skibo Castle, N.B. is now (1905) in course of erection in Pery street.

The Limerick Institution, George street, is supported chiefly by professional men and merchants, and possesses a reading room and a splendid library.

The Chamber of Commerce, in George street, formed in the year 1808, and incorporated by royal charter in 1815, "for the promotion and protection of the trade of Limerick," contains news rooms and a library, a board room for the use of the Harbour Commissioners and Market Trustees, and an office for the secretary and collector of the harbour; this institution comprises among its members the principal merchants of the city.

The Custom House is a fine building of hewn stone, embellished in front with fluted pilasters and capitals, and on each side is a piazza. The amount of customs revenue collected in 1904 was £143,210.

There is a theatre in Henry street.

The County Infirmary, in Mulgrave street, was opened in 1811, at a cost of £7,000.

Barrington's Hospital, at George's quay, was founded by Sir Joseph Barrington bart. of Limerick, and his sons in 1829; it cost £10,000, and was opened for patients in 1831.

The City Dispensary is in Lower Gerald Griffin street, and serves four districts.

The District Lunatic Asylum, in Mulgrave street, was erected in 1826 at a cost of £30,000.

St. John's Fever and General Hospital is in St. John's gate; the Lying-in Hospital in Bedford row, and the Asylum for Blind Females in Catherine street, and there are several orphanages and a reformatory, conducted by the Catholic sisterhoods.

The Nash Home, Richmond terrace, was founded in 1890, by a bequest of Mr. John Nash, of Limerick, for ladies in reduced circumstances, who must be natives of co. Limerick. The Villiers Almshouses, The Island, were founded and endowed by Mrs. Villiers, of Limerick, for widows. The Corporation Almshouses, in Nicholas street, and Dr. Hall's Almshouses, in the same, are both for widows.

The Bank of Ireland Limited, the Provincial Bank of Ireland, the National Bank Limited, the Munster and Leinster Bank Limited, and the Ulster Bank Limited have each a branch here.

There are two good hotels, and some smaller ones.

Four newspapers are published—the "Limerick Chronicle," on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday; the "Munster News," on Monday, Wednesday and Saturday; the "Limerick Leader," Monday, Wednesday and Friday, and the "Limerick Echo," Tuesday and Friday.

There are now four schools in Limerick in connection with the Christian Brothers, where orphan boys are taught different trades. Limerick District Model school, Military road, was built in 1853, and is under the management of the Commissioners of National Education. Leamy's Free schools, Hartstonge street, were founded in 1814, at a cost, including site, of £3,940, from a bequest by William Leamy esq. who left £13,300 for the education of the children of the poor in Ireland, especially those in the neighbourhood of Limerick city; the schools will hold 600 children; average attendance, 400.

H.M. Prison, in Mulgrave street, for males only, consists of a large central block, containing the governor's apartments, a dispensary and a chapel; there are four blocks of buildings assigned to prisoners, and the airing yard is overlooked from the centre building. H.M. Prison for females is in Merchants' quay.

There are barracks for cavalry, artillery and infantry, all commodious and in airy situations. The city forms part of the Cork District of the Irish Military Command. The Limerick City Royal Garrison Artillery (Militia) and the 5th Battalion Royal Munster Fusiliers (Militia) have also separate barracks. The South of Ireland Imperial Yeomanry have also head quarters in the city.

Limerick is the head quarters of the county constabulary.

The market places are very extensive and are situated in different parts of the city, the principal being the New Market, near Garryowen, which are not now surpassed for extent, general adaptability and style of construction in Ireland. The markets are held on Wednesday and Saturday, and are abundantly supplied with all the necessaries of life at remarkably reasonable prices. Fairs:—Tuesday in Easter week, July 4th, August 4th and December 12th. The great Munster fairs are held the last Thursday and Friday in January, April, July and October, on Thursday, horses and pigs, and on Friday cattle and sheep, and at the monthly fairs, pigs first Tuesday, cattle first Thursday. There is a privilege annexed to the August fair—namely, that no person can be arrested within the precincts of the liberties, on any process issuing out of the tholsel court of Limerick, for the space of 15 days.

The district around Limerick is agricultural. The land is flat and very fertile, but there is an abundance of beautiful scenery in the vicinity of the Clare and Killaloe hills, which are not far distant. The soil is limestone and sandy. A large salmon and eel weir at Corbally, about a mile from Limerick, with a several fishery extending for 6 miles westward, is owned by the Shannon Fishing Company Limited.

People's Park.—The late Earl of Limerick K.P. presented to the Corporation, in 1876, land of about 10 acres for a park, in memory of the late Richard Russell esq. of Limerick; it has been laid out, and contains a monument erected to the Right Hon. Thomas Spring Rice, 1st Lord Monteagle.

New Park.—A portion of the grounds adjoining the Custom House has been granted by the Board of Works to the Corporation, at a nominal rent, to be used as a park or recreation ground for the citizens.

The Green Park Racecourse, of 143 acres, has been purchased by the Limerick Racecourse Co. Limited. It is situated about a mile south-west of the city, and has two spacious stands erected, capable of accommodating 3,600 people. There is a directorate of management of 16 members; J. O'G. Delmege esq. J.P., D.L. chairman.

The area of the city and municipal borough is 2,108 acres; the population in 1901 was 38,151, divided as follows:—

Included in the total population was 1,183 military, 65 officials and 1,140 inmates of the workhouse. 55 officials and 605 inmates of the District Asylum, and 251 in Mount St. Vincent Female Orphanage, 103 in the male and 47 in the female prisons.

The number of electors on the parliamentary register in 1905 was 4,878.
