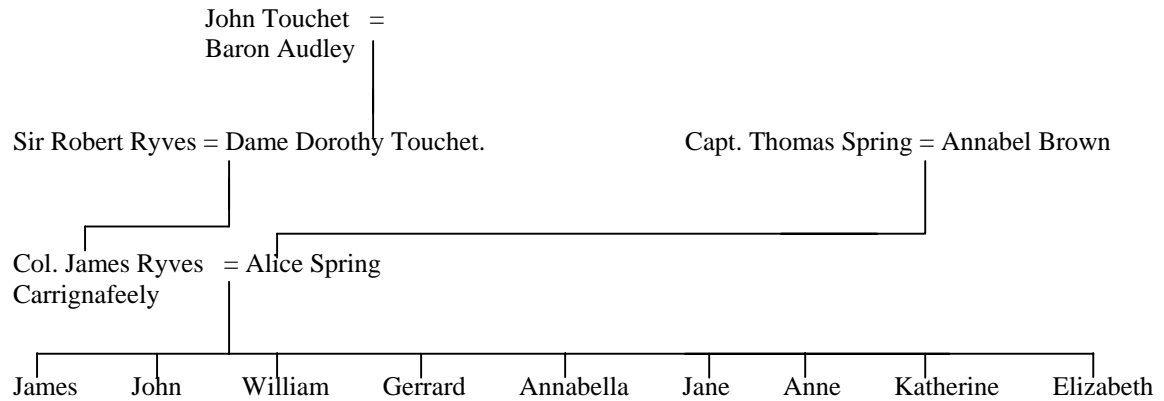


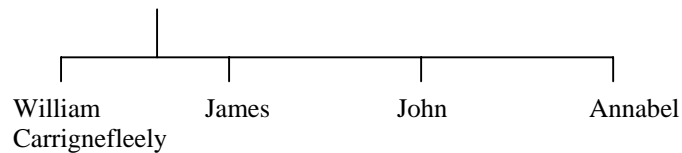

Married on Monday last, Mr Robert Birch an eminent merchant of this City to Miss Ryves daughter of William Ryves of Castle Jane in the county of Limerick.

Limerick Chronicle, Monday 3 March 1783,

Died last Friday at Castle Jane in the Co. of Limerick in the 73rd year of his age, William Ryves Esq.

Dublin Hibernian Journal, Monday 8 Oct. 1787,

Died at Bath, Mrs Ryves relict of the late William Ryves Esq of Castle Jane, Co. Limerick. (*Jane Gore*).

Freeman's Journal, Saturday 18 July 1789,

Married at Turvey House, Dublin the Seat of Robert Birch Esq, Standish Grady Esq of Elton, Co. Limerick, to Miss Mabella Ryves, youngest daughter of the late William Ryves in said county. (Daughter of William and Jane Gore)

Limerick Chronicle, Saturday 2 Feb. 1793,

Birth. On the 22 ult. The lady of William Ryves of Ryves Castle Esq. of a son and heir.

Ennis Chronicle, Monday 12 Oct 1795,

Married William Ryves of Newgarden Esq to Miss Maunsell daughter of Richard Maunsell of Quinsborough Esq.

Walkers Hibernian Magazine, 1771 – 1812,

Married, Rev William Lewis to Ann Ryves, second daughter of Francis Ryves, at Limerick. July 1795

Ennis Chronicle, Monday 14 Aug. 1797,

↑ Married last Thursday at Sixmilebridge, John Hickman of Fenloe Esq to Miss Ryves daughter of [Edward] Ryves of Castle Jane, Co. Limerick

Limerick Chronicle, Wednesday 30 Aug. 1797,

↓ Married a few days ago at Bunratty, Co. Clare, the Seat of Capt. Palliser, John Hickman Esq of Fenloe to Miss Ryves daughter of Edward Ryves of this City.

Ennis Chronicle, Monday 1 Feb 1802,

Advert: Any persons having demands against the late John Hickman of Fenloe Esq to state account to E. Ryves Esq of Limerick.

Ennis Chronicle, Thursday 10 Nov 1803,

Died on Tuesday last at his house in Newtown Pery, Limerick, aged 66 years, Francis Ryves Esq. (Cork Advertiser adds formerly of Ryves Castle.)

Limerick Chronicle, Saturday 23 June 1804,

Advert. Anthony Swinburne has just opened an Hotel in the house lately held by Francis Ryves Esq. at Brunswick Place next opposite Messrs Furnells Bank.

Ennis Chronicle, Wednesday 15 April 1807,

Married last Saturday morning at St John's church, Limerick the Rev. Richard Fitzgerald of Tureen in this county to Mrs Hickman relict of John Hickman late of Fenloe, Esq and daughter of Edward Ryves Esq of Limerick.

Limerick Chronicle, Wednesday 14 March 1810,

Birth on Saturday last at the house of her father Francis [sic] Ryves Esq in Nelson St. the lady of the Rev Richard Fitzgerald of Tureen, Co Clare of a daughter.

Limerick Evening Post, Saturday 22 Aug 1812,

Died on Monday last at his father's house, Tontine Buildings in this City in the 19th year of his age, Francis Ryves Esq eldest son of William Ryves of Ryves Castle. (Francis therefore born circa 1793, see above)

Limerick Evening Post, Wednesday 13 Oct. 1813,

Married on Saturday Morning, Major G. Marsh of Ballinaminton, King's Co. to Jane, youngest daughter of Edward Ryves of Nelson Place in this City.

Limerick Evening Post, Thursday 18 Dec. 1817,

Died at his house at the Tontine Buildings on Monday last, William Ryves of Ryves Castle Esq. in this county, of which he was Magistrate and served as High Sheriff in 1815. (He died on Monday the 15th.)

Clare Journal, Monday 5 April 1819,

↑ Died in Mallow Street, Limerick, Mrs Ryves relict of the late F. Ryves Esq and mother of the late Capt. [William] Ryves, High Sheriff of that county.

↓ **Limerick Chronicle**, Wednesday 31 March 1819,

Died at her house in Mallow St. on Monday last, aged 74, Mrs Ryves widow of the late Francis Ryves Esq of Ryves Castle in this county, daughter of the late William Paul Warren of Grange Begg, Co, Kildare and grand-daughter of the Hon. Robert Allen. Her remains will be interred tomorrow at the family vault, Ryves Castle. (Her name was Frances Warren)

1814/15 Rates Book.

Mrs Ryves of Mallow Street, no number given but house valued at £45. and rates of £2-13-5 paid on 9 April 1815.

Clare Journal, Thursday 9 Sept 1819,

Died on Monday night at the house of his grandfather Edward Ryves Esq of Nelson St. Limerick, John Palliser Hickman of Fenloe in this Co. Esq. In his 19th year---- remains were yesterday interred in the family vault at Newmarket-on-Fergus.

Limerick Chronicle, Saturday 1 April 1820,

Died on Thursday morning at his house in Nelson Place, Edward Ryves Esq aged 74, his remains were interred this morning in the family vault at Ryves Castle.

1814/15 Rates Book.

W. Ryves lived in the 10th house listed out of 12 listings in Nelson Street. The last listing was for a group of three houses. Ryves lived in the biggest house which was valued at £55. That years rates of £3-5-3 was remitted by the Corporation on the 30 Dec 1814. Nelson St. was close to Wickham St.

Ennis Chronicle, Wednesday 19 July 1820,

Died at her son-in-law's at the Wood, Mrs Ryves relict of the late Edward Ryves Esq of Limerick.

Freemen of Limerick: - Only two Ryves became Freemen of Limerick.

95 shares were issued by the **1807 Tontine Company** who built seven houses in George's Street, now O'Connell Street, Limerick. One of the shares was bought by William Ryves for his son, William Ryves Jnr. then aged 10 years. The boy's mother was Frances Harding and the family lived in Brunswick Place, Limerick.

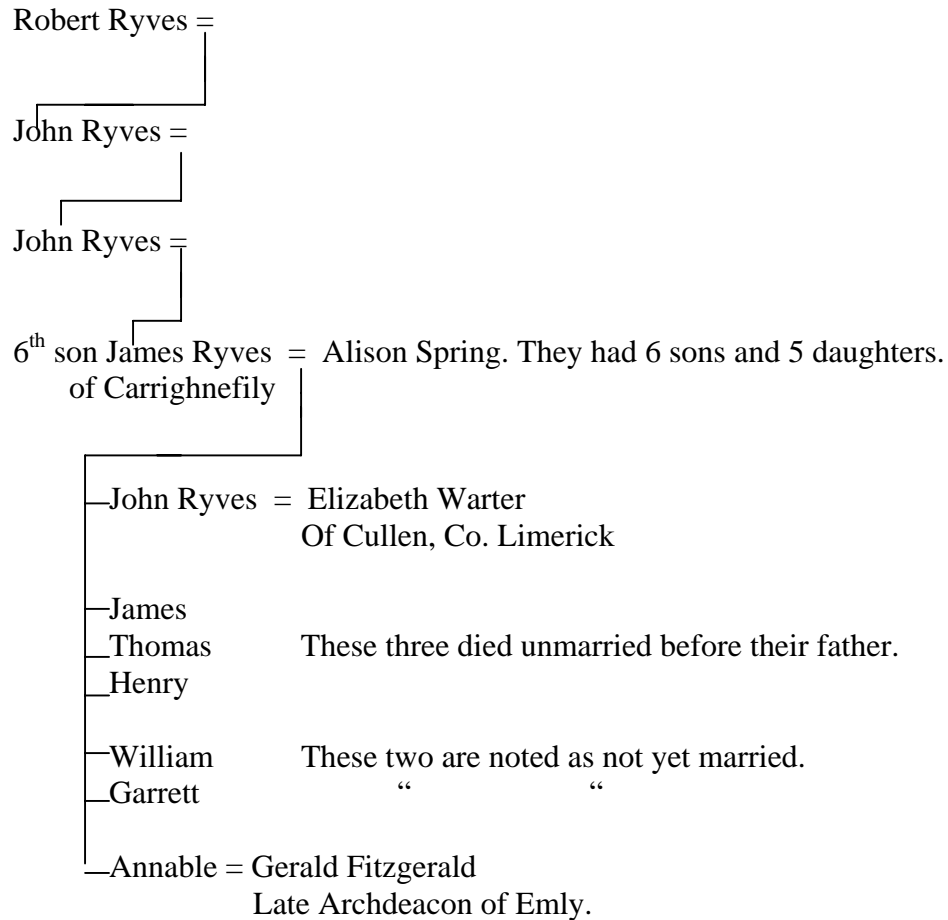
T.C. Friday 1 August 1823,

Birth at Nice in Piedmont on the 9th ult the lady of Massy Ryves of Limerick of a daughter.

Birth on Wednesday at his house in Nelson Place, Limerick, the lady of Hugh Massy Ryves of a son and heir.

There is some further information to be had from an **undated Funeral Entry**.

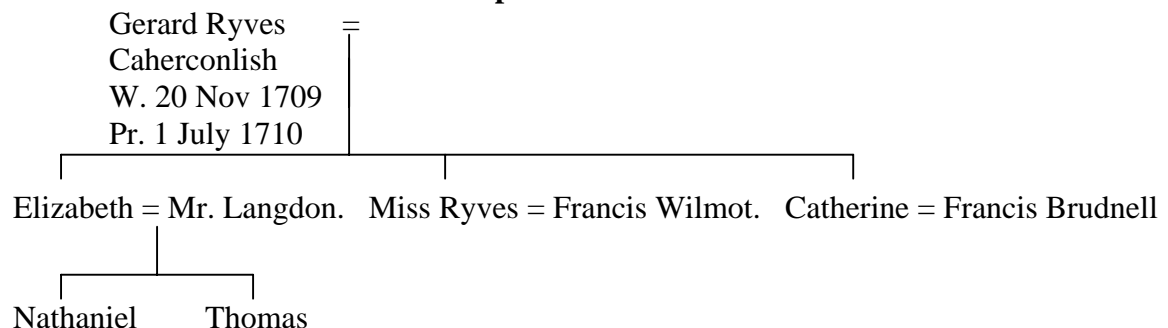

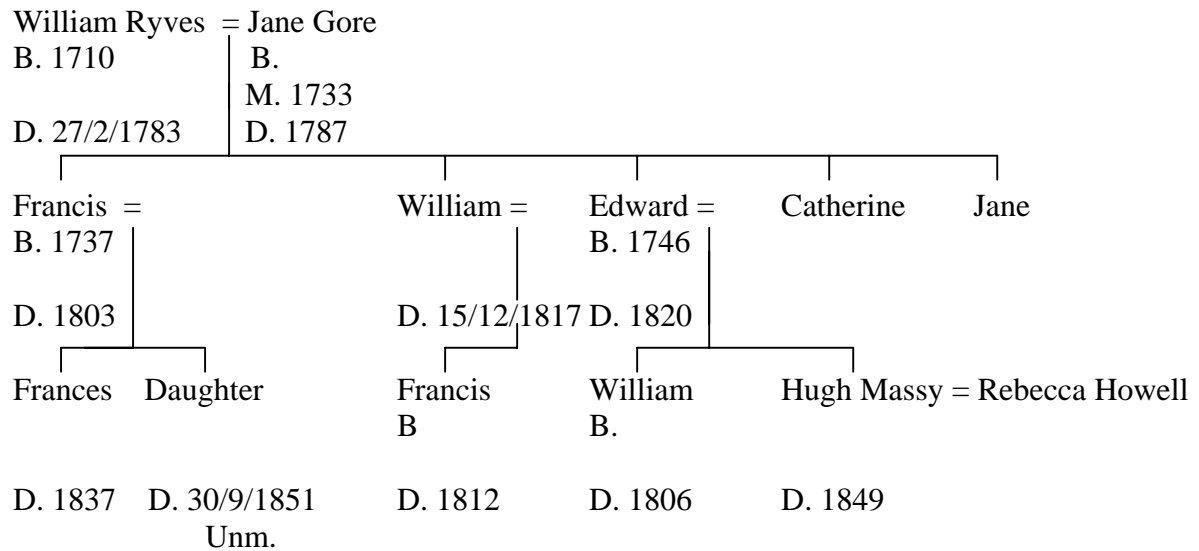

Sir William Ryves, late of the City of Dublin, died on the 10 March 1647/8. He mentioned his wife Dame Dorothy Ryves and his son Charles. He left lease of his estate in Co Down to his son John. Lease of the rectory of Naas to son Charles and left sums of money due to him to his daughter Elizabeth Leigh. Wished to be buried in St. John's church with his deceased wife and daughter.

(This William Ryves was involved in the compilation of the 1641 Depositions.)



Francis was heir to his father William, inheriting Castle Jane in 1783. His eldest daughter was called Frances, she died in 1837. He had a house in Brunswick St. Limerick City. Anthony Swinburne bought the house and turned it into a Hotel in 1804.

William, the second son moved into the Tontine Buildings and died there in 1817.

Edward, the third son, got himself a house in Nelson Street. (Near the Railway Station).

A Francis died at his house in Newtown Pery, in November 1803, aged 66, therefore born circa 1737. Son of William and Jane Gore.

A Francis, eldest son of William Ryves of the Tontine Buildings died there on the 16 Aug 1812. Son of William the second son of William and Jane Gore.

Edward was the father of a daughter who married John Hickman in Aug 1797, he died shortly afterwards and she remarried the Rev Richard Fitzgerald of Toureen, Co. Clare in 1807. She gave birth to a daughter in her father's house in March 1810.

Edward died on the 30 March 1820, aged 74. Therefore born circa 1746. His eldest son William, a Lt. in the 78th Regt. died of fever on active service in 1806, in Calabria. John Hickman, Edward's grandson died in Edward's house of Typhus, aged 19, in 1819.

Jane, Edward's youngest daughter married George Marsh of Ballinamilton in King's County, In October 1813. See Rosemary ffolliott's file for what may be the death of Edward's wife, reported in the Ennis Chronicle of Wednesday 19 July 1820.
