SURVEYOR'S REPORTS.

COUNTY OF LIMERICK.

TO THE GRAND JURY ASSEMBLED AT SPRING ASSIZES, 1885.

GENTLEMEN,

1.—The Warrant of my appointment to be County Surveyor to the Western Division of your County is dated 24th October, 1884, and on the 10th of the following month I received charge at the hands of your Acting County Surveyor—Mr. Fosbery, who has very kindly given me full information on all matters which I have found necessary to submit to him since I came into office.

2.—GENERAL STATE OF ROADS. Necessarily, I have spent all available time in inspecting the roads in my charge, and there remain now only a few unimportant roads of which I have not personal knowledge. Very few possess any appreciable reserve of strength; but I am glad to say that many of the contractors are working well, and I hope to be able to report substantial progress at an early date.

3.—All road contracts that had expired were renewed at Road Sessions; but in the case of one road, 926 perches, from Newcastle to Moneyay Chapel, in the Barony of Glenquin, which has been in the hands of your County Surveyor since last Assizes, I am informed by Maurice M. Harnett the contractor, that he wishes to withdraw. I willingly advise the cancelling of the bond, because from my experience of the road I consider the price quite too small, and shall ask you to present the road again to your County Surveyor until next assizes, under the 38th section of the act.

4.—Many certificates which I granted at Sessions, with a view to get further experience of the contractors, and give them an opportunity to do the work, I shall now, with your permission, withdraw, because I find that no advantage has been taken of the opportunity so given.

5.—SPECIAL WORKS.—Barony of Shanid. Of two bridges under construction, on the road from Newcastle to Glin, one was complete when I came into office, and in November last the contractor applied to me for permission to postpone building the other until Spring. This I granted him, because it was too late in the year to attempt taking out foundations. On subsequently visiting the work in December, I found the new bridge, which is 6 feet span, backing up the water in such a way that the wings are likely to be undercut. Bearing in mind the nature of the foundation, referred to by Mr. Fosbery in his report to last Assizes, I am of opinion that the span of the second bridge should be increased to 9 feet, and some additional work done to the wings of the bridge already built. To accomplish this I ask for a presentment of £15.

6.—Near the site of these bridges I found the road being undercut by the river, and applied to Sessions for £36 to construct a suitable defence. The contract has been taken for £24 14s. 0d.

7.—The cutting at Athea Hill has been fairly completed according to specification. An adjoining landholder—William Colbert—complains of injury done him by this work. On examining it with him, I had failed to see that he has sustained any damage, and have referred him to Presentment Sessions if he wishes to test the matter, as I cannot require the contractor to carry out any works not provided for when the contract was taken.

8 *Barony of Glenquin.* A proposed new road from Rhenaguillee to Caherlavoy is a very necessary work indeed, but of local rather than general importance, and, therefore, in selecting a line, I have taken advantage of existing car-tracks and fences, so as to cheapen the construction. A considerable amount of masonry will be required in two bridges, but stone is on the ground, and hence a substantial road 16 feet wide can be constructed for the sum of £650, at which the contract has been taken.

9. In consequence of a letter received from the Board of Guardians as Sanitary Authority, complaining of the state of the public road near Carr Bridge, Newcastle, I examined the place, and found the span at the cross roads quite taken up with large quantities of manure. After duly notifying the owners, but without effect, I had them summoned to the Petty Sessions, with the result that all the manure was removed except one heap, the owner of which raised a question of title, because he had been undisturbed for a long time past. On this point the Magistrates had no jurisdiction, and it will be necessary to test it at Quarter Sessions, as it is very damaging to the authority that your County Surveyor must maintain over the roads in his charge. The habit of using the roads for storing manure is a general one, I find, all over my division of your County, and one to which it is highly desirable to put a stop as soon as possible. To prevent a recurrence of the nuisance at this particular place, I suggest an alteration in the roads, and have applied for £7 4s. 0d. to construct the necessary length of fencing.

10. *County at Large.* The repairs and painting to the Court-House of Newcastle and Rathkeale have been satisfactorily completed, and at the request of the Magistrates assembled at Petty Sessions on 19th December last at Newcastle, I asked for a Presentment to paper and furnish the Retiring Room, and provide other furniture and necessaries at that Court-House. An application for an Office for the Clerk of Petty Sessions in Rathkeale Court-House came under my notice too late to have it brought forward at the Assizes.

11. My attention has been called to the Court-House at Glin by a letter from Major Kiggell, Cahara. I find it in bad repair, with the roof leaking, and estimate the necessary outlay at £35, a large part of which will have to be spent on the roof.

12. It was pointed out to me by the Magistrates at Ballygarry Road Sessions on 2nd January last, that a fire cannot be lighted in the stove of the New Court-House, and that the bookcase is so constructed as not to take

the books for which it was intended. The contractor for the building I find has complied with his specification in these matters, and therefore I could not require the alterations at his hands, and have accordingly asked for a Presentment of £3 to get the necessary work done.

13. **GENERAL STATE OF BRIDGES AND OTHER WORKS.** Many applications for repairs to bridges, and for rebuilding gulleys, I brought before Road Sessions. These have been for the most part taken for small sums, and contracts have been entered into for all of them. I obtained a Magistrates order for £2 for repairing a sudden damage to a small bridge on a road from Ballykenny cross to Arranagh cross, in Glenquin, and another for £7 to repair east abutment of Ballyhahill bridge in Shanid. This bridge will require a presentment for general repairs next Assizes, time not permitting me to bring it forward at present Assizes.

14. The bridge carrying the mail-car road over the river at Glin, I find was before you some time ago. It appears to have stood in its present condition for a long time, and may stand much longer, but the arch is deformed and bulged inwards and therefore it cannot be reported a sound work.

15. The sea wall supporting the same road near Glin is decidedly in an unsuitable condition, with the mortar apparently all washed out of it. Hitherto it seems to have been the practice to wait until a portion of the wall came down, and then to obtain a Magistrates order for a sudden damage, but I would submit that this is not a good method to adopt, because the advantage of competition by tenders is lost. The restoration of the wall, being a matter of labor, cement, and some outlay for bondstones and coping, needs not be very expensive, considering the magnitude of the work, and I am of opinion it should be taken in hands at once, by rebuilding the more unsound portions first, and proceeding with the rest from time to time, according to a definite specification. I intend bringing this work before next road sessions, as there is a small portion of the wall down now, and a great deal more looking weak.

16. The repairs to Glin Peir, referred to by Mr. Fosbery in his Report to last Assizes, have not been carried out.

17. **ASSISTANCE.** Mr. J. D. Leahy the temporary assistant appointed under Mr. Fosbery is, according to his arrangement with Mr. Fosbery, quite prepared to give up his appointment when required to do so by the Grand Jury, but it is not necessary to go into arguments to show that it would be very injudicious to weaken the present staff in the Western Division of your County for a long time to come.

## COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORTS

Relative to Works in his charge in the Eastern Division of  
this County, up to Spring Assizes, 1885.

GENTLEMEN,

At the Presenting Road Sessions in the month of January, appointed for the different Baronies in my charge, the usual applications for payments to Road Contractors were all carefully considered and allowed or disallowed as I found it my duty to report on each; with the exception of the Baronies of Pubble Brien and Coshma, at which Courts there was no Magistrate in attendance, this as it happens, can cause no inconvenience, if you allow me to act as I would have done, had there been a Court in the matter of Payments.

Applications for new works or repairs of masonry, &c., were so trifling they can remain over until next Assizes, as also Applications for renewal of Contracts expiring at this; I will provide for such roads as may be absolutely necessary, and the remainder, I am confident, will not suffer for want of Contractor, until again taken up.

In all the Baronies there are a few applications for payment which were allowed on conditions of certain works being completed, and which I find from personal inspection, and from inspection by my assistants, have not been completed; those Certificates I wish now to withdraw under the provisions of the 146th section, and pass them over to me to have them done, this action on your part I have hitherto found to work well, and as all my accounts must go before the Government Auditor there can be no irregularity or wrongful application of money, which can escape detection by him or myself.

The Applications for Presentments are of a very trifling and ordinary kind. I will report to you on each as they come before you.

Renewals of Contracts when approved of at Sessions, have been in nearly all cases taken up, and although there existed a great deal (in fact more than usual), of competition there was but very little reduction from the price allowed at Sessions, in fact, it has been a more wholesome competition than I recollect to have ever seen before.

There was no Magistrate in attendance to open tenders for the Barony of Coonagh, therefore, it will be necessary for you to appoint a Committee to do so—there are only three roads to be provided for, but there are two of them, over which there is very considerable traffic—it is better the Contracts should be regularly let.

My duty as acting County Surveyor of the Western Division of this County, at the request of the Grand Jury at the Summer Assizes, 1884, I considered ceased when it pleased the Lord Lieutenant to appoint an independent officer to that District, viz.: 25th October, 1884. I continued to work it on until Mr. Horan arrived about the 15th November. I have directed the Grand Jury Secretary to put my proportion of salary on the Schedule, up to that date, as also my son's proportion, up to the date of his resignation, from which date I appointed Mr. James Leahy, of Newcastle as the qualified assistant for that district, and whose continuance I would strongly recommend. I take the liberty of mentioning this subject as I feel bound in honor to remind the Grand Jury of the circumstance connected with the appoint of a *third assistant* for the west. I engaged that my son when appointed to the post should resign without seeking any compensation for dismissal when a County Surveyor should be appointed to the west, should the Grand Jury not think it necessary to have a third. Mr. Leahy took office under me on my son's resigning, with the understanding (in writing) that he should do likewise if required, I would respectfully say continue him, the district is a very wild and difficult one to work, and by leaving him on until a vacancy arises, at all events, your roads will soon be nearly good.

I would suggest to the Grand Jury that it would be well, and would facilitate the repairs and requirements which sometimes are necessary to be executed quickly, from one cause or another, at the several Court-Houses in the District, and for which there are no funds available between Assizes; if you would present a sum of money for that purpose to your County Surveyor it would be very satisfactory both for the works and to him; also it is usual in almost (if not all) the other Counties in Ireland, those accounts, of course, come before you as well as the Government Auditor previous to each Assizes.

I consider that in general your roads and masonry are in fairly good condition, with the exception of Landsdowne bridge on the bounds of the County Clare, which is trying to tumble in for the last 23 years, to my knowledge, but has not yet succeed, why, I don't know.

## LIMERICK LUNATIC ASYLUM.

REPORT OF THE GRAND JURY COMMITTEE.

March 5, 1885.

We have made a full inspection of the Lunatic Asylum, and have much pleasure in stating that we think the Grand Jury have reason to be satisfied with the manner in which that Institution is conducted.

The buildings appear to be in good repair. The interior is scrupulously clean and well kept, and the inmates well cared for.

The numbers resident on the date of the inspection of the Committee of the Grand Jury for the Spring Assizes of 1885, in the Limerick Asylum are, 232 men and 245 women; of these 174 men and 159 women are chargeable to the County; 58 men and 86 women to the City.

At the Spring Assizes of last year the numbers were 488; of whom 344 were men and 244 women, showing a decrease of 8 men and an increase of one woman.

On going through the Institution various improvements were shown us. Several female corridors have been boarded and polished. The male hospital has been newly fitted up, new and enlarged window put in, and a new floor laid down

The sewerage is stated to have caused much anxiety from its very unsatisfactory condition in the autumn of last year. Considerable labour and expense were involved in the cleaning of the main sewer and laying drain pipes, but on consultation with the Corporation the Governors have decided to suspend any further work until a system of intercepting tanks have been tried.

The expenditure for the year 1884 amounted to £13,229 1s. 9d.; of this the County contributed £6,680 7s. 9d., and the Government £4,970 16s. 0d., the remainder being made up of contributions for the maintenance of patients and other sums.

The accounts for the year are annexed to this Report, but under the Act of Parliament cannot be officially audited till after the 25th of March.

### COUNTY INFIRMARY REPORT.

We, the Committee appointed by the Grand Jury at the Spring Assizes, 1885, submit the following report:—

We found the house in most excellent order, clean and well kept, which reflects the greatest credit on Miss Sandes, the Matron of the Institution.

The number of patients admitted during the half-year ending 31st Dec., 1884, was eighteen. Number in house at present, nine. Two patients died during the half-year, one of them a Roman Catholic clergyman, who had been 109 days in the Institution; the other patients spent on an average about 29 days each.

The total receipts for the last half year amounted to £230 7s. 6d. including a balance of £7 13s 4d from last half-year, of which sum £39 had been received from paying patients.

The expenditure during the same period amounted to £189 15s 2½d, leaving a balance on the 31st December, 1884, of £40 12s 0½d, of which sum £37 11s 10d remains in Bank, and the balance, £3 0s 2½d in hands of the Treasurer.

We have examined the vouchers and found them correct.

The account has been made up to the 31st December, 1884, at which period twelve patients have been admitted, of which three have left and nine at present are in the house. Thirty patients have therefore been admitted since last Summer Assizes.

We recommend that the usual presentment of £75 be passed by the Grand Jury.

### REPORT OF PUBLIC ANALYST.

TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF LIMERICK.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg leave to report for your information the following particulars of the work which I have performed as your Analyst during the half-year ended the 31st December, 1884:—

For the Guardians of Glin Union, there from time to time five specimens of water analysed all proved to be fairly, but not very good.

For the Guardians of Newcastle Union, three specimens of water were analysed, all proved to be fairly or very good.

For the Guardians of Croom Union, a specimen of water was analysed, it was one of the worst that have ever come under my observation, being largely polluted with sewage.

For Kilmallock Board of Guardians, a specimen of water was analysed and found to be of good composition.

Two specimens of soap were analysed for the Guardians of Limerick Union: one was a portion of the soap tendered for the supply to the workhouse; the other was a portion of the bulk supplied; the latter was greatly inferior to the former.

A water sent by Mr L. J. P. Filgate, of Grange Hill, Kilmallock was found to be polluted.

A specimen of milk was analysed for the District Lunatic Asylum Limerick, and was found to be of poor quality.

The stomachs of a cow were analysed for Mr John J. Ryan, Cappamore, Murroe, but no poison was detected therein.

For Tipperary Union, which is partly situated within the County of Limerick, four specimens of water were analysed; all were bad, especially one which was extensively polluted with sewage.

The total number of analyses made in 1884 amounted to 83.

## LIMERICK AND KERRY RAILWAY.

REPORT OF E. W. O'BRIEN, COUNTY DIRECTOR FOR LIMERICK.

GENTLEMEN,

At the Summer Assizes, 1884, I was appointed County Director of this line for the County of Limerick and Mr. George Sandes of Listowel, County Director for the County of Kerry.

You will find in the Report of a Committee presented to the Grand Jury at the Summer Assizes, 1884, a statement of the relations between the Limerick and Kerry Railway Company and the Counties, and between that Company and the Waterford and Limerick Railway Company, which works the line.

The amount for which you will be asked at these Assizes under the guarantee is £419 0s. 0d., as against £351 13s. 5d., in the preceding year, being an increase of £67 6s. 7d.

For the half year ending 31st December, 1884, the gross receipts were £8,424 9s. 9d., as against £8,634 12s. 0d., in 1883, and the net receipts, £3,369 15s. 11d., as against £3,453 16s. 9d., in 1883, showing a decrease in gross receipts of £210 2s. 3d., and in net receipts of £84 0s. 10d.

The accrued receipts from the beginning of this year to the 13th inst., show a decrease of £88 in round numbers.

This falling off is the more unsatisfactory because up to last year the financial position of the Railway had been rapidly improving.

The Directors are unable to account very clearly for this falling off; but it is known (1) That there was a general and severe depression of railway business in 1884, from which the whole Waterford and Limerick system, amongst others, suffered. The following returns (taken from the *Railway News*) will illustrate this:—

Looking to the very serious falling off in the receipts of the Waterford and Limerick Railway Company, and to the want of recovery during the second half of the year shown on their system, it seems almost surprising that the falling off on the Limerick and Kerry line should not have been larger than it is.

(2.) The Line has unquestionably lost a good deal of traffic through the transference to the Great Southern and Western line of a considerable portion of the business of the Clyde Shipping Company; but the Directors have hitherto been unable to ascertain what amount of loss is due to this cause. This transference took place in consequence of an unfortunate dispute between the Waterford and Limerick Railway Company and the Clyde Company, into the particulars of which I need not enter.

You will see from the Report of the Committee, to which I have referred, that the Directors of the Limerick and Kerry Railway attributed the falling off in the traffic in part to the alleged unsatisfactory manner in which the Waterford and Limerick Company performed their haulage agreement. With the limited experience I have hitherto had I feel that I should scarcely be justified as yet in expressing an opinion on this delicate question. I am the more disposed to postpone any such expression until next Assizes, because an important change has recently been made in the Directorate of the Waterford and Limerick Company, which it may be hoped will lead to more harmonious relations between the Companies, and to a greater efficiency of management.

The Directors of the Limerick and Kerry Railway, alarmed at the falling off in the traffic, have since last Assizes been making vigorous efforts to improve their position.

They have appointed as Independent Inspector, Mr. E. Cooke, (late in the employment of the Great Western Railway of England), and this gentleman has already shown himself a zealous and capable officer, and has made many valuable suggestions to the Board, the result of which, if adopted, would, I believe, be to develop the traffic, and improve the accommodation of the line. Mr. Cooke's salary (£125 and uniform) will be an addition to the working expenses and consequently a charge against the guaranteeing counties; but I feel confident that you will have no reason to regret his appointment.

Mr. Cooke's efficiency is much impaired by the Waterford and Limerick Board having withdrawn from him the power of inspecting the station books, and of checking tickets—a power which was enjoyed by him when first appointed. The Waterford and Limerick Board believed that he was inclined to make a hostile use of his power, and this was the reason for their action. I cannot but hope, however, that now that a more cordial feeling than has heretofore existed appears to be growing up between the Companies, the Waterford and Limerick Board will see their way to affording the officials of the Limerick and Kerry Company (or some of them) all reasonable access to every source of information, since without such facilities it is impossible for the Directors of the latter Company to understand properly their financial position, to detect mismanagement, and to devise measures of improvement.

Since last Assizes there has been a distinct change for the better in the passenger carriages and in the punctuality of the train service.

Larger discretion has been given to the Traffic Manager; and this is much needed, since the details of management have to be conducted through the cumbrous and slow machinery of a Joint Committee of Management.

At the suggestion of the Limerick and Kerry Company several of the goods rates are being revised, and there is reason to believe that more liberal rates will lead ere long to a notable development of traffic.

I wish to call your attention particularly to the rates for lime and limestone—articles of first necessity in a great part of the country through which the line passes, and in which there ought to be a large business.

The rates which have prevailed for some time past have been prohibitory, and consequently there has been no traffic in these articles. Quite recently the following scale has been fixed:—

Lime and limestone in Company's waggons, in quantities of 6 tons, one penny per ton per mile, with a minimum charge of 10s. per waggon. In owner's waggons  $\frac{3}{4}$ ths of a penny per mile, with a minimum charge of 7s. 6d. per waggon.

It is to be feared that the minimum charge will discourage purchasers who live within easy carting distance of the quarries from having their lime and stone sent by rail; and the allowance of one-eighth of a penny per mile made to persons using their own waggons seems to be somewhat inadequate.

The stations, rolling stock, *personnel*, and general working of the line are about on a par with other parts of the Waterford and Limerick Company's system.

The Limerick and Kerry line is separated from the Great Southern and Western line at Tralee by a break of a few feet; the consequence being that goods cannot be sent from the former to the latter system without being transferred from one set of waggons to the other. This artificial interruption of traffic appeared to Mr. Sandes and myself to be prejudicial to the interests of the line, and of the traders of North Kerry and the west of Limerick, and we made a joint representation to that effect, which was adopted by the Limerick and Kerry Board; but the Joint Committee appear to have decided to leave matters as they are.

The permanent way seems to me to be well laid, and I am convinced that passenger trains, furnished with adequate brake power, might be run on it with safety at a considerably higher speed than is now usual.

A sum of £320 has recently been expended on ballasting.

The Station at Listowel is scarcely large enough for the traffic.

There are two level crossings at Ashgrove (between Barnagh and Newcastle) which seem to me to be dangerous to persons crossing the line, owing to the fact that the driver of a train coming down from Barnagh cannot see the signals at the crossings in time to pull up. I called the attention of the Board to these crossings, and it was arranged to refer the matter to the engineer of the Company.

Steps are being taken to amalgamate into one company the Limerick and Kerry, Rathkeale and Newcastle, and Tralee and Fenit Companies. This will not affect the counties except in so far as it may tend to augment the receipts and reduce the expenses.

The scheme of the Munster Tramways Company to connect Ballybunion and Ballylongford with Listowel by a narrow-gauge railway has been rejected by the Privy Council, the Limerick and Kerry Board opposing it on the ground of the break of gauge. I declined to take any part in opposing a scheme which had received the sanction of the Kerry Grand Jury, but I think it would have been very unfortunate if a different gauge had been adopted. The Limerick and Kerry Board are now promoting a Bill for a broad-gauge line from Listowel to Ballybunion; but whether this line will be constructed without the assistance of a guarantee I am not in a position to say. It would obviously be a most important feeder to the Limerick and Kerry line, and a great convenience to the inhabitants of North Kerry and Limerick, giving access as it would to a charming watering place.

The limestone quarries and kilns at Ballintogher (close to Lixnaw) are now open, and ought, with favourable rates, to do a large business. This enterprise is rendered a very valuable one for the public by the fact that the cost of bringing heavy and cheap materials up the hill at Barnagh makes it difficult for the Railway Company to bring lime and limestone from the east at reasonable rates.

The Fenit harbour will be partially available in the course of the Spring. This is a magnificent work, and ought to largely increase the business of Tralee. The line from Fenit to Tralee will be open in March or April. It can scarcely be doubted that these works will bring a good deal of traffic to the Limerick and Kerry line.

Proceedings are being taken by the Earl of Listowel and Mr. Huggard to have a Receiver appointed on the line. This can hardly fail to add very materially to the expenses chargeable against the Counties, and I think the Grand Jury would do well to instruct their Solicitors to watch the proceedings in this case. I enclose correspondence on this subject between Mr. Downing, representing the standing Committee of the Kerry Grand Jury, and Mr. Lake, Solicitor to the Limerick and Kerry Board.

I beg to call your attention to an item in account No. 9, statement of accounts to 31st December, 1884, "Law Expenses £105 Os. Od." This item represents, I am informed, Mr. Lake's fees for attendances at Board Meetings and general advice. It is of course right that he should be paid, and the amount may be reasonable; but as this is the first time that this item has appeared in the account (all law charges having hitherto been defrayed out of capital), I have thought that you might like to take a legal opinion on the point, with a view to raising an objection before the Arbitrators.

Mr. Sandes and I attended the last Arbitration (which was held at Tralee), and saw no reason to object to the award, so far as the Counties are concerned. Certain apparent anomalies in the accounts were explained to our satisfaction by the Traffic Manager previous to the Arbitration.

The Arbitration is little better than an expensive formality, and it might be desirable that it should be held only once a year.

I have to request that the Grand Jury will present to me (as they are empowered to do) the sum of £2 5s. 1d. for expenses incurred as follows:—

Messrs. M'Kern charged for printing 150 copies of the Committee's Report above referred to, £2 18s. 6d. I should have thought that this ought to come into the printing contract, which I believe they hold; but if not I would suggest that it might perhaps be presented along with the above sum of £2 5s. 1d. It seems scarcely reasonable that this charge, small as it is, should be borne by the members of the Committee.

I have much pleasure in acknowledging the courtesy which I have experienced from the officials of both Companies, and the readiness shown in affording me all the information I required. I am particularly indebted to the Secretary and Solicitor of the Limerick and Kerry Company, and Mr. Roberts, Traffic Manager of the Waterford and Limerick Company.

In conclusion, I beg to make the following suggestions:—

(1). That the County Surveyor of the Western Division be instructed to inspect the level crossings at Ashgrove, and to communicate (if he think necessary) with the Company's engineer with respect to them.

(2). That the Solicitors to the Grand Jury be instructed to watch the proceedings for the appointment of a Receiver, and to oppose the application if they consider it desirable to do so.

(3). That an opinion be taken as to whether the charge for Law Expenses, £105, ought to be disputed before the Arbitrators.

(4). That a strong resolution be passed urging on the Postmaster General the desirability of establishing a mail service in connection with the a.m. mail from Dublin to reach Tralee not later than 2.30 p.m., and that such resolution be sent to the Postmaster General, and a copy thereof to the Secretary of the Kerry Grand Jury.

(5). That a communication be addressed to the Waterford and Limerick Board of Directors directing their attention.

- (a) To the importance of securing the Tralee mails.
- (b) To the desirability of making arrangements for enabling passengers leaving Dublin at 1 p.m. to continue their journey westwards without delay at Limerick
- (c) To the unsatisfactory state of the waiting and refreshment rooms at Limerick, at which station passengers for the Limerick and Kerry line are frequently compelled to spend a considerable time.
- (d) To the question of connecting the Limerick and Kerry line at Tralee, so as to allow goods to pass freely from one system to the other.

### SHANNON NAVIGATION BILL.

The Grand Jury of the County of Limerick at Spring Assizes, 1885, have had before them the Shannon Navigation Bill, and have carefully considered it.

The Grand Jury approve of the principle of the Bill, but is strongly of opinion that the insertion of the following two provisions is absolutely necessary for the public interest:—

1st. That when any Pier or Harbour shall under the provisions of this Act be transferred to Trustees, or to any County, or Urban, or other Authority, the Commissioners of Public Works, who have heretofore received the tolls, and who were responsible for the maintenance of the pier or harbour, shall first place said pier or harbour in a proper state of repair.

2nd. That it shall not be lawful for the said Commissioners of Public Works to direct that such pier or harbour shall be so transferred as aforesaid, unless such County, Trustee, or other Authority shall first consent to undertake the maintenance of such pier or harbour under the provisions of this Act.

Resolved—That this resolution be transmitted to the Secretary for the Treasury, and also embodied in a Petition to the two Houses of Parliament.

Spring Assizes, 1861.

ORDERED—That a Committee consisting of the Hon. S. E. Spring Rice, Mr. Croker, Mr. Considine, Mr. Delmege, Colonel Dickson, M.P., Mr. E. Gabbett, and Mr. William Smith O'Brien, be appointed for the purpose of ascertaining whether an arrangement can be made for relieving the City of Limerick, and for promoting the interest and convenience of the inhabitants of the Counties of Clare and Limerick, by purchasing from the Board of Works the Tolls of the Wellesley Bridge. That such Committee have power to carry on their inquiries in the interval between this time and the next Assizes, and to report to the Grand Jury at next Summer Assizes.

ORDERED—That we direct our Solicitor to take Counsel's opinion as to whether the County is to keep the roads both over and under the railways in repair, as also the bridges, and the approaches thereto, or whether the several Railway Companies are legally bound to do so.

Summer Assizes, 1861.

RESOLVED—That our Solicitor, Mr. Murphy, be directed to obtain Mr. Brewster's opinion as to the respective liability of the County, and of the Railway Companies, for the maintenance of roads on the surface of bridges over railways and the approaches thereto.

ORDERED—That John W. Channer, Esq., Sub-Inspector of Constabulary at Adare, be appointed to stamp and adjust the Sub-Standards of the County of Limerick, pursuant to the 7th Section of the 23rd & 24th Victoria, cap. 119, and to have custody of the County Copies pointed out in section 6.

RESOLVED—That it is the opinion of this Grand Jury that a Protestant and a Catholic Chaplain ought to constitute a part of the staff of the County Infirmary.

Spring Assizes, 1862.

ORDERED—That Mr. Murphy, our Local Solicitor, shall take such steps, consistent with public convenience, as shall relieve the County from the charge of keeping in repair the roads passing over and under Railway bridges in this County.

RESOLVED—That it is the opinion of this Grand Jury that it would be very desirable and conducive to the public service, that the Coroners in Ireland should be placed under a similar footing with the Coroners of England, as provided by the 23rd Vic. cap. 116, sec. 4, by substituting fixed salaries in place of fees, and that our Secretary be requested to convey this resolution to the chief Secretary for Ireland, and that our County Members be requested to co-operate.

That a condition be attached to Presentment for County Hospital requesting that in future the Governors shall reserve the Charity for County Patients only.

It was proposed to the Grand Jury that Ten Beds should be reserved in County Infirmary for City Patients—Eleven voted for—Ten against. In a question of this nature is a Jury of Twelve necessary?

Ruled by the Court that there should be a Jury of Twelve for.

With reference to observations made by the Judge of Assize regarding the instances of undetected crime, we, the Grand Jury of the County of Limerick, cannot help remarking that, in our opinion, the Police Force is assuming too much of a military character; we do not wish to cast any imputation upon a body of men whose conduct and general behaviour has always been most exemplary—especially those officers and men connected with our own County,—but it is obvious that, taking them from their legitimate duties to exercise and drill them as soldiers, sending them to Hythe to compete with the army in rifle shooting, and keeping an unnecessarily large reserve in Dublin, for the support of a large portion of which the Counties are annually taxed, materially interfering with an effective system of discovering agrarian offenders.

We would also observe that the practice of appointing military officers to the higher ranks of the force is a great discouragement to the officers of the Police in the execution of their duties, a very great injustice, and deprives them of their legitimate chances of promotion.

#### Summer Assizes, 1862.

**RESOLVED**—That it is the duty of the County Surveyors to report to the Grand Jury all cases in which contracts have not been properly performed, specifying those cases in which they are of opinion that proceedings ought to be taken against the Contractors or their Securities. This resolution is not intended to interfere in any way with such proceedings of a summary nature as the County Surveyors may think it right to adopt for securing the due performance of the Contracts.

#### Spring Assizes, 1863.

**RESOLVED**—That the sum of £3,000 be borrowed for the purchase of premises for the accommodation of the Royal Limerick County Regiment of Militia, such sum to be raised by mortgage on the rates of the County under the provisions of 17th & 18th Vic., Cap. 107, sec. 39.

I am directed by the Lord Lieutenant to state for the information of the Grand Jury for the County of Limerick, that his Excellency finds from the report of the Inspector-General of Militia, that the house at present occupied by the Stores of the County Regiment of Militia is very inconvenient, and that a house and ground which have been offered, and which could be obtained and repaired for the sum of £2,500, have been officially inspected, and appear to be well fitted for the accommodation both for the stores and for the permanent staff, for whom his Excellency considers it very desirable that quarters should be provided in the storehouse. His Excellency understanding that a proposition for the purchase of the premises referred to will be submitted to the Grand Jury at the present Assizes, strongly recommends it to their favourable consideration.

I am to add that the amount of the lodging money allowed by the War Department for the members of the permanent staff who may be provided with quarters in the proposed storehouse, will be paid by the Secretary of State for War, to the County Treasurer, as provided by the 23rd & 24th Vic. c. 34, s. 10.

**RESOLVED**—That inasmuch as it has been pronounced to be contrary to law that any road contractor should be paid for any work except that executed in the half-year next preceding the Presentment Sessions at which the demand for payment shall have been proposed, the Grand Jury direct the County Surveyors to govern themselves accordingly; and the Grand Jury further acquaint those officers that any breach of this regulation will be considered equivalent to a misapplication of the public funds.

**RESOLVED**—That it is necessary and advisable that the Magistrates at Road Sessions enquire into the solvency of the Contractor as well as the Securities, in every case presented, and that the Act of Parliament be carried out strictly, requiring all the parties to be worth severally "twice the amount of the Contract." That the Secretary of the Grand Jury communicate this to the several Sessions.

**RESOLVED**—That in future the names of the Magistrates granting all summary orders for the repairs of sudden breaches in roads or bridges, should be inserted in the printed list of "Magistrates Orders," presented to the Grand Jury, with the date of such order, for each work so ordered by the Magistrate and Justice.

**ORDERED**—That the County Surveyors serve notice on the several Railway Companies requiring them to repair and keep in repair from the present Assizes the several approaches over their respective railways, as decided in the Court of Queen's Bench, on 3rd February, 1863.

Summer Assizes, 1863.

The Grand Jury Secretary having represented to this Grand Jury that the very serious inconvenience and interruption to the public business resulted from the irregular mode and unreasonable hours of lodging Tender for Public Works in his Office,—ORDERED—That the Grand Jury Secretary is hereby directed not to receive a Tender *under any circumstances* after 6 o'Clock, p.m., on the days appointed for receiving them.

ORDERED—That the County Treasurer be authorised to pay the Collector of County Cess, out of the County monies in his hands, the amount of their poundage, on paying to him the amount of their warrants.

Spring Assizes, 1864.

ORDERED—That the County Surveyors be directed to take proceedings in all cases in which the Contractors have not used due care to execute works within the period of their contract.

RESOLVED—That the Barony Constables be required to pay up the amount of their warrants to the County Treasurer, two day previous to the Assizes, or in default shall lose the poundage to which they would otherwise be entitled.

Summer Assizes, 1864.

RESOLVED—That it is the opinion of the Grand Jury that Magistrates' Orders should be strictly confined to cases of sudden damage, which cannot be remedied in the ordinary course by Presentment at Sessions; and further, that the work sanctioned by Magistrates' Orders be in all cases confined to such temporary protection of public traffic as the circumstances of the case may admit, and that the County Surveyors are hereby instructed to use particular care that the works for which Magistrates' Orders are given be completed before the Assizes next following the issue of such orders.

ORDERED—That a copy of the foregoing be sent to every Magistrate in the County.

Spring Assizes, 1865.

RESOLVED—That Poole Gabbett, Esq., be and is hereby elected to fill the office of Secretary to the Grand Jury of the County of Limerick, in room of the late Edmond Gabbett, Esq., deceased.

ORDERED—That the County Treasurer be authorised to pay the Gaol Chapains and the County Coroners the amount of their Presentments when made at each Assizes.

RESOLVED—That the County Surveyors be permitted to use their discretion to postpone payment to Contractors for one half-year, on maintenance works when they may think it useful to the public so to do. But the County Surveyors can only be permitted to allow this deferred payment when the work shall be satisfactorily performed within the next half-year.

REPORT ON COUNTY SURVEYORS.

The Committee having examined the two County Surveyors, and enquired into the system of management, in the two districts, are of opinion, that in consideration of the salaries of the County Surveyors being increased to £100 per annum, they be allowed only £25 per annum each for a Clerk and £80 per annum for one certified Assistant each; this would be a reduction from £1,220 to £1,010, being a reduction of £210 per annum. The Committee also are of opinion that the County Surveyors ought not to withhold a certificate on the report of an Assistant without corroborating it by personal inspection. The Committee are also of opinion that immediately on fault being found with a contractor, notice should be given to him of the nature of the fault and the remedy to be applied.

Summer Assizes, 1865.

We order and direct the County Surveyors to take charge of works necessary to be done under 6th and 7th Wm. IV., cap. 116, sec. 54, and we direct the County Treasurer to advance under 20th and 21st Vic., cap. 15, such sums as may be necessary to pay the workmen employed, not exceeding the amount of the presentment in each case, upon the County Surveyor's Certificate of the due execution of the work.

ORDERED—That Mr. Brett's attention be called to the statement made by him before Committee of the Grand Jury relative to his want of confidence in some of his Assistants, and that he be distinctly informed that the Grand Jury hold him exclusively responsible for the efficient discharge of his duties.

REPORT—The Committee consider that the reduction of County Surveyors' Assistants, proposed at the last Grand Jury, is inexpedient, inasmuch as the manner in which the contracts are framed in this County, (which does not appear to have been brought under the notice of the former Committee), less supervision than is at present given would be detrimental to the proper keeping of the roads; and further, that the amount allowed for a Clerk's salary, considering the nature of his duties, and the expenses incurred on him, is not excessive.

ORDERED—That the County Treasurer be authorised to pay Samuel Hunt, Esq., Apothecary, and Mary Roche and Joseph Gabbett, retired Matron and Turnkey of the County Gaol, the amount of their salaries when presented at each Assizes.

ORDERED—That the County Treasurer be authorised to procure from the Limerick Water Works Company a supply of Pipe Water for the use of the Royal County Barracks, at a rate not exceeding Eight Pounds per annum.

ORDERED—That the County Treasurer be authorised to pay the Premium of Insurance on the Royal Barracks out of the sum of £12, available in his hands, being a saving on the sum of £36, presented at Spring, 1865, for Insurance of County Gaol and County Court-house, owing to a reduction of Duty; and further, that the Royal Barracks be included in future presentment for Insurance of County buildings.

## Spring Assizes, 1866.

RESOLVED—That in future, in the case of new contracts, when the County Surveyor has reason to complain of Contractors who, from incapacity, are unable to carry out their contracts, upon due notice being given by the County Surveyor, they shall be required to attend before the Grand Jury, who will then proceed to consider whether their contracts be not rescinded.

ORDERED—That the County Treasurer be authorised to pay the Local Inspector and the Medical Attendant of the County Gaol the amount of their salaries when presented at each Assizes.

The Grand Jury of the County of Limerick beg to express their strong sense of the energy, propriety, and loyalty of the Police Force. The Grand Jury regret that insufficient pay is causing a rapid diminution of so valuable a force, and strongly recommend to the Government a careful consideration of the pay and allowances of the Constabulary.

That Thomas Fosbery, Esq., County Surveyor, Eastern Division, do make a contract for keeping in repair the roofs of the Royal Barracks.

## Summer Assizes, 1866.

ORDERED—That the Board of Gaol Superintendence be authorised to pay the expense of Water and Gas supplied to the Royal Barracks.

## Summer Assizes, 1867.

RESOLVED—That our Foreman be requested to communicate with the Government on the subject of the proposed Fortification of Police Barracks, and to convey the unanimous opinion of this Grand Jury, that it is important and unjust to require the owners of Police Barracks to incur the heavy expenses for public purposes without a just increase of rent and a permanent of contract.

ORDERED—That the County Surveyors be directed to notify to the Proprietors of the Petty Sessions Houses, which are not in a proper state of repair or cleanliness that presentment of the rent will be withheld at next Assizes if the necessary repairs and cleaning are not properly made within a reasonable time, or not attended to thereafter.

Proposed by Mr. Powell, seconded by Mr. William G. Gubbins,—That the next Special Road Sessions for the Barony of Clanwilliam be appointed to be held at the Petty Sessions house of Castle-Connell.

RESOLVED—That two successive Grand Juries of the County of Limerick have carefully considered the Gaol By-Laws, submitted to them for their opinion and sanction.

That the Grand Jury at Summer Assizes, 1866, approve the By-Laws with certain qualifications, on the subject of the separate confinement of untried prisoners.

That the Grand Jury at the Spring Assizes, 1867, having been informed that the said qualified approval was informal, again carefully considered the question, and finally adopted, and inserted in the proposed By-Laws a clause providing that the separate confinement of untried prisoners should be subject to such relaxation as might be approved by the Board of Superintendence.

That the Grand Jury having been now informed that the said clause has been expunged from the Copy of the By-Laws sent down to be printed previously to being submitted to the Law Officers of the Crown, think it their duty to reiterate the opinion recorded by two successive Grand Juries, and to declare their determination not to sanction a code of By-Laws from which the said important principles shall be excluded.

Resolved further—That a copy of this resolution be communicated to the Chief Secretary of the Lord Lieutenant.

## Spring Assizes, 1868.

ORDERED—That the next Special Road Sessions for the Barony of Clanwilliam be held at the Petty Sessions House, Ballyneety.

RESOLVED—That the Adjutant of the County Limerick Regiment be requested to furnish our Secretary, upon each occasion, a proper account of the Lodging Money before lodging it in Bank to the credit of the Treasurer of the County.

We have fully examined the Accounts of Income and Expenditure for the half-year ending 31st December, 1867, and found same correct.

The principal creditor insists on £600 a year being applied as a Sinking Fund. With a view of raising sufficient funds it is proposed to go before Parliament for a third time to obtain sanction to an increase of tolls, expected (perhaps fallaciously) to produce £1,320 a-year, a flourishing condition of our Markets being essential to the interests of the County. It appears to us a stop should be put, if possible, to a course of management which has led to such results, and we recommend that a clause be inserted in the proposed Bill, whereby the management shall be vested in Twelve Trustees instead of Twenty-seven, in proportion of Six from Corporation and Chamber of Commerce, and Six from the Spring Grand Jury. Should this be accepted by the two bodies mentioned, that we offer no opposition to the Bill; if not, that the Bill be opposed.

We are informed that the result of a successful opposition would be the appointment of a Receiver; and the application of the Third, to which the Corporation is entitled (say £1,300), to the purpose of a Sinking Fund.

We further recommend that a permanent Committee be appointed to carry out this suggestion, and to report to the next Grand Jury.

Summer Assizes, 1870.

ORDERED—That the County Printers be directed to publish the names of the Magistrates and Cess-Payers who attended the Adjourned Road Sessions, at the commencement of the Schedule for each Barony.

1st—That by so doing a complete monopoly would be obtained over the whole carrying trade of the South and West of Ireland.

2nd—That by such monopoly the competition which now exists between the ports of Dublin, Cork and Waterford, and which must tend to increased facilities for Cross Channel Traffic, would be at an end; and the public being left to the mercy of one Company, it must suffer materially from being driven to accept such means of transit and through such ports as may suit that Company.

That seeing that the subject of Railway Amalgamation has been placed before a Committee of both Houses of Parliament, we hereby request our members to oppose by every means in their power, both before that Committee and in their places in the House, any measures which may tend to promote such sale, and we further direct our Secretary to send to each of our members a properly certified copy of this resolution, and also to forward a similar one to the Board of Trade, in the event of such proposed sale being brought before them.

RESOLVED—That a reform of the existing Grand Jury Laws is desirable and that in the proposed reform the principle of connecting the taxing power with representation of the parties taxed, is indispensable to the just and satisfactory working of the law.

RESOLVED—That we are of opinion that it would be very advantageous to the County interests that Peers, being landed proprietors, should be qualified to serve on Grand Juries.

RESOLVED—That we, the Grand Jury of the County of Limerick, are most strongly of opinion that the purchase of the Irish Railways by the Government would be of the greatest benefit to this Country, inasmuch as the doing away with the great number of Boards of Management now existing, would enable the lines to be economically worked as one system, for the advantage of the whole country, and at a great saving of expense. This, with the use of the credit of the country in raising the Purchase Money, would enable large reductions to be made in the rates of carriage—a matter much required in this poor agricultural country, and especially as affording greater facilities to third-class passengers.

That our County Members be requested to bring this resolution under the notice of Parliament.

RESOLVED—That the Grand Jury believe that the appointment of a Public Analyst is most important and valuable. That having received an application from Dr. Cameron, offering to perform the duties of an Analyst upon terms specified by him, the Grand Jury think the terms reasonable, and believing that Dr. Cameron possesses high qualifications for the appointment, are willing to appoint him upon the terms contained in the letters of Dr. Cameron, dated July 5th and July 2nd, submitted to the Grand Jury, and direct that those terms be entered on the County Book.

RESOLVED—That the suggestion of the Chairman of the County be adopted viz:—To transfer the criminal business of Bruff to Limerick for the future.

Spring Assizes, 1874.

ORDERED—That the County Surveyors be directed to lay before the Grand Jury at each Spring Assizes, in every year, a Schedule of the Undischarged Queries, dividing the same into two classes. 1st—A Schedule containing those Undischarged Queries which the County Surveyors recommend for representation by reason of forfeiture of contracts, or of same being surplus monies after execution of works, or for any other reason; and 2nd—A Schedule of those which they recommend should for the present remain unrepresented by reason of the works being in progress, or for any other specific reason.

Spring Assizes, 1876.

ORDERED—That the Inspectors of Nuisances, Markets, and Weights and Measures, be appointed to act as Inspectors under the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, (38 & 39 Vic., c. 63), and that the expenses of executing this Act be defrayed out of the Grand Jury Cess.

ORDERED—That except in works requiring special and skilled labour, our County Surveyor should not appoint a Clerk of Works.

RESOLVED—That when parties engage to contribute private sums towards aiding public funds for the execution of County works, such sums must be lodged to the credit of the County before the Assizes at which the application is made.

## Spring Assizes, 1878.

RESOLVED—That the County Surveyors be authorised to employ the Grand Jury Solicitor, or his representative, in all cases where they find it necessary to take law proceedings against Road Contractors, either before the Justices at Petty Sessions or the Judge of the County Court, and that the Grand Jury Solicitor be informed of this desire on the part of the Grand Jury.

RESOLVED UNANIMOUSLY—That in pursuance of the provisions of the Act of Parliament, 30 & 31 Vic., cap. 46, sec. 2, we appoint the Provincial Bank of Ireland, Limerick, as the Banking Company to act as Treasurer of said County.

## Summer Assizes, 1879.

ORDERED—That the County Surveyor of the Western Division be instructed to see that all the copings and battlements on the bridges under his charge are in proper repair.

## Spring Assizes, 1880.

RESOLVED—That whereas the resolution passed by the Grand Jury at Spring Assizes, 1878, to the effect that in all cases of road contracts where the County Surveyor has refused to certify, and that payment for the works has been stopped, the half-year so stopped shall not be capable of being again presented, has not been found to work well, the said resolution is hereby rescinded; and it is ordered that in such cases the said presentment may be renewed as for a back half-year, at a Sessions next following the stopping of the presentment; but if the County Surveyor should then again withhold his certificate, and payment shall be consequently stopped, the half-year's payment so stopped shall not be again capable of being presented.

## Summer Assizes, 1880.

ORDERED—That when the contractors for repairing roads do not cut down the weeds in accordance with their specification, the County Surveyor do carry out the provisions of the 54th Section of the Grand Jury Act, and have such defect remedied at the expense of the contractor.

RESOLVED—That in all cases of Malicious Injuries, the Grand Jury Secretary do state in the Schedule of Applications whether malice was unanimously agreed to or not by the Magistrates and Cess-payers.

ORDERED—That the names and residences of all Contractors and their Securities, with the amount of their bonds, be inserted in Barony Book.

RESOLVED—That the poundage on the collection of the Baronies of Lower Connelloe and Kenry be increased to Nine Pence in the pound.

RESOLVED—That F. St. C. Hobson be elected Barony Constable for the Baronies of Owneybeg and Coonagh.

Summer Assizes, 1883.

ORDERED—That in future the Pay Sheets produced before Local Government Auditor shall, on completion of audit, be deposited in the Office of our Secretary.

That these Pay Sheets bearing the Auditor's initials be handed to the County Surveyors to arrange them previous to each Assizes for Grand Jury Committee, to be subsequently deposited in the Secretary's Office.

RESOLVED—That our Secretary be directed to inform the Managers of Reformatories and Industrial Schools, that in future the accounts of these Institutions shall be made up to 31st May and 31st January, and also to convey to them that no presentment will be made if these instructions be not attended to.

ORDERED—That the Collectors of County Cess be required to comply with the provisions of the 7th Section of the Grand Jury Act, which requires that they should deliver to the *Grand Jury Secretary, on the day the Grand Jury are first empanelled* the return of Cesspayers required by that section.

RESOLVED—That in cases where the County Surveyor obtains a decree against a contractor for breach of his contract, and levies the amount, that person so proceeded against must no longer be dealt with by the County Surveyor as a contractor for that work upon which the action is taken.

RESOLVED—That if any action be taken hostile to the resolutions of the Grand Jury touching the Tramways or Light Railways in this County before the Privy Council, our Solicitor be authorised to represent the Grand Jury and employ counsel if necessary.

Our reasons for such disapproval, and for so declining to charge a guarantee, are the following:—

It has not been proved to us that the proposed line would be of sufficient value to justify any guarantee.

We gather from the evidence laid before us that the great majority of the occupiers of land within the taxable area are opposed to the line, and unwilling to incur the liability of the guarantee.
