REPORT OF PUBLIC ANALYST.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Limerick.

GENTLEMEN,

I beg to report that I have made the following Analysis in my capacity as Public Analyst for your County:—Specimens of Port and Sherry Wines, Sugar, Tea, Porter, and Milk, were analysed for Newcastle Union; the Sugar proved to be pure; the Tea was of poor, low quality; the Sherry was rather a poor article; the Port Wine was a compound consisting of spirit syrup and a low quality of wine; the Porter was merely "small beer;" the Milk was adulterated, one of the three samples sent with 30 per cent. of water, and the other with 25 per cent. of water respectively.

A sample of Medicine, sent by Dr. M'Namara, Croom District, was not of the composition which it ought to have. Two samples of Tea were also examined for Newcastle Union, and found to be of fair quality.

The stomachs of two hounds were up for Analysis, by direction of Mr. Westropp, J.P., in both strychnine in large quantities was detected.

LUNATIC ASYLUM.

Report of the Committee appointed to visit the Lunatic Asylum.

We inspected both the male and female sides of the Asylum, and found the corridors, day rooms, and cells clean, fresh, and cheerful, and the patients neat, orderly, and apparently as happy as their unfortunate condition admits. Those who were able to work were engaged in various useful employments.

The discipline of the house seems to be as good as can be expected, considering the inconvenience resulting from the alterations, but Dr. Courtenay himself pointed out to us that the arrangements for the supervision of the epileptic and suicidal patients are of necessity extremely defective for the present.

Considerable progress has been made with the new buildings, but we fear that they will not be completed and fit for occupation before the end of next year at soonest, and we hope that those who are in charge of the works will make effort to prevent unnecessary delay.

The provision for ventilation in many of the cells appears to us to be insufficient, but we are informed that any substantial alteration would involve much difficulty and expense.

Dr. Courtenay reports to us that dysentery and diarrhoea have been very prevalent. This unsatisfactory sanitary condition is attributed to three causes, viz.—overcrowding, the occasional use of polluted water from the pumps, and the defective state of the sewers.

The water from the pumps is unfit for drinking, and though it is not generally used for that purpose, Dr. Courtenay states that it is impossible entirely to prevent the patients from having recourse to them; owing to the peculiar situation of the Asylum, there is little prospect of obtaining pure water from this source, even if the sewers were in perfect order.

With reference to the state of the sewerage, we find that the main sewer recently made at a large cost to the County, works well, but that the sewers in the Asylum itself are badly constructed, and imperfectly or not at all ventilated.

We would recommend to the consideration of the Board of Governors the propriety of introducing better warming apparatus into the corridors, in lieu of the present open fire places, of closing up the pumps and endeavouring to utilize the large quantity of rain water which falls on the roof, and of putting the sewerage of the Asylum into thorough order, and providing proper ventilation for them.

We think it questionable whether in the present overcrowded state of the house any persons ought to be received as paying patients who are able to pay for their maintenance in Private Asylums.

We have much pleasure in bearing testimony to the zeal and efficiency with which Dr. Courtenay discharges his very difficult and onerous duties.

COUNTY INFIRMARY.

The Committee appointed to examine the Accounts of the County Infirmary, beg to submit the following report:—

Having examined, with the greatest attention, the Accounts, they recommend for the future that the accounts be made up to the 5th January and 5th July in each year, as otherwise a state of affairs may be submitted to the Grand Jury which might lead to an erroneous conclusion as to the state of the funds of that Institution, in consequence of money being taken credit for which has been presented and not paid, and thereby a balance appearing one time greater and at another less than it really is. Your Committee have therefore closed all accounts up to the 11th of this month, and from the best information they can obtain, no debts are left outstanding, and all monies due, whether presented or otherwise, being taken into consideration, the account shows an available balance of £20 13s. 4d., which is the only sum available to meet future expenses.

We also report that the anticipations of the last Committee, in regard to the increased usefulness of this Institution, have been to some extent realized; the number of patients for the four months, ending July, have been 53, as contrasted with 22 for the same period of last year, of which former 36 were free admissions, and 17 paying patients, as contrasted with 6 and 16 respectively. Those patients were admitted from nine several Baronies.

The expenditure of the past year amounts to about £400, of which salaries absorb £140, (of which sum Government pays £87).

The income of the Institution at present, independent of any grant from the Grand Jury, amounts to £240 (including £22 Governors' subscriptions), and the expenses of officers, viz., 3 Doctors, Matron, Clerk, and 2 Servants, and keeping up establishment say £20, amounts to £218.

We consider that this staff is insufficient, a night nurse being indispensable.

It now rests with the Grand Jury to consider whether they will assist in keeping up this Institution or not; if they do, it will be necessary for its proper maintenance and credit to make a presentment for £150 for this half-year, and £100 at each succeeding Assizes.

And for the carrying out of this object, we recommend that a Committee be formed of Lord Clarina, Col. Maunsell, and Mr. John VanderKiste, who, on the part of the County, until next Assizes, shall have full power to confer with the Governors, in order to make such rules and regulations as they may think most suitable to encrease the efficiency of this Institution.

COUNTY GAOL.

Little can be added to the full report of the Board of Superintendence.

We have visited the Gaol and find its condition excellent, reflecting credit on all concerned.

The Accounts have been vouched by the Board of Superintendence, and we recommend that the sum for which they ask, £976 9s., shall be presented.

The charge for transmitting a prisoner from Abbeyfeale is 17s. 11d., but it is highly desirable that all County Prisoners should be submitted to the discipline of this gaol.

It is well to bring the attention of Magistrates that a week's imprisonment is a punishment more severe than that of a fortnight, owing to the restricted diet in the former period.

The Board of Superintendence of the County of Limerick Gaol, appointed under 7th Geo. IV, cap, 74, sec. 2, submit the following Report to the Grand Jury, at Summer Assizes, 1876.

The Accounts and Vouchers of the Expenditure of the Gaol, Bridewells, Court Houses, Coroners' Expenses at Inquests, Conveyance of Prisoners, and Sundry Expenses of the Militia Barracks, for the Half-year ended 30th June last, are now ready for Audit.

The Accounts, which were examined and certified by the Grand Jury at the last Assizes, shewed a balance due to the Bank of £156 15s. 0d.

A printed summary of Receipts and Disbursements for the Half-year, prepared by the Local Inspector, by order of Colonel Lord Clarina, Chairman of Finance Committee, is submitted.

The Presentments at last Spring Assizes, viz.:—£894 17s. 9d. for Provisions and other necessary expenses; £474 10s. 0d. for Salaries of Intern Officers; £25 0s. 0½d in the Governor's hands; and £151 19s. 4d. Balance in Bank to Credit of Board,—Total, £1,546 7s. 1½d., are available for the expenses of the current half-year.

The Accounts and Vouchers of the Expenditure of the Gaol, submitted to the Board of Superintendents, together with the Accounts of the Gaol, submitted to the Grand Jury at the Summer Assizes, 1876, are now ready for their consideration.

The Accounts, which were examined and certified by the Grand Jury at the last Assizes, showed a balance due to the Gaol of £150 10s. 6d. A detailed summary of Receipts and Disbursements for the half-year, prepared by the Local Inspector, by order of Colonel Lord Clarendon, Chairman of the Finance Committee, is submitted.

The Receipts and Disbursements of the Gaol, during the half-year, are as follows:—

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORTS,

Summer Assizes, 1876.

REPORT of the County Surveyor of the Eastern Division to the Grand Jury of the County of Limerick, assembled at Summer Assizes, 1876.

GENTLEMEN,

It being my duty to lay before you a Report of the roads and works in my district, I now do so, though in reality there is nothing particular to report on.

The general state of your roads under my charge since last I reported to you has been in general tolerably fair only, some of my largest contractors having relinquished their energy, and it has been only by taking positive measures with them that I have had any work done this half-year. I trust that a change for the better will take place during the next half-year.

New works have been applied for in the several Baronies, but none of any great importance, with the exception of a foot-path on the Bruff road, in the Barony of Small County, and the completion of a new line of road in the same Barony. Both I think are useful works.

Cutting down a bog, portion of the mail-car road from Limerick to Killaloe, Barony of Clanwilliam, at a cost of £300, I also consider a most useful work, and one that I am only surprised was not done long since.

Rebuilding a retaining and wing wall to the bridge of Ballintubber, in the Barony of Costlea, at a cost not exceeding £100, is absolutely necessary. It was supposed at the Sessions that it would be necessary to have this certified, but on looking into the Section of the Act more carefully, I consider it is not necessary, (it being a *rebuilding*), and had advertisements inserted in the papers inviting tenders for it, along with that in Clanwilliam. I hope you will consider I was right in doing so, as the place is a very dangerous one, and during the coming winter I fear some accident would occur there.

There are no other works of any importance, and when going through the Schedule I think I can describe to you verbally each work.

My Accounts are prepared and are attached to this Report, and I have compared them with the Treasurer's.

The Mileage and Cost in my District in each Barony are also appended to it.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORTS,

Summer Assizes, 1876.

REPORT of the County Surveyor of the Western Division to the Grand Jury of the County of Limerick, assembled at Summer Assizes, 1876.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN OF THE GRAND JURY,

I have the honour to lay before you my Report on works under my charge since last Assizes, as well as those applied for at last Presentment Sessions.

I have expended the greater part of the monies ordered by you, under the 146th section, at last Assizes, on their respective works, and with satisfactory results. I find the system to work very well, and, with your permission, shall continue it when necessary.

There are no special works of importance in progress, with the exception of the bridge over the river Deel, at Ballinisky, Barony of Glenquin, for which you presented money to me at last Assizes. I have agreed with Messrs. Courtney, Stephens & Bailey, of Dublin, for the execution and delivery of the iron work, for the sum of £129 10s., and have men employed at present examining and repairing the abutments.

Applications for payment were considered at the Presentment Sessions, and I gave certificates in all but a few very bad cases, in order to enable contractors to prepare a supply of metal for the Autumn.

There were very few maintenance contracts for renewal. In the Barony of Glenquin a maintenance contract was allowed on a new road lately completed by the Earl of Dunraven, between Abbeyfeale and Athea.

There were not many applications for new works, but two or three of those were of importance.

BARONY OF GLENQUIN.—An application to complete 1120 perches of a relief road, between Kilkinlea and Craggs, running along the river Feale. £400 was allowed for this work, on condition of the remainder of estimate, £780, being subscribed. I think that this road would be of great local use. An application to rebuild the guard wall to the road through Glenagappul, for the sum of £90, which you will be asked to certify, I consider very necessary. An application by myself for £430, to substitute an iron bridge for the present timber one over the river Feale, at Abbeyfeale, an equal sum having been allowed by the Co. Kerry. Mr. Stokes and I, on further consideration, preferred to renew the whole structure instead of leaving the timber piles, as at first intended. Tenders for this work were referred to Assizes.

BARONY OF KENRY.—The only application in this Barony was one by myself for £140, to build a guard wall on a very dangerous part of the road between Cartown and Shannongrove, for which Tenders were referred to Assizes.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORTS.

BARONY OF SHANID.—An application to make 490 perches of a new road between Glin and Listowel, for which £350 was allowed, provided the remainder was subscribed, which you will be asked to certify. An application to make a foot-path in the village of Ardagh, for which £40 was allowed. An application to complete 208 perches of a relief road, being part of the new line of road between Glin and Listowel, for which £50 was allowed, provided the remainder was subscribed. There was no Adjourned Sessions held at Foynes, so I am obliged to ask you to appoint a Committee to open tenders.

I obtained decrees against the following contractors for maintenance contracts—Glenquin, Denis Hayes and James Fitzgibbon; Kenry, David Molony; Lower Connelloe, the securities of James Gilburn, deceased; and Upper Connelloe, Robert Morrisson. I must now ask for your instructions as to the execution of the decrees. As the bonds have become invalid, it will be necessary for you to present money to me under the 38th section for the maintenance of these roads until next Assizes. I also obtained a decree against Owen Fahy, for not completing a gullet in the Barony of Glenquin, and should recommend that costs only should be levied on him, and I ask you to grant me an order, under the 146th section, to expend the money.

I have to apply to you for presentments, under the 38th section, for repairing the following bridges, as I consider that they cannot be postponed until next Assizes:—Barony of Glenquin—To repair Kantoher bridge. Barony of Kenry—To repair Shantraud bridge. Barony of Shanid—To repair a bridge in the townland of Ballygiltenane.

I beg to submit the usual table of mileage and cost of maintenance of roads, and also a statement of accounts of monies expended by myself, under 20 & 21 vic. c. 15, s. 1, and 6 & 7 Wm. IV, c. 116, secs. 38, 54, & 146.

I shall ask you to grant me an order to expend money under the 146 section, and the usual Suspension List.

I have appointed Mr. Beere my Assistant, subject to your approval, in room of the Assistant dismissed by you at last Assizes.

Spring Assizes, 1861.

ORDERED—That a Committee, consisting of the Hon. S. E. Spring Rice, Mr. Croker, Mr. Considine, Mr. Delmege, Colonel Dickson, M.P., Mr. E. Gabbett, and Mr. William Smith O'Brien, be appointed for the purpose of ascertaining whether an arrangement can be made for relieving the City of Limerick, and for promoting the interest and convenience of the inhabitants of the Counties of Clare and Limerick, by purchasing from the Board of Works the Tolls of the Wellesley Bridge. That such Committee have power to carry on their inquiries in the interval between this time and the next Assizes, and to report to the Grand Jury at next Summer Assizes.

ORDERED—That we direct our Solicitor to take Counsel's opinion as to whether the County is to keep the roads both over and under the Railways in repair, as also the bridges, and the approaches thereto, or whether the several Railway Companies are legally bound to do so.

Summer Assizes, 1861.

RESOLVED—That our Solicitor, Mr. Murphy, be directed to obtain Mr. Brewster's opinion as to the respective liability of the County, and of the Railway Companies, for the maintenance of roads on the surface of bridges over Railways and the approaches thereto.

ORDERED—That John W. Channer, Esq., Sub-Inspector of Constabulary at Adare, be appointed to stamp and adjust the Sub-Standards of the County of Limerick, pursuant to the 7th section of the 23rd & 24th Victoria, cap. 119, and to have custody of the County Copies pointed out in section 6.

RESOLVED—That it is the opinion of this Grand Jury that a Protestant and a Catholic Chaplain ought to constitute a part of the staff of the County Infirmary.

Spring Assizes, 1862.

ORDERED—That Mr. Murphy, our Local Solicitor, shall take such steps, consistent with public convenience, as shall relieve the County from the charge of keeping in repair the roads passing over and under Railway bridges in this County.

RESOLVED—That it is the opinion of this Grand Jury that it would be very desirable and conducive to the public service, that the Coroners in Ireland should be placed under a similar footing with the Coroners of England, as provided by the 23rd Vic., cap. 116, sec. 4, by substituting fixed salaries in place of fees, and that our Secretary be requested to convey this resolution to the Chief Secretary for Ireland, and that our County Members be requested to co-operate.

That a condition be attached to Presentment for County Hospital, requesting that in future the Governors shall reserve the Charity for County Patients only.

It was proposed to the Grand Jury that Ten Beds should be reserved in County Infirmary for City Patients,—Eleven voted for—Ten against. In a question of this nature is a Jury of Twelve necessary?

Ruled by the Court that there should be a Jury of Twelve for.

With reference to observations made by the Judge of Assize regarding the instances of undetected crime, we, the Grand Jury of the County of Limerick, cannot help remarking that, in our opinion, the Police Force is assuming too much of a military character; we do not wish to cast any imputation upon a body of men whose conduct and general behaviour have always been most exemplary—especially those officers and men connected with our own County—but it is obvious that, taking them from their legitimate duties to exercise and drill them as soldiers, sending them to Hythe to compete with the army in rifle shooting, and keeping an unnecessarily large reserve in Dublin, for the support of a large portion of which the Counties are annually taxed, materially interfering with an effective system of discovering agrarian offenders.

We would also observe that the practice of appointing military officers to the higher ranks of the force is a great discouragement to the officers of the Police in the execution of their duties, a very great injustice, and deprives them of their legitimate chances of promotion.

Summer Assizes, 1862.

RESOLVED—That it is the duty of the County Surveyors to report to the Grand Jury all cases in which contracts have not been properly performed, specifying those cases in which they are of opinion that proceedings ought to be taken against the Contractors or their Securities. This resolution is not intended to interfere in any way with such proceedings of a summary nature as the County Surveyors may think it right to adopt for securing the due performance of Contracts.

Spring Assizes, 1863.

RESOLVED—That the sum of £3,000 be borrowed for the purchase of premises for the accommodation of the Royal Limerick County Regiment of Militia, such sum to be raised by mortgage on the rates of the County, under the provisions of 17th & 18th Vic., cap. 107, sec. 39.

SIR,

I am directed by the Lord Lieutenant to state for the information of the Grand Jury for the County of Limerick that his Excellency finds from the report of the Inspector-General of Militia, that the house at present occupied by the stores of the County Regiment of Militia is very inconvenient, and that a house and ground which have been offered, and which could be obtained and repaired for the sum of £2,500, have been officially inspected, and appear to be well fitted for the accommodation both of the stores and of the permanent staff, for whom his Excellency considers it very desirable that quarters should be provided in the storehouse. His Excellency, understanding that a proposition for the purchase of the premises referred to will be submitted to the Grand Jury at the present Assizes, strongly recommends it to their favourable consideration.

I am to add that the amount of the lodging money allowed by the War Department for the members of the permanent staff who may be provided with quarters in the proposed storehouse, will be paid by the Secretary of State for War to the County Treasurer, as provided by the 23rd & 24th Vic., c. 94, s. 10.

RESOLVED—That inasmuch as it has been pronounced to be contrary to law that any Road Contractor should be paid for any work except that executed in the half-year next preceding the Presentment Sessions at which the demand for payment shall have been proposed, the Grand Jury direct the County Surveyors to govern themselves accordingly; and the Grand Jury further acquaint those officers that any breach of this regulation will be considered equivalent to a misapplication of the public funds.

RESOLVED.—That it is necessary and advisable that the Magistrates at Road Sessions enquire into the solvency of the Contractor as well as the Securities, in every case presented, and that the Act of Parliament be carried out strictly, requiring all the parties to be worth severally “twice the amount of the contract.” That the Secretary of the Grand Jury communicate this to the several Sessions.

RESOLVED—That in future the names of the Magistrates granting all peremptory orders for the repairs of sudden breaches in roads or bridges, should be inserted in the printed list of “Magistrates Orders,” presented to the Grand Jury, with the date of such order for each work so ordered by said Justice.

ORDERED—That the County Surveyors serve notice on the several Railway Companies requiring them to repair and keep in repair from the present Assizes the several approaches over their respective railways, as decided in the Court of Queen’s Bench, on 3rd February, 1863.

Summer Assizes, 1863.

The Grand Jury Secretary having represented to this Grand Jury that very serious inconvenience and interruption to the public business has resulted from the irregular mode and unreasonable hours of lodging Tenders for Public Works in his Office,—ORDERED—That the Grand Jury Secretary is hereby directed not to receive a Tender *under any circumstances* after Six o'Clock, p.m., on the days appointed for receiving them.

ORDERED—That the County Treasurer be authorized to pay the Collectors of County Cess, out of the County monies in his hands, the amount of their poundage, on paying to him the amount of their warrants.

Spring Assizes, 1864.

ORDERED—That the County Surveyors be directed to take proceedings in all cases in which the Contractors have not used due care to execute works within the period of their contract.

RESOLVED—That the Barony Constables be required to pay up the full amount of their Warrants to the County Treasurer two days previous to each Assizes, or in default shall lose the poundage to which they would otherwise be entitled.

Summer Assizes, 1864.

RESOLVED—That it is the opinion of the Grand Jury that Magistrates' Orders should be strictly confined to cases of sudden damage which cannot be remedied in the ordinary course by presentment at Sessions; and further, that the work sanctioned by Magistrates' Orders be in all cases confined to such temporary protection of public traffic as the circumstances of the case may admit, and that the County Surveyors are hereby instructed to take particular care that the works for which Magistrates' Orders are given shall be completed before the Assizes next following the issue of such orders.

ORDERED—That a copy of the foregoing be sent to every Magistrate in the County.

Spring Assizes, 1865.

RESOLVED—That Poole Gabbett, Esq., be, and is hereby elected to fill the office of Secretary to the Grand Jury of the County of Limerick, in room of the late Edmond Gabbett, Esq., deceased.

ORDERED—That the County Treasurer be authorised to pay the County Gaol Chaplains and the County Coroners the amount of their Presentments when made at each Assizes.

RESOLVED—That the County Surveyors be permitted to use their discretion to postpone payment to Contractors for one half-year, on maintenance works, when they may think it useful to the public so to do. But the County Surveyors can only be permitted to allow this deferred payment when the work shall be satisfactorily performed within the next half-year.

D.

REPORT ON COUNTY SURVEYORS.

The Committee having examined the two County Surveyors, and enquired into the system of management in the two districts, are of opinion, that in consideration of the salaries of the County Surveyors being increased to £400 per annum, they be allowed only £25 per annum each for a Clerk and Office, and £80 per annum for one Certified Assistant each; this would be a reduction from £1,220 to £1,010, being a reduction of £210 per annum. The Committee also are of opinion that the County Surveyors ought not to withhold a certificate on the report of an Assistant without corroborating it by personal inspection. The Committee are also of opinion that immediately upon fault being found with a contractor, notice should be given to him of the nature of the fault and the remedy to be applied.

Summer Assizes, 1865.

We order and direct the County Surveyors to take charge of Works necessary to be done under 6th & 7th Wm. IV., cap. 116, sec. 54, and we direct the County Treasurer to advance under 20th & 21st Vic., cap. 15, sec. 2, such sums as may be necessary to pay the workmen employed, not exceeding the amount of the presentment in each case, upon the County Surveyor's certificate of the due execution of the work.

ORDERED—That Mr. Brett's attention be called to the statement made by him before committee of the Grand Jury relative to his want of confidence in one of his Assistants, and that he be distinctly informed that the Grand Jury hold him exclusively responsible for the efficient discharge of his duties.

REPORT—The Committee consider that the reduction of County Surveyors' Assistants, proposed at the last Grand Jury, is inexpedient, inasmuch as from the manner in which the contracts are framed in this County, (which does not appear to have been brought under the notice of the former Committee), less supervision than is at present given would be detrimental to the proper keeping of the roads; and further, that the amount allowed for a Clerk's salary, considering the nature of his duties, and the expenses entailed on him, is not excessive.

ORDERED—That the County Treasurer be authorized to pay Samuel Hunt, Esq., Apothecary, and Mary Roche and Joseph Gabbett, retired Matron and Turnkey of the County Gaol, the amount of their salaries when presented at each Assizes.

ORDERED—That the County Treasurer be authorised to procure from the Limerick Water Works Company a supply of Pipe Water for the use of the Royal County Barracks, at a rate not exceeding Eight Pounds per annum.

ORDERED—That the County Treasurer be authorised to pay the Premium of Insurance on the Royal Barracks out of the sum of £12, available in his hands, being a saving on the sum of £36, presented at Spring, 1865, for Insurance of County Gaol and County Court-house, owing to a reduction of Duty; and further, that the Royal Barracks be included in future presentments for Insurance of County Buildings.

Spring Assizes, 1866.

The Grand Jury of the County of Limerick beg to express their strong sense of the energy, propriety, and loyalty of the Police Force. The Grand Jury regret that insufficient pay is causing a rapid diminution of so valuable a force, and strongly recommend to the Government a careful consideration of the pay and allowances of the Constabulary.

That Thomas Fosbery, Esq., County Surveyor, Eastern Division, do make a contract for keeping in repair the roofs of the Royal Barracks.

Summer Assizes, 1866.

ORDERED—That the Board of Gaol Superintendence be authorized to pay the expense of Water and Gas supplied to the Royal Barracks.

Summer Assizes, 1867.

RESOLVED—That our Foreman be requested to communicate with the Government on the subject of the proposed Fortification of Police Barracks, and to convey the unanimous opinion of this Grand Jury, that it is impolitic and unjust to require the owners of Police Barracks to incur the heavy expenses for public purposes without a just increase of rent and a permanence of contract.

ORDERED—That the County Surveyors be directed to notify to the Proprietors of the Petty Sessions Houses, which are not in a proper state of repair or cleanliness, that presentment of the rent will be withheld at next Assizes if the necessary repairs and cleaning are not properly made within a reasonable time, or not attended to thereafter.

Proposed by Mr. Powell, seconded by Mr. William G. Gubbins—That the next Special Road Sessions for the Barony of Clanwilliam be appointed to be held at the Petty Sessions House of Castle-Connell.

RESOLVED—That two successive Grand Juries of the County of Limerick have carefully considered the Gaol By-Laws, submitted to them for their opinion and sanction.

That the Grand Jury at the Summer Assizes, 1866, approved the By-Laws with certain qualifications, on the subject of the separate confinement of untried prisoners.

That the Grand Jury at the Spring Assizes, 1867, having been informed that the said qualified approval was informal, again carefully considered the question, and finally adopted, and inserted in the proposed By-Laws, a clause providing that the separate confinement of untried prisoners should be subject to such relaxation as might be approved by the Board of Superintendence.

That the Grand Jury having been now informed that the said clause has been expunged from the copy of the By-Laws sent down to be printed previously to being submitted to the Law Officers of the Crown, think it their duty to reiterate the opinion recorded by two successive Grand Juries, and to declare their determination not to sanction a code of By-Laws from which the said important principle shall be excluded.

Resolved further—That a copy of this resolution be communicated to the Chief Secretary of the Lord Lieutenant.

Spring Assizes, 1868.

ORDERED—That the next Special Road Sessions for the Barony of Clanwilliam be held at the Petty Sessions House, Ballyneety.

We have fully examined the Accounts of Income and Expendituae for the half-year ending 31st December, 1867, and found same correct.

The principal creditor insists on £600 a-year being applied as a Sinking Fund. With a view of raising sufficient funds it is proposed to go before Parliament for a third time to obtain sanction to an increase of tolls, expected (perhaps fallaciously) to produce £1,320 a-year, a flourishing condition of our Markets being essential to the interests of the County. It appears to us a stop should be put, if possible, to a course of management which has led to such results, and we recommend that a clause be inserted in the proposed Bill, whereby the management shall be vested in Twelve Trustees instead of Twenty-seven, in proportion of Six from Corporation and Chamber of Commerce and Six from the Spring Grand Jury. Should this be accepted by the two bodies mentioned, that we offer no opposition to the Bill; if not, that the Bill be opposed.

We are informed that the result of a successful opposition would be the appointment of a Receiver, and the application of the Third, to which the Corporation is entitled, (say £1,300), to the purposes of a Sinking Fund.

We further recommend that a permanent Committee be appointed to carry out this suggestion, and to report to the next Grand Jury.

1st—That by so doing a complete monopoly would be obtained over the whole carrying trade of the South and West of Ireland; and

2nd—That by such monopoly the competition which now exists between the ports of Dublin, Cork, and Waterford, and which must tend to increased facilities for Cross Channel traffic, would be at an end; and the public being left to the mercy of one Company, it must suffer materially from being driven to accept such means of transit, and through such ports as may suit that Company.

That seeing that the subject of Railway Amalgamation has been placed before a Committee of both Houses of Parliament, we hereby request our members to oppose by every means in their power, both before that Committee and in their places in the House, any measures which may tend to promote such sale, and we further direct our Secretary to send to each of our members a properly certified copy of this resolution, and also to forward a similar one to the Board of Trade, in the event of such proposed sale being brought before them.

RESOLVED—That a reform of the existing Grand Jury Laws is desirable, and that in the proposed reform the principle of connecting the taxing power with representation of the parties taxed, is indispensable to the just and satisfactory working of the law.

RESOLVED—That we are of opinion that it would be very advantageous to the County interests that Peers, being landed proprietors, should be qualified to serve on Grand Juries.

RESOLVED—That we, the Grand Jury of the County of Limerick, are most strongly of opinion that the purchase of the Irish Railways by the Government would be of the greatest benefit to this country, inasmuch as the doing away with the great number of Boards of Management now existing, would enable the lines to be economically worked as one system, for the advantage of the whole country, and at a great saving of expense. This, with the use of the credit of the country in raising the Purchase Money, would enable large reductions to be made in the rates of carriage—a matter much required in this poor agricultural country, and especially as affording greater facilities to third-class passengers.

That our County Members be requested to bring this resolution under the notice of Parliament.
